The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m.

Subject: Purchasing Department

A. Second Reading and Approval for Disposal of Surplus

Commissioner Elkin moved to authorize the disposal of a 1980 GMC Box Truck, fixed asset tag 11903, VIN T15DTAV582295 through Missouri Auto Auction.

Commissioner Schnarre seconded the motion.

There was no discussion and no public comment.

B. Second Reading and Approval of State Cooperative Contract C002003001 (Portable and Vehicle Mounted Radios)

Commissioner Elkin moved to approve the State Cooperative Contract C002003001 for Portable and Vehicle Mounted Radios with Chariton Valley Tristar Communications.

Commissioner Schnarre seconded the motion.

There was no discussion and no public comment.

Subject: Sheriff's Department – First Reading of Contract with State for Sheriff's Substation Highway 124/Highway 63 and Budget Amendment

Sheriff Ted Boehm was present on behalf of this item.

Sheriff Boehm stated this is an agreement with the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission for use of land located at Highway 124 and Highway 63. This land will be used for the north Sheriff's Substation. This issue had been previously discussed in

October 2003. After the Commission approved that agreement, the State then wanted to lease the County the property for \$1,000 per year. This is the amended and correct contract.

After the Commission approves this agreement it will then be sent to the State for their approval.

Sheriff Boehm stated he believes it is imperative that the County moves forward with this. He has been looking in northern Boone County for a small piece of property to place a mobile unit on and he keeps going back to this location because of its central location.

The budget amendment will establish an expenditure account for the \$1,000.

Commissioner Schnarre stated the \$1,000 budget amendment is from the Forfeiture Funds. He asked the Sheriff where the facility money will come from. Sheriff Boehm stated it will come from the Civil Funds.

Commissioner Schnarre asked whether the \$1,000 will come from a special fund in the future. Sheriff Boehm stated that is correct

Sheriff Boehm noted the total expense for this project will come out of a special fund and not from any budgeted 2004 funds.

Commissioner Elkin stated this will serve the people of northern Boone County a lot better when this is completed. He thanked the Sheriff for his efforts to get this completed.

There was no further discussion on this item.

Commissioner Schnarre stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available meeting after the required 10 day waiting period with an appropriate order for approval.

Subject: Public Works – First Reading of Recommendation for No Parking Signs (Hillview Acres Subdivision)

Allison Anderson, Project Engineer, was present on behalf of this item.

Allison Anderson stated the Public Works Department was requested by the Hallsville School District to place "No Parking" signs on Eric Lane in Hillview Acres subdivision because the school bus could not turn onto Eric Lane from Lisa Drive when cars were parked near the intersection. The roads in the subdivision are approximately 24 feet wide with storm water ditches on both sides of the roads. This subdivision was improved through the NID process in 1999 and at that time "No Parking" signs were discussed, but opposed by the residents due to the loss of on-street parking. The Department requested the Boone County Fire District complete a study of the subdivision in order to determine if emergency vehicles could maneuver in the subdivision with cars parked on both sides of the streets. The Boone County Fire District completed a study and determined that emergency vehicles could not maneuver the streets when parking is allowed on both sides. They provided a recommendation of a series of "No Parking" signs that they feel would enable the emergency vehicles to maneuver within the subdivision. The memo from the Boone County Fire District is attached along with a plan sheet of the subdivision showing the proposed signage.

The Department may receive resistance from residents within the subdivision due to the loss of parking if the "No Parking" signs are installed and enforced, but if the subject of safety is brought forth, the residents may be more acceptable to the idea.

Ms. Anderson noted before the signs are posted, the Department will post the drawing of the placement of the signs around the mail boxes so the residents can see where the signs will be.

Commissioner Elkin stated the school and fire district were pleased with the process to hold the public hearings. The school district mentioned at a meeting that a school bus could not get through a road because of the parking issue. He believes the residents will have to begin utilizing their driveways.

The signs will not be posted immediately because the signs have to be ordered. The letters and drawing will be posted immediately after Commission approval.

There was no further discussion on this item.

Commissioner Schnarre stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available with an appropriate order for approval.
