Boone County will be responsible to make the following expenditures then invoice the Department of Corrections will then reimburse Boone County using state funds. Details are outlined in an MOU.

This Memorandum of Understanding is between the Boone County Reintegration Court ("Reintegration Court"), and Missouri Department of Corrections ("DOC") and the Missouri Office of State Courts Administrator ("OSCA") to set forth the responsibilities of each agency involved in OnTrack Program as awarded by the Bureau of Justice Assistance ("BJA") Second Chance Act Grant #2010-RM-BX-0005.

General Contract Terms:

- This agreement is effective the date of final signature through one year.
 Upon mutual agreement of the parties, the agreement may be renewed for two additional one-year periods. At the time of renewal, the terms and conditions, requirements, and specifications shall be reviewed and revised, if necessary.
- 2. This agreement contains the entire agreement and understanding between the parties and supersedes any other agreement concerning the subject matter of this transaction, whether oral or written.
- 3. This agreement shall be entered into under the laws of the State of Missouri and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be governed according to the laws of said state.
- 4. No breach of any term, provision, or clause of this agreement shall be deemed waived or excused unless such waiver of consent shall be in writing and signed by the party claimed to have waived or consented. Any consent by any party to, or waiver of a breach of other whether express or implied, shall not constitute consent to, waiver of, or excuse for any other different or subsequent breach.
- 5. No modification, amendment, renewal, extension or other alteration of this agreement shall be effective unless mutually agreed upon in writing by the parties and incorporated herein as an official amendment to this agreement.
- 6. No party can assign this agreement to any person, corporation, partnership or other entity without express written approval of the other parties and incorporation herein as an official amendment to this agreement.

Joint Responsibilities:

- 1. All parties shall provide participant(s) in the OnTrack Program implementation/oversight team to:
 - o Establish policies and procedures relating to the operation of the OnTrack Program during the contract period.

- Plan and implement strategies to encourage collaboration and partnership with federal, state and local agencies and organizations to further the understanding and acceptance of the OnTrack Program.
- o Create a system to utilize and monitor incentive and housing support expenditures.
- Create a system to develop and oversee community service activities and employer reimbursement activities and expenditures.
- o Recommend, approve, and monitor research activity.
- Meet quarterly to monitor, coordinate, and evaluate the effectiveness of the OnTrack Program through process and outcome studies to determine requirements for program modification.
- 2. All parties must agree budget adjustments may be required throughout the contract period and must be agreed upon by parties before a revised budget will be submitted to the BJA.

Reintegration Court shall:

- 1. Provide a full time reintegration court administrator for program oversight and submit invoice by the 10th working day of each month to DOC for services provided.
- 2. Provide a location and equipment/office supplies for OnTrack Program case manager, employment specialist, and court administrator.
- 3. Provide DOC and OCSA monthly progress report including enrollments and discharges with dates, services provided, and other data as requested no later than the $10^{\rm th}$ day of each month.
- 4. Inform DOC within five working days of programming issues affecting the scope of the program or the integrity of the OnTrack Program model.
- **5.** Inform OSCA within five working days of fiscal issues affecting the scope of the program or the integrity of the model.
- 6. Collect and review for accuracy all OnTrack Program financial invoices from vendors (not to exceed the attached budget) and submit one report monthly to DOC by the 10th working day of each month. The report must include details, including offender names and dates, for the following:
 - Offender rental assistance;
 - o Offender incentives; and,
 - o Offender community service stipends:
- 7. Collect and review for accuracy all OnTrack Program financial invoices from vendors (not to exceed the attached budget) and submit one report monthly to OSCA by the 10th working day of each month. The report must include details, including offender names and dates, for the following:
 - o Reality House expenditures;
 - o Family Counseling Expenditures; and,
 - o Offender drug screens.

