The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m.

#### **Public Works**

Derin Campbell and Keith Austin were both present on behalf of this item.

### 1. Change Order # 2 for Lakewood Estates, Lakewood Villas and Valley Creek Neighborhood Improvement District (first reading)

Mr. Campbell stated this will be the last and final change order for this project.

Commissioner Pearson asked if this project was essentially done.

Mr. Austin stated yes. They are almost complete right now and they are waiting on close-out documentation.

Commissioner Pearson asked if this was within the approved amount of money.

Mr. Campbell stated this is under the original estimate by far.

Commissioner Miller stated she had thought Christianson had this contract.

Commissioner Elkin stated they did the RCC part. This was just one of the projects that we learned a lot about RCC. The weather just would not cooperate with this project.

Commissioner Pearson stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

### 2. Budget Amendment for the Rolling Hills Project (first reading)

Mr. Campbell stated this was budgeted '09 and '10 numbers were the County's actual expense regarding this project. Mr. Campbell stated when we went through budget, the Auditor requested that with the revenue coming from the City, this should reflect the entire expenses but

then show the revenue side to be considered. So, this is not a change this is just showing expenses with some revenue as no net increase or decrease.

Commissioner Pearson asked if this was displayed correctly on this budget amendment.

County Auditor June Pitchford stated it was.

Commissioner Pearson stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading after the required 10-day hold, with an appropriate order for approval.

#### **Auditor's Office**

County Auditor June Pitchford was present on behalf of this item.

### **3.** Physical Inventories for the Courthouse, Government Center, Sheriff & Corrects, and Public Works Department (first and second reading)

Ms. Pitchford stated the statutes for County Auditor's require that County Auditor's keep an inventory of all County property under the control of the various administrative offices where the property has a value of \$1,000.00 or more; and to conduct annual inventories. Ms. Pitchford stated there are some counties that conduct annual inventories of all assets every year but she does not do that because that is about all they would get done. Ms. Pitchford stated she conducts annual inventories on a cycle. Ms. Pitchford stated she tries to do a three to four year cycle and that is why not all the County offices are included. Ms. Pitchford stated the Courthouse and Government Center physical inventory was conducted in 2007 and 2008.

Ms. Pitchford stated the Sheriff & Corrections and the Public Works inventories were both conducted this year. Ms. Pitchford stated in 2009 due to staff turnover and having one employee out on Family Medical Leave, we did not conduct physical inventories. Ms. Pitchford stated we have tried to catch up and we have done that so she stated she is bringing forward the results of those physical inventories at this time. Ms. Pitchford stated all in all everything looked great. Ms. Pitchford stated they were unable to locate a handful of assets and the detail is provided under the documentation. In most cases those assets were very old and most likely had been disposed of without the paperwork follow up. Below are the inventories conducted:
