



**PURCHASE AGREEMENT
FOR
MICROWAVE RADIOS/SITE LINKING EQUIPMENT**

THIS AGREEMENT dated the 9th day of June 2015 is made between Boone County, Missouri, a political subdivision of the State of Missouri through the Boone County Commission, herein "County" and **Talley Communications**, herein "Vendor."

IN CONSIDERATION of the parties performance of the respective obligations contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Contract Documents** - This agreement shall consist of this Purchase Agreement for microwave radios and associated site linking equipment, County of Boone Request for Bid **18-16APR15**, the Contractor's bid response dated April 8, 2015 executed by Allison Mills on behalf of the Contractor. All such documents shall constitute the contract documents which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Service or product data, specification and literature submitted with proposal response may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office bid file for this RFB if not attached. In the event of conflict between any of the foregoing documents, the terms, conditions, provisions and requirements contained in the bid specifications shall prevail and control over the Contractor's bid response.

2. **Purchase** - The County agrees to purchase from the Contractor and Contractor agrees to supply the County with the following equipment, per the bid response referenced above:

3. **Delivery** - Contractor agrees to deliver above listed equipment **within 60 days** after receipt of Purchase Order. Items 1A and 1B shall be delivered with receipt of this executed contract and purchase order. Items 2 through 7 shall be delivered at later date, upon notice from Boone County Purchasing and receipt of purchase order. Delivery shall be FOB Destination – with freight charges fully included and prepaid. The seller pays and bears the freight charges. *Delivery address shall be: Boone County Fire Protection Headquarters, 2201 I-70 Drive NW, Columbia, MO 65202.*

4. **Billing and Payment** - All billing shall be invoiced to the Boone County Auditor, Attn: Heather Acton, 801 E. Walnut, Room 304, Columbia, MO 65201 and billings may only include the prices listed in the vendor's bid response. No additional fees for paper work processing, labor, or taxes shall be included as additional charges in excess of the charges in the Vendor's bid response to the specifications. The County agrees to pay all invoices within thirty days of receipt. In the event of a billing dispute, the County reserves the right to withhold payment on the disputed amount; in the event the billing dispute is resolved in favor of the Vendor, the County agrees to pay interest at a rate of 9% per annum on disputed amounts withheld commencing from the last date that payment was due.

5. **Binding Effect** - This agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and assigns for so long as this agreement remains in full force and effect.

6. **Termination** - This agreement may be terminated by the County upon thirty days advance written notice for any of the following reasons or under any of the following circumstances:

- a. County may terminate this agreement due to material breach of any term or condition of this agreement, or
- b. County may terminate this agreement if in the opinion of the Boone County Commission if delivery of products are delayed or products delivered are not in conformity with proposal specifications or variances authorized by County, or
- c. If appropriations are not made available and budgeted for any calendar year.

STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS - BOONE COUNTY, MISSOURI

1. Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and failure to do so, in County's sole discretion, shall give County the right to terminate this Contract.
2. Responses shall include all charges for packing, delivery, installation, etc., (unless otherwise specified) to the Boone County Department identified in the Request for Proposal and/or Proposal.
3. The Boone County Commission has the right to accept or reject any part or parts of all proposals, to waive technicalities, and to accept the offer the County Commission considers the most advantageous to the County. Boone County reserves the right to award this proposal on an item-by-item basis, or an "all or none" basis, whichever is in the best interest of the County.
4. Proposalders must use the proposal forms provided for the purpose of submitting proposals, must return the proposal and proposal sheets comprised in this proposal, give the unit price, extended totals, and sign the proposal. The Purchasing Director reserves the right, when only one proposal has been received by the proposal closing date, to delay the opening of proposals to another date and time in order to revise specifications and/or establish further competition for the commodity or service required. The one (1) proposal received will be retained unopened until the new Closing date, or at request of proposalder, returned unopened for re-submittal at the new date and time of proposal closing.
5. When products or materials of any particular producer or manufacturer are mentioned in our specifications, such products or materials are intended to be descriptive of type or quality and not restricted to those mentioned.
6. Do not include Federal Excise Tax or Sales and Use Taxes in proposal process, as law exempts the County from them.
7. The delivery date shall be stated in definite terms, as it will be taken into consideration in awarding the proposal.
8. The County Commission reserves the right to cancel all or any part of orders if delivery is not made or work is not started as guaranteed. In case of delay, the Contractor must notify the Purchasing Department.
9. In case of default by the Contractor, the County of Boone will procure the articles or services from other sources and hold the Proposalder responsible for any excess cost occasioned thereby.
10. Failure to deliver as guaranteed may disqualify Proposalder from future proposalding.
11. Prices must be as stated in units of quantity specified, and must be firm. Proposals qualified by escalator clauses may not be considered unless specified in the proposal specifications.
12. No proposal transmitted by fax machine or e-mail will be accepted.
13. The County of Boone, Missouri expressly denies responsibility for, or ownership of any item purchased until same is delivered to the County and is accepted by the County.
14. The County reserves the right to award to one or multiple respondents. The County also reserves the right to not award any item or group of items if the services can be obtained from a state or other governmental entities contract under more favorable terms.
15. The County, from time to time, uses federal grant funds for the procurement of goods and services. Accordingly, the provider of goods and/or services shall comply with federal laws, rules and regulations applicable to the funds used by the County for said procurement, and contract clauses required by the federal government in such circumstances are incorporated herein by reference. These clauses can generally be found in the Federal Transit Administration's Best Practices Procurement Manual – Appendix A. Any questions regarding the applicability of federal clauses to a particular proposal should be directed to the Purchasing Department prior to proposal opening.

16. In the event of a discrepancy between a unit price and an extended line item price, the unit price shall govern.
17. Should an audit of Contractor's invoices during the term of the Agreement, and any renewals thereof, indicate that the County has remitted payment on invoices that constitute an over-charging to the County above the pricing terms agreed to herein, the Contractor shall issue a refund check to the County for any over-charges within 30-days of being notified of the same.
18. **For all titled vehicles and equipment the dealer must use the actual delivery date to the County on all transfer documents** including the Certificate of Origin (COO,) Manufacturer's Statement of Origin (MSO,) Bill of Sale (BOS,) and Application for Title.
19. **Equipment and serial and model numbers** - The contractor is strongly encouraged to include equipment serial and model numbers for all amounts invoiced to the County. If equipment serial and model numbers are not provided on the face of the invoice, such information may be required by the County before issuing payment.

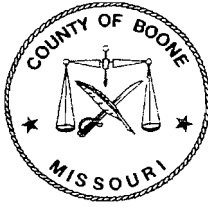

<p>On Sunday, April 19, 2015 the Boone County Prosecuting Attorney's Office hosted a 5K walk/run in honor of victims of crime at Stephens Park in Columbia, Missouri. The 5K was an opportunity to promote community awareness about victims rights and services available to victims of crime and their families in Boone County. NCVRW CAP funds were used for on line registration for participants through Kansas City Sports. We utilized volunteers to assist with on-site registration and a local race/event coordinator, Ready Set Results provided race packets, organized the course and monitored the timed results. The weather was cold and rainy that day but 144 people signed up for the race, despite the bad weather. We were blessed with a window of clear weather from 1:45 PM until after the race and ceremony which were over about 4:00 pm. We used NCVRW CAP funds to print T-Shirts for all participants and volunteers, printed posters to advertise the event, printed directional signs for the race route and large signs to display victims rights in the shelter at the race site, advertised in the local newspaper, received free public service announcements on KMIZ-TV station and KOPN radio station. KRCG-TV came to the event and did a news story, and the Columbia Daily Tribune wrote an article about the race. Our community partners included Bikers Against Child Abuse, Boone County Juvenile Office, Boone County Sheriff's Department, Columbia Police Dept, Parents of Murdered Children, Probation & Parole, University of Missouri Rape & Sexual Violence Prevention, True North Women's Shelter and the University of Missouri Police Department. We presented certificates to the community partners in appreciation for joining us in helping to promote community awareness in Boone County. At the ceremony Boone County Commissioner Janet Thompson and Prosecuting Attorney Dan Knight spoke to the race participants and community members about victims rights and resources before the race began. Overall we felt the race was a success and look forward to the opportunity to do this again next year.</p>

We received a lot of positive feed back about the race and the news stories. Many of the participants and attendees asked if this will be an annual event.

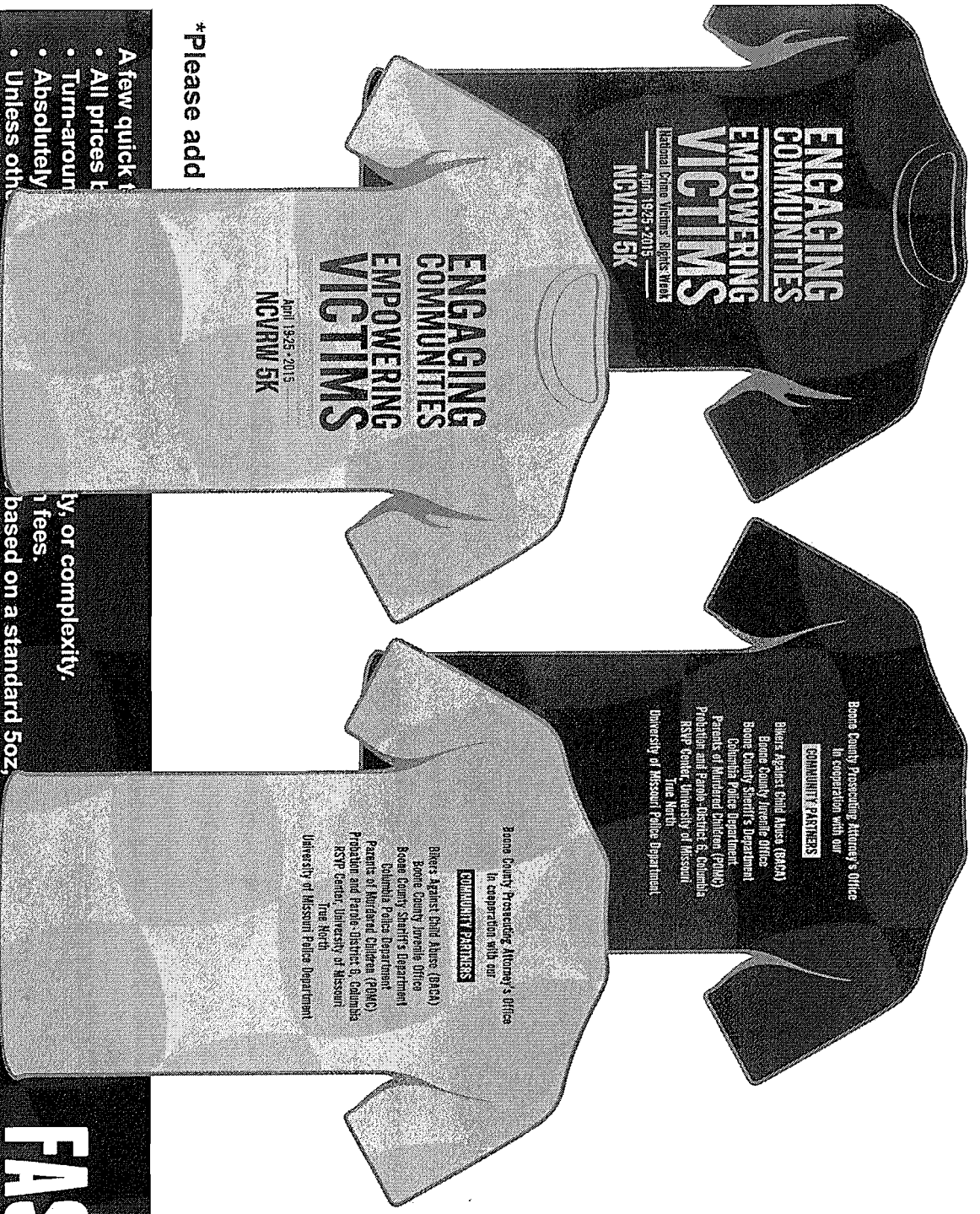

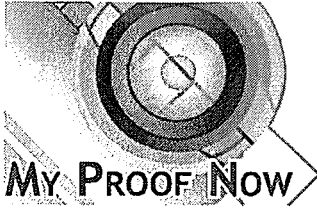

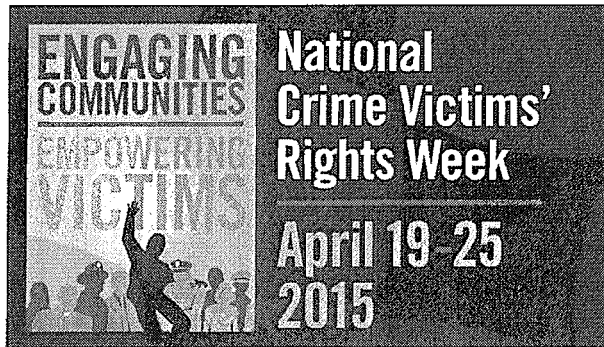

The Boone County prosecuting attorney's office is sponsoring a 5K run/walk Sunday to begin observance of National Crime Victims' Rights Week.

The event is scheduled for 2 p.m. Sunday at Stephens Lake Park. Prosecuting Attorney Dan Knight said the purpose of the event is to promote crime victims' rights and educate the community about available resources.

The theme of the run is "Engaging Communities, Empowering Victims."

Knight said crime victims in Missouri have rights both under the Constitution and throughout state statutes. Some of those rights include the right to be informed about court proceedings, the right to restitution, the right to reasonable protection from defendants and the right to information about how the criminal justice system works in general, he said.

The first 300 registrants for the run/walk will receive a free T-shirt. Online registration is encouraged, but walk-ups are welcome, Knight said.

The prosecutor's office is sponsoring the run/walk using a \$4,775 federal grant through the Department of Justice as part of the National Crime Victims' Rights Week Community Awareness Project.

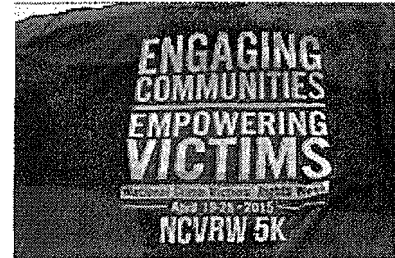

The Boone County Prosecutor's Office hosted its first ever National Crime Victims' Rights Week 5k race Sunday at Stephens Lake Park to kick off National Crime Victims' Rights Week.

This year's National Crime Victims' Rights Week runs from April 19th-25th.

The theme for this year is Engaging Communities...Empowering Victims.

Bonnie Adkins, Boone County Prosecuting Attorney Office Administrator says, "This is National Crime Victims' Rights Week and we received grant money from the Department of Justice to put on this race...it was a competitive grant of \$4,775 to put on this event and we thought it was a good way to bring together the community and make them aware of victims' rights."



There were over one hundred people who participated in the 5k.

The purpose of the 5k was to promote crime victims' rights and resources.

Boone County Prosecuting Attorney, Dan Knight says, "This event right here is so great because this helps us get the word out...it's so important for victims and for witnesses to report crimes and if you report crimes and if you are a victim of a crime you're gonna receive support."

Several organizations such as True North, Bikers Against Child Abuse and the MU Police Department had tables set up with information on how they help crime victims.

Knight also adds, "I think it's so important to host events like this to get the word out to victims that if you become a victim of a crime report it because especially in Boone county there are wonderful law enforcement agencies who will provide support and victims sometimes don't realize that and i hope that events like this will raise awareness"

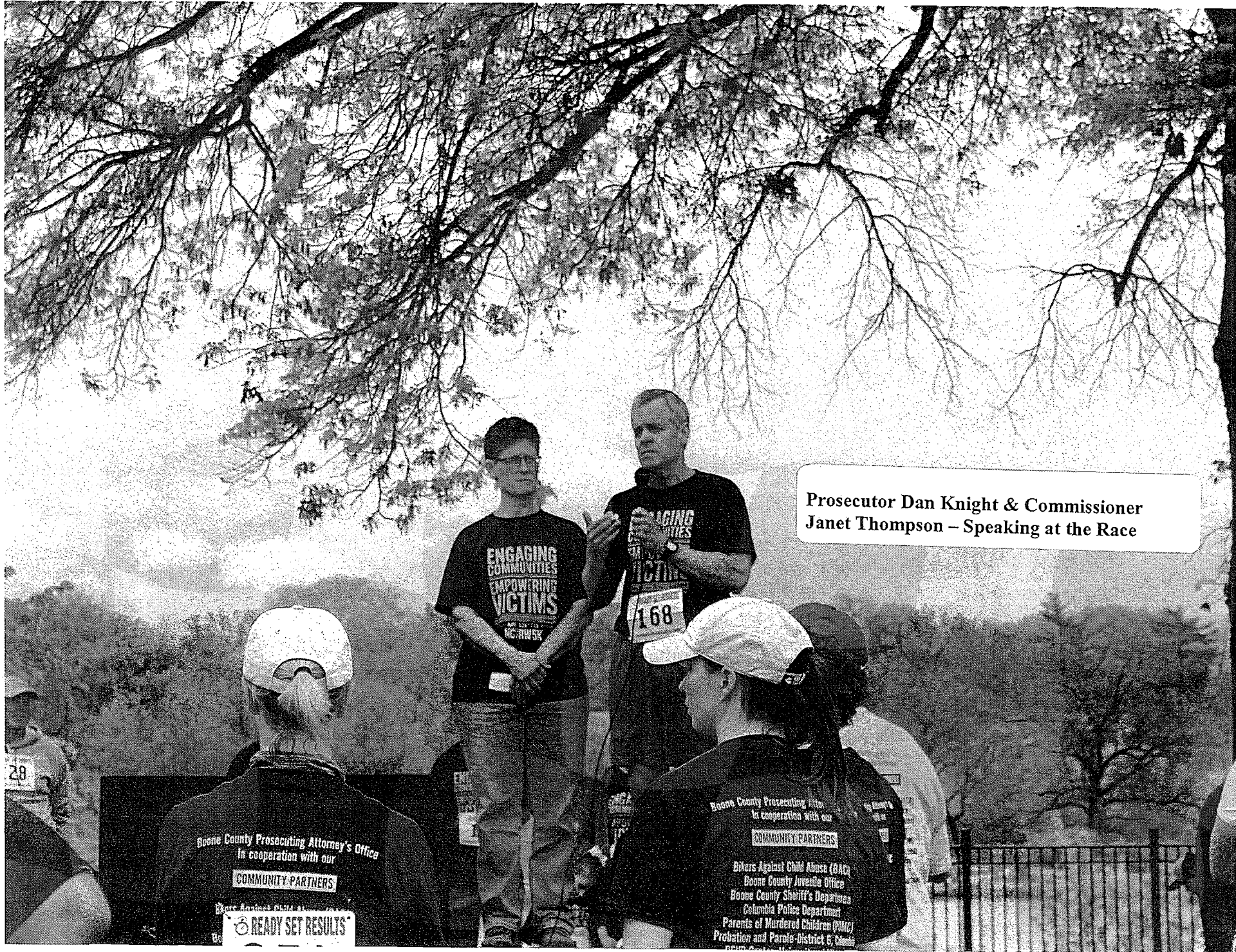
Knight says over half of the state's prosecuting offices do not have prosecutor based victim advocates.

He says it's important to have them so they can make sure the rights of victims are upheld.

Knight hopes to see a state-wide change in the inadequacy of prosecutor based victim advocates.