- 4. Submit monthly invoices to OSCA for employer payroll reimbursement for offenders.
- 5. Review all invoices submitted by Reintegration Court within 10 days of receipt.
- 6. Provide OSCA quarterly drafts and data to complete BJA Financial Status Reports and Performance Measurement Tool Reporting.

 Drafts due: April 15th, July 15th, October 15th, and January 15th
- 7. Provide OSCA semi-annual drafts and data to complete BJA GMA Reports. Drafts due: January 15th and July 15th
- 8. Track all categories of services provided to offenders.
- 9. Track all service providers who provide offenders services.
- 10. Be the central point of contact for OSCA and the Reintegration Court.
- 11. Reimburse the Reintegration Court for expenditures as stated on the attached budget page.
- 12. Reimburse the court monthly actual expenses for administration of the OnTrack Program not to exceed \$56,815.08 for the grant cycle.

OSCA shall:

- 1. Reimburse invoices (not to exceed attached budget) within 30 days of receipt for:
 - Reality House services;
 - o Family Counseling Services; and,
 - o Offender employer payroll reimbursement.
- 2. Submit quarterly BJA Financial Status Reports and Performance Measure Tool Reports.
 - Due Dates: April 30th, July 30th, October 30th, and January 30th
- 3. Submit semi-annual BJA Grant Management System Reports.
 - o Due Dates: January 30th and July 30th
- 4. Notify DOC within five working days of receipt of any OnTrack Program compliance issues identified by BJA.
- 5. Invoice BJA for grant funds.
- 6. Under the control and direction of the Research Manager, conduct an independent evaluation of the OnTrack Program as outlined in the grant.

A. <u>Personnel</u>: Total personnel expenses for project equal \$160,326.56 which <u>does not</u> include fringe. \$80,632.56 is requested from BJA and \$79,694.00 contributed in-kind. FTE has been calculated as the number of hours devoted to the proposed project as a percentage of total hours worked. Existing salaries have been utilized for current staff calculations and positions to be hired have been calculated at rates consistent with similar positions in the region.

Project Coordinator (Dan Hanneken): The in-kind contribution of \$4,350 reflects 10% of Hanneken's time will be solely devoted to the *OnTrack* project. He will serve as a liaison between state, county, and local partners. Hanneken will attend two DOJ sponsored grant meetings and be responsible for overall project oversight. Hanneken will also assist Grant Director with reporting requirements.

District 6 Probation Officer (Clayton VanNurden): The in-kind contribution of \$36,644 reflects 100% of VanNurdens time will be devoted to *OnTrack*. He will be responsible to provide evidence-based supervision utilizing motivational interviewing. He will actively participate on the *OnTrack* Team and be contributing to the treatment planning process and case management functions of the project.

District 6 Probation Officer (Brenda Jamison): The in-kind contribution of \$38,700 reflects 100% of Jamison's time will be devoted to *OnTrack*. She will be responsible to provide evidence-based supervision utilizing motivational interviewing. She will actively participate on the *OnTrack* Team and be contributing to the treatment planning process and case management functions of the project.

Court Administrator (TBH): The requested amount of \$45,064.56 reflects 100% of the administrator's time will be devoted to *OnTrack*. This person will be a graduate level professional who manages the court docket, collects program fees, conducts interviews and needs assessments, and manages the day-to-day affairs at the court house. This person will be directly supervised by Judge Carpenter.

Case Manager (TBH): The requested amount of \$17,784 reflects a 19-hc time position. The case manager will directly assist the probation officers participating on *OnTrack* Team, collecting, storing, and reporting data, do participant's progress and providing case management services to offenderesources individual can easily access to meet their needs.

Employment Specialist (TBH): The requested amount of \$17,784 reflect part-time position. Contracts: The 13th Circuit Court has an established invoice system in place with the Office of State Courts Administrator for the funding of the current Reintegration Court. *OnTrack* will utilize this pre-existing resource in order to expedite payments for urgent needs such as emergency housing and employer payroll reimbursement. The Department of Corrections has an existing agreement with the 13th Circuit Court for \$39,200 to provide emergency and transitional housing. This funding is provided in-kind and is <u>not</u> included in the 25% cash match. Contracted costs are itemized below.

Women's Substance Abuse Services (Family Counseling, McCambridge)

Assessments \$110 each

Individual Counseling Sessions \$52 per hour/per client Educational or Therapy Groups \$12 per hour/ per client

Men's Substance Abuse Services (Reality House)

Assessments \$63 each

Individual Counseling Sessions \$35 per hour/per client Educational or Therapy Groups \$8 per hour/ per client

<u>Drug Screens:</u> OnTrack participants are randomly selected for drug screens through a lottery type call-in system. The typical participant will be tested an average of six times per month for six months. Cost = \$5.25 each test

<u>Community Service Stipend:</u> Participants will be engaged in community service two days a week for which they will they will receive a stipend. The typical participant will receive stipends for six weeks of community service Cost = \$100 stipend/per week

Payroll Reimbursement: Employers who hire *OnTrack* participants will receive a maximum amount of \$350 a week, for up to eight weeks, in the form of payroll reimbursement. Cost = Average \$275 per week/per offender

<u>Client Gift Cards:</u> Participants will be rewarded for their achievements with gift cards. Gift Cards will be purchased in various denominations and purchased from vendors appropriate for the target population.

Cost = Average \$75 per participant

Housing Assistance (In-Kind): Emergency housing assistance will be provided for participants for both immediate and longer-term needs. From prison, participants will stay at the Reality House until their first court date, or until they have a safe environment in which they can return. Oxford and other local transitional houses will be utilized for participants needing longer-term housing. Reality House Cost (In-Kind) = \$35 per night (average five nights per offender). Transitional Housing Cost (In-Kind) = Average \$434 (provides average deposit and four weeks rent at one of the local transition houses for one half (50) participants. Independent living support may also be provided with a recommendation from the judge. The in-kind contribution from DOC is in addition to the required 25% cash match.

<u>Family Days:</u> The treatment centers will provide Family Day to accentuate family reunification and parenting programming. To promote participation incentives are provided. Reality house will have four Family Days per year for the men. McCambridge will have three per year for the women. It is expected an average of 30 people (including family) will participate at each event. Cost = \$15 per person for food and refreshments. Cost = \$750 per event (7) for prizes and raffles.

Dear Mr. Linhares:

Congratulations on your recent award. In establishing financial assistance programs, Congress linked the receipt of Federal funding to compliance with Federal civil rights laws. The Office for Civil Rights (OCR), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice is responsible for ensuring that recipients of financial aid from OJP, its component offices and bureaus, the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW), and the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) comply with applicable Federal civil rights statutes and regulations. We at OCR are available to help you and your organization meet the civil rights requirements that come with Justice Department funding.

Ensuring Access to Federally Assisted Programs

As you know, Federal laws prohibit recipients of financial assistance from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, or disability in funded programs or activities, not only in respect to employment practices but also in the delivery of services or benefits. Federal law also prohibits funded programs or activities from discriminating on the basis of age in the delivery of services or benefits.

Providing Services to Limited English Proficiency (LEP) Individuals

In accordance with Department of Justice Guidance pertaining to Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C. § 2000d, recipients of Federal financial assistance must take reasonable steps to provide meaningful access to their programs and activities for persons with limited English proficiency (LEP). For more information on the civil rights responsibilities that recipients have in providing language services to LEP individuals, please see the website at http://www.lep.gov.

Ensuring Equal Treatment for Faith-Based Organizations

The Department of Justice has published a regulation specifically pertaining to the funding of faith-based organizations. In general, the regulation, Participation in Justice Department Programs by Religious Organizations; Providing for Equal Treatment of all Justice Department Program Participants, and known as the Equal Treatment Regulation 28 C.F.R. part 38, requires State Administering Agencies to treat these organizations the same as any other applicant or recipient. The regulation prohibits State Administering Agencies from making award or grant administration decisions on the basis of an organization's religious character or affiliation, religious name, or the religious composition of its board of directors.

