**FINDING OF PUBLIC NUISANCE AND ORDER FOR ABATEMENT**

**NOW** on this 16th day of March 2010, the County Commission of Boone County, Missouri met in regular session and entered the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order for abatement of nuisance:

**Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law**

The County Commission finds as fact and concludes as a matter of law the following:

1. The Boone County Code of Health Regulations (the "Code") are officially noticed and are made a part of the record in this proceeding.
2. The City of Columbia/Boone County Health Department administrative record is made a part of the record in this proceeding and incorporated herein by reference. In addition, any live testimony of the official(s) of the department and other interested persons are made a part of the record in this proceeding.
3. A public nuisance exists described as follows: derelict/unlicensed/junk-filled/dismantled/inoperable red 2 door Ford Thunderbird
4. The location of the public nuisance is as follows: Lot 127 Georgetown Plat 4 4415 W Rockhampton Circle a/k/a parcel # 16-416-20-01-033.00 01 Section 20, Township 48, Range 13 as shown by deed book 2085 page 0425, Boone County
5. The specific violation of the Code is: derelict/unlicensed/junk-filled/dismantled/inoperable automobile violation of 6.9 of the Code.
6. The Health Director's designated Health Official made the above determination of the existence of the public nuisance at the above location. Notice of that determination and the requirement for abatement was given in accordance with section 6.10.1 of the Code on the \_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_, 20\_\_\_, to the property owner, occupant, and any other applicable interested persons.
7. The above described public nuisance was not abated. As required by section 6.10.2 of the Code, the property owner, occupant, and any other applicable interested persons were given notice of the hearing conducted this date before the Boone County Commission for an order to abate the above nuisance at government expense with the cost and expense thereof to be charged against the above described property as a special tax bill and added to the real estate taxes for said property for the current year.
8. No credible evidence has been presented at the hearing to demonstrate that no public

nuisance exists or that abatement has been performed or is unnecessary; accordingly, in accordance with section 6.10.2 of the Code and section 67.402, RSMo, the County Commission finds and determines from the credible evidence presented that a public nuisance exists at the above location which requires abatement and that the parties responsible for abating such nuisance have failed to do so as required by the Health Director or Official's original order referred to above.

**Order For Abatement Chargeable As a Special Assessment To The Property**

Based upon the foregoing, the County Commission hereby orders abatement of the above described public nuisance at public expense and the Health Director is hereby authorized and directed to carry out this order.



In addition, a complaint may be filed against you in Circuit Court. **If the above nuisance condition has been corrected within the 15-day period, no further action is necessary.**







**BUDGET AMENDMENT PROCEDURES**

- County Clerk schedules the Budget Amendment for a first reading on the commission agenda. A copy of the Budget Amendment and all attachments must be made available for public inspection and review for a period of at least 10 days commencing with the first reading of the Budget Amendment.
- At the first reading, the Commission sets the Public Hearing date (at least 10 days hence) and instructs the County Clerk to provide at least 5 days public notice of the Public Hearing. **NOTE: The 10-day period may not be waived.**
- The Budget Amendment may not be approved prior to the Public Hearing.

The Boone County Sheriff's Department is requesting approval for this budget amendment to cover expenses to purchase equipment for new patrol vehicles.

In November of 2009 Ford Motor Company announced they will no longer produce the Crown Victoria Police Interceptor effective in the year 2011. This means that with next year's patrol car purchases we will also face additional equipment costs across the board due to the vehicle specific mounting and fit of some of the equipment.

With this year's replacement vehicle purchases we are exploring other manufacturers police rated vehicles. This year, in addition to some Crown Victoria's, we are purchasing a Chevrolet Tahoe and a Dodge Charger. By purchasing these vehicles in FY2010 it will allow us to make decisions on what vehicle manufacturer we want to continue with when Ford discontinues the Crown Victoria. With this change in vehicles comes an immediate need for different equipment due to some of the old equipment not fitting into the different body styles.

A contract and order is in the works for this year's replacement mobile and portable radio purchases. We were able to locate a new contract that gave us a savings on this purchase of \$7,715.02 under what was budgeted. We are requesting this Budget Amendment to reallocate some of the savings in this account (92300) into account number 91300 to cover the expenses to outfit the two evaluation patrol vehicles we are purchasing this year.

We have waited to request this Budget Amendment until most of the other FY2010 Class 9 purchases have gone through. A majority of the purchases, specifically the big ticket items (vehicles), have contracts and purchase orders already, showing a favorable budget variance of over \$7,700.00 (this figure is in addition to the savings from the mobile and portable radio purchases mentioned above specific to this BA request).