On Tuesday, a proclamation will be issued at the Boone County Commission meeting in the commission chambers proclaiming National Crime Victims' Rights Week.

On Thursday prosecuting attorney Dan Knight will speak along with many others about National Crime Victims' Rights Week at the Capitol.



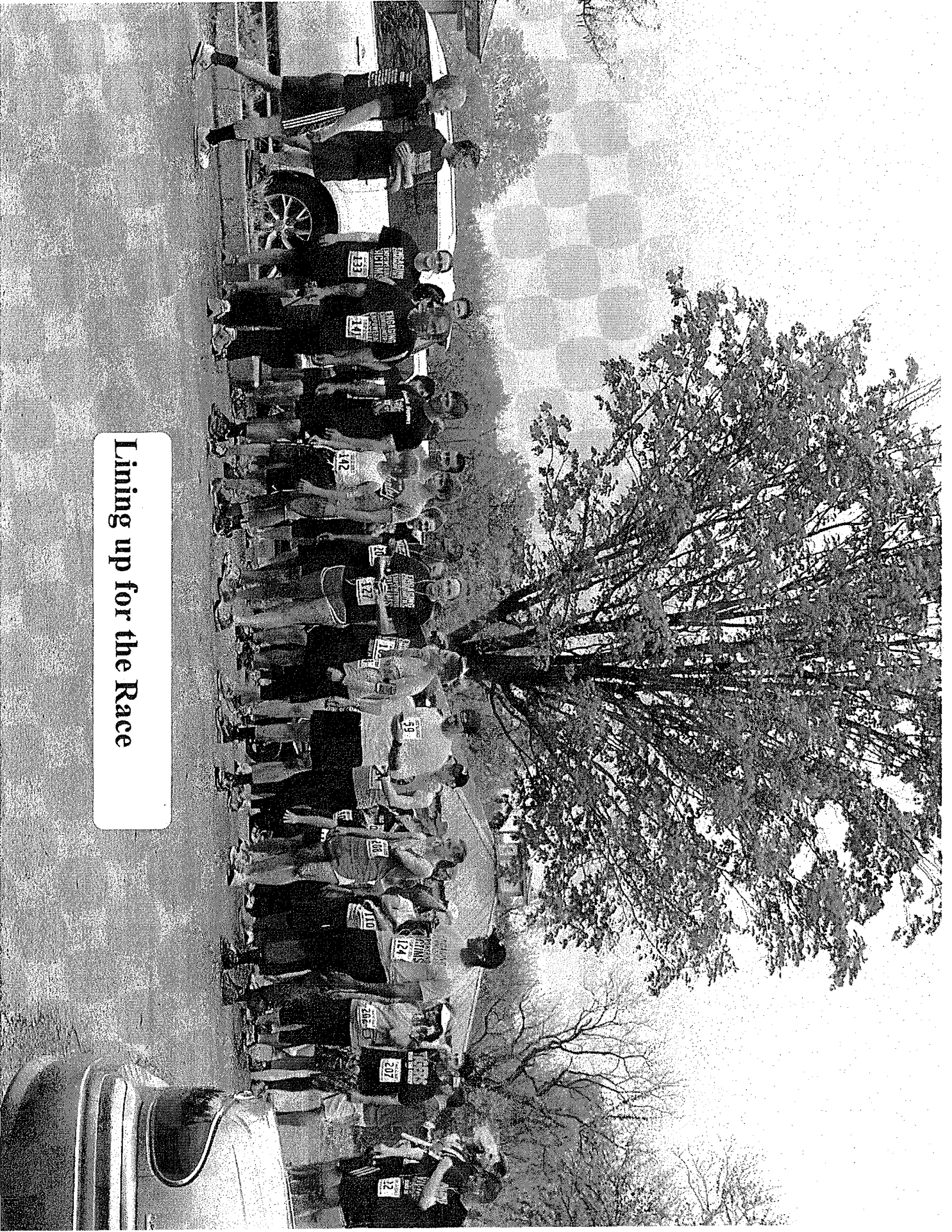