The regulation also prohibits faith-based organizations from using financial assistance from the Department of Justice to fund inherently religious activities. While faith-based organizations can engage in non-funded inherently religious activities, they must be held separately from the Department of Justice funded program, and customers or beneficiaries cannot be compelled to participate in them. The Equal Treatment Regulation also makes clear that organizations participating in programs funded by the Department of Justice are not permitted to discriminate in the provision of services on the basis of a beneficiary's religion. State Administering Agencies and faith-based organizations should also note that the Safe Streets Act, as amended; the Victims of Crime Act, as amended; and the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act, as amended, contain prohibitions against discrimination on the basis of religion in employment. Despite these nondiscrimination provisions, the Justice Department has concluded that the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA) is reasonably construed, on a case-by-case basis, to require that its funding agencies permit faith-based organizations applying for funding under the applicable program statutes both to receive DOJ funds and to continue considering religion when hiring staff, even if the statute that authorizes the funding program generally forbids considering of religion in employment decisions by grantees.

Questions about the regulation or the application of RFRA to the statutes that prohibit discrimination in employment may be directed to this Office

Enforcing Civil Rights Laws

All recipients of Federal financial assistance, regardless of the particular funding source, the amount of the grant award, or the number of employees in the workforce, are subject to the prohibitions against unlawful discrimination. Accordingly, OCR investigates recipients that are the subject of discrimination complaints from both individuals and groups. In addition, based on regulatory criteria, OCR selects a number of recipients each year for compliance reviews, audits that require recipients to submit data showing that they are providing services equitably to all segments of their service population and that their employment practices meet equal employment opportunity standards.

Complying with the Safe Streets Act or Program Requirements

In addition to these general prohibitions, an organization which is a recipient of financial assistance subject to the nondiscrimination provisions of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act (Safe Streets Act) of 1968, 42 U.S.C. § 3789d(c), or other Federal grant program requirements, must meet two additional requirements:(1) complying with Federal regulations pertaining to the development of an Equal Employment Opportunity Plan (EEOP), 28 C.F.R. § 42.301-.308, and (2) submitting to OCR Findings of Discrimination (sec 28 C.F.R. § 42.205(5) or 31.202(5)).

1) Meeting the EEOP Requirement

In accordance with Federal regulations, Assurance No. 6 in the Standard Assurances, COPS Assurance No. 8.B, or certain Federal grant program requirements, your organization must comply with the following EEOP reporting requirements:

If your organization has received an award for \$500,000 or more and has 50 or more employees (counting both full- and part-time employees but excluding political appointees), then it has to prepare an EEOP and submit it to OCR for review within 60 days from the date of this letter. For assistance in developing an EEOP, please consult OCR's website at http://www.ojp.usdoj.gov/ocr/ecop.htm. You may also request technical assistance from an EEOP specialist at OCR by dialing (202) 616-3208.

If your organization received an award between \$25,000 and \$500,000 and has 50 or more employees, your organization still has to prepare an EEOP, but it does not have to submit the EEOP to OCR for review. Instead, your organization has to maintain the EEOP on file and make it available for review on request. In addition, your organization has to complete Section B of the Certification Form and return it to OCR. The Certification Form can be found at http://www.ojp.usdoj.gov/ocr/eeop.htm.

If your organization received an award for less than \$25,000; or if your organization has less than 50 employees, regardless of the amount of the award; or if your organization is a medical institution, educational institution, nonprofit organization or Indian tribe, then your organization is exempt from the EEOP requirement. However, your organization must complete Section A of the Certification Form and return it to OCR. The Certification Form can be found at http://www.ojp.usdoj.gov/ocr/eeop.htm.

