The meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m.

Purchasing

Melinda Bobbitt from Purchasing was present on behalf of these items.

1. Sole Source Purchase 90-123110SS – Stalker Radar Equipment (first reading)

Melinda Bobbitt stated the Sheriff Department requests permission to utilize Applied Concepts Inc. of Plano, Texas as a sole source vendor to purchase Stalker Radar Equipment. Applied Concepts has provided documentation that they are the sole source provider for this equipment. This intent to make a sole source purchase was advertised in the October 23, 2009 Missourian. The equipment for \$ 3, 591.00 will be purchased from department 1251- Sheriff, account 91300 – Machinery & Equipment.

Commissioner Pearson stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

2. 56-29Sep09 Erosion Control Products (first reading)

Ms. Bobbitt stated the bid for Erosion Control Products Term and Supply closed on September 29, 2009. Purchasing and Public Works recommend award to Carter-Waters LLC as Primary Supplier for offering the best bid for Boone County. Carter-Waters was the only vendor to bid all line-items, and they are located in Columbia which allows for store pickup by Public Works. Recommendation for award for Secondary Supplier is A.S.P. Enterprises, Inc. of Lee's Summit, Missouri. Hertz Equipment Rental Corporation of Kansas City was not considered for award at this time due to not bidding firm percentages for renewal periods. These Term & Supply contracts will be paid out of department 2040 – PW Maintenance Operations, account number 26300 Materials and Chemical Supplies. \$ 60,000 is budgeted for 2009.

Commissioner Pearson stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

3. Surplus Vehicle Disposal (first reading)

Ms. Bobbitt stated the following is a list of surplus vehicles. Purchasing is requesting Commission approval to dispose of these vehicles through the Kirksville auto auction.

Commissioner Pearson inquired what would happen if somebody wanted to buy one of these and did not want to go through the auto auction.

Ms. Bobbitt stated they usually sell it as a lot so a company comes in and buys the entire stock rather then picking and choosing.

Commissioner Pearson stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

4. 59-12Oct09 Emergency Plumbing Services Term and Supply (first reading)

Ms. Bobbitt stated the bid for Emergency Plumbing Services Term and Supply closed on October 12, 2009. Two bids were received. Purchasing and the Facilities Maintenance Department recommend award to Master Tech Plumbing for offering the best bid for Boone County. This is a term and supply contract. Contract will be paid from department 6100-Facilities and Ground Maintenance, account 60100 – Building Repairs. \$8,400.00 is budgeted for this term and supply contract.

Commissioner Elkin inquired why there were only two bids with all the plumbers in the Columbia area.

Ms. Bobbitt stated this is what happened the last time they bid this.

Commissioner Elkin stated he thought something was wrong with the bid that is eliminating a lot of plumbers.

Ms. Bobbitt stated that she will look into that.

Commissioner Pearson stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

5. Sole Source: 91-30Nov09 Direct –Link LifeLine Series Crisis Response System (first reading)

Ms. Bobbitt stated the Sheriff Department requests permission to utilize Enforcement Technology Group Inc. of Milwaukee, Wisconsin as a sole source vendor to purchase Direct-Link LifeLine Series Crisis Response System. This system is a consolidated, self contained

telephone/ cell phone based communications system used to facilitate communication with suicidal, armed/barricaded, and hostage holding individuals. Enforcement Technology Group has provided documentation that they are the sole source provider for this equipment. This intent to make a sole source purchase was advertised in the October 28, 2009 Missourian. The equipment will be purchased from department 2901 – Sheriff Operations – LE Sales Tax, account 91300 – Machinery & Equipment (\$3,500.00).

Commissioner Pearson stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

6. Amendment Number One 38-28Jul09 Roll Off Recycling Containers (first reading)

Ms. Bobbitt stated contract 38-28JUL09 Roll- Off Recycling Containers (quantity of six (6)) was approved by commission for award to Gregory Container on September 4, 2009, commission order 439-2009. This amendment changes the quantity from six units to two units. Total cost of contract is \$9,776.50 and will be paid from department 1360 – Solid Waste Recycling, account 91300 – Machinery & Equipment.

Commissioner Pearson stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

7. Purchase Requisition Amendment Number One 38-28Jul09 Roll Off Recycling Containers (first reading)

Commissioner Pearson stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

8. Budget Revision Amendment Number One 38-28Jul09 Roll Off Recycling Containers (first reading)

Commissioner Pearson stated the budget revision for this item would deduct: \$8,000.00 from the Contingency, \$3,600.00 from equipment repair and maintenance, \$280.00 from subscriptions, \$320.00 from pavement repairs, \$100.00 from dump fees, \$4,749.00 from emergency; and increase \$9,777.00 in machinery and equipment, and \$7,200.00 in outside services.

Commissioner Pearson stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with an appropriate order for approval.

9. Purchase Requisition for the Lakewood NID (second reading first read on 10/27/2009)