2) Submitting Findings of Discrimination

In the event a Federal or State court or Federal or State administrative agency makes an adverse finding of discrimination against your organization after a due process hearing, on the ground of race, color, religion, national origin, or sex, your organization must submit a copy of the finding to OCR for review.

Ensuring the Compliance of Subrecipients

If your organization makes subawards to other agencies, you are responsible for assuring that subrecipients also comply with all of the applicable Federal civil rights laws, including the requirements pertaining to developing and submitting an EEOP, reporting Findings of Discrimination, and providing language services to LEP persons. State agencies that make subawards must have in place standard grant assurances and review procedures to demonstrate that they are effectively monitoring the civil rights compliance of subrecipients.

Memorandum of Understanding Between Boone County Reintegration Court, Missouri Department of Corrections and Missouri Office of State Courts Administrator

This Memorandum of Understanding is between the Boone County Reintegration Court ("Reintegration Court"), and Missouri Department of Corrections ("DOC") and the Missouri Office of State Courts Administrator ("OSCA") to set forth the responsibilities of each agency involved in OnTrack Program as awarded by the Bureau of Justice Assistance ("BJA") Second Chance Act Grant #2010-RM-BX-0005.

General Contract Terms:

- This agreement is effective the date of final signature through one year.
 Upon mutual agreement of the parties, the agreement may be renewed for
 two additional one-year periods. At the time of renewal, the terms and
 conditions, requirements, and specifications shall be reviewed and revised, if
 necessary.
- 2. This agreement contains the entire agreement and understanding between the parties and supersedes any other agreement concerning the subject matter of this transaction, whether oral or written.
- 3. This agreement shall be entered into under the laws of the State of Missouri and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be governed according to the laws of said state.
- 4. No breach of any term, provision, or clause of this agreement shall be deemed waived or excused unless such waiver of consent shall be in writing and signed by the party claimed to have waived or consented. Any consent by any party to, or waiver of a breach of other whether express or implied, shall not constitute consent to, waiver of, or excuse for any other different or subsequent breach.
- 5. No modification, amendment, renewal, extension or other alteration of this agreement shall be effective unless mutually agreed upon in writing by the parties and incorporated herein as an official amendment to this agreement.
- 6. No party can assign this agreement to any person, corporation, partnership or other entity without express written approval of the other parties and incorporation herein as an official amendment to this agreement.

Joint Responsibilities:

- 1. All parties shall provide participant(s) in the OnTrack Program implementation/oversight team to:
 - Establish policies and procedures relating to the operation of the OnTrack Program during the contract period.

- o Plan and implement strategies to encourage collaboration and partnership with federal, state and local agencies and organizations to further the understanding and acceptance of the OnTrack Program.
- Create a system to utilize and monitor incentive and housing support expenditures.
- Create a system to develop and oversee community service activities and employer reimbursement activities and expenditures.
- o Recommend, approve, and monitor research activity.
- Meet quarterly to monitor, coordinate, and evaluate the effectiveness of the OnTrack Program through process and outcome studies to determine requirements for program modification.
- 2. All parties must agree budget adjustments may be required throughout the contract period and must be agreed upon by parties before a revised budget will be submitted to the BJA.

Reintegration Court shall:

- 1. Provide a full time reintegration court administrator for program oversight and submit invoice by the 10th working day of each month to DOC for services provided.
- 2. Provide a location and equipment/office supplies for OnTrack Program case manager, employment specialist, and court administrator.
- 3. Provide DOC and OCSA monthly progress report including enrollments and discharges with dates, services provided, and other data as requested no later than the 10th day of each month.
- 4. Inform DOC within five working days of programming issues affecting the scope of the program or the integrity of the OnTrack Program model.
- **5.** Inform OSCA within five working days of fiscal issues affecting the scope of the program or the integrity of the model.
- 6. Collect and review for accuracy all OnTrack Program financial invoices from vendors (not to exceed the attached budget) and submit one report monthly to DOC by the 10th working day of each month. The report must include details, including offender names and dates, for the following:
 - o Offender rental assistance;
 - o Offender incentives; and,
 - Offender community service stipends:
- 7. Collect and review for accuracy all OnTrack Program financial invoices from vendors (not to exceed the attached budget) and submit one report monthly to OSCA by the 10th working day of each month. The report must include details, including offender names and dates, for the following:
 - Reality House expenditures;
 - Family Counseling Expenditures; and,
 - Offender drug screens.

DOC shall:

- 1. Chair the OnTrack Program implementation/oversight team.
- 2. Provide a part-time case manager and a part-time employment specialist to perform duties as outlined in the grant.
- 3. Provide supervision, case management and employment support services to program participants.
- 4. Submit monthly invoices to OSCA for employer payroll reimbursement for offenders.
- 5. Review all invoices submitted by Reintegration Court within 10 days of receipt.
- 6. Provide OSCA quarterly drafts and data to complete BJA Financial Status Reports and Performance Measurement Tool Reporting.

 Drafts due: April 15th, July 15th, October 15th, and January 15th
- 7. Provide OSCA semi-annual drafts and data to complete BJA GMA Reports. Drafts due: January 15th and July 15th
- 8. Track all categories of services provided to offenders.
- 9. Track all service providers who provide offenders services.
- 10. Be the central point of contact for OSCA and the Reintegration Court.
- 11. Reimburse the Reintegration Court for expenditures as stated on the attached budget page.
- 12. Reimburse the court monthly actual expenses for administration of the OnTrack Program not to exceed \$56,815.08 for the grant cycle.

OSCA shall:

- 1. Reimburse invoices (not to exceed attached budget) within 30 days of receipt for:
 - Reality House services;
 - o Family Counseling Services; and,
 - o Offender employer payroll reimbursement.
- 2. Submit quarterly BJA Financial Status Reports and Performance Measure Tool Reports.
 - o Due Dates: April 30th, July 30th, October 30th, and January 30th
- 3. Submit semi-annual BJA Grant Management System Reports.
 - o Due Dates: January 30th and July 30th
- 4. Notify DOC within five working days of receipt of any OnTrack Program compliance issues identified by BJA.
- 5. Invoice BJA for grant funds.
- 6. Under the control and direction of the Research Manager, conduct an independent evaluation of the OnTrack Program as outlined in the grant.

In consideration of the mutual agreements outlined herein it is understood that effective upon the signature of all parties, and countersigned by an authorized official of the Missouri Department of Corrections, as stipulated herein, a binding agreement shall exist.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, promises and representations in this agreement the parties agree as follows:

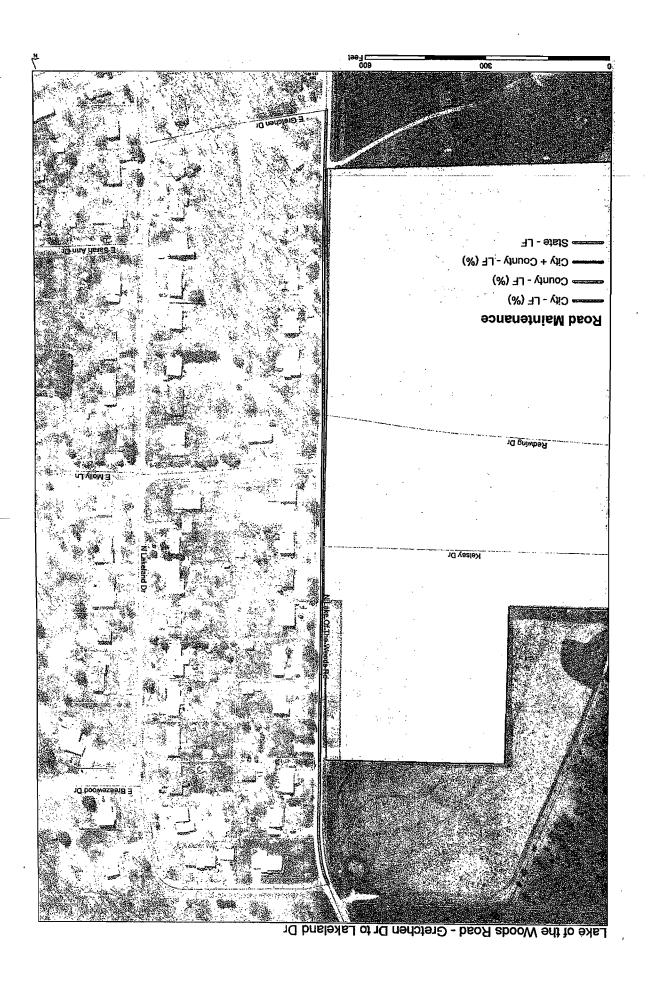

FINDING OF PUBLIC NUISANCE AND ORDER FOR ABATEMENT

NOW on this 14th day of December 2010, the County Commission of Boone County, Missouri met in regular session and entered the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order for abatement of nuisance:

Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law

The County Commission finds as fact and concludes as a matter of law the following:

- 1. The Boone County Code of Health Regulations (the "Code") are officially noticed and are made a part of the record in this proceeding.
- 2. The City of Columbia/Boone County Health Department administrative record is made—a part of the record in this proceeding and incorporated herein by reference. In addition, any live testimony of the official(s) of the department and other interested persons are made a part of the record in this proceeding.
- 3. A public nuisance exists described as follows: the following derelict/unlicensed/junk-filled/dismantled/inoperable vehicles: a black Dodge Durango, red Ford Mustang, maroon 4 door Chevrolet car, black extended cab Chevrolet truck.
- 4. The location of the public nuisance is as follows: 16780 N Bentwood Lane Lot 12 Bentwood Estates a/k/a parcel # 08-100-06-03-012.01 01 Section 06, Township 50, Range 11 as shown by deed book 3261 page 0117, Boone County
- 5. The specific violation of the Code is: derelict/unlicensed/junk-filled/dismantled/inoperable automobiles violation of 6.9 of the Code.
- 6. The Health Director's designated Health Official made the above determination of the existence of the public nuisance at the above location. Notice of that determination and the requirement for abatement was given in accordance with section 6.10.1 of the Code on the _15th day of October, 2010, to the property owner, occupant, and any other applicable interested persons.
- 7. The above described public nuisance was not abated. As required by section 6.10.2 of the Code, the property owner, occupant, and any other applicable interested persons were given notice of the hearing conducted this date before the Boone County Cornmission for an order to abate the above nuisance at government expense with the cost and expense thereof to be charged against the above described property as a special tax bill and added to the real estate taxes for said property for the current year.

8. No credible evidence has been presented at the hearing to demonstrate that no public nuisance exists or that abatement has been performed or is unnecessary; accordingly, in accordance with section 6.10.2 of the Code and section 67.402, RSMo, the County Commission finds and determines from the credible evidence presented that a public nuisance exists at the above location which requires abatement and that the parties responsible for abating such nuisance have failed to do so as required by the Health Director or Official's original order referred to above.

Order For Abatement Chargeable As a Special Assessment To The Property

Based upon the foregoing, the County Commission hereby orders abatement of the above described public nuisance at public expense and the Health Director is hereby authorized and directed to carry out this order.

It is further ordered and directed that the Health Director submit a bill for the cost and expense of abatement to the County Clerk for attachment to this order and that the County Clerk submit a certified copy of this order and such bill to the County Collector for inclusion as a special assessment on the real property tax bill for the above described property for the current year in accordance with section 67.402, RSMo.

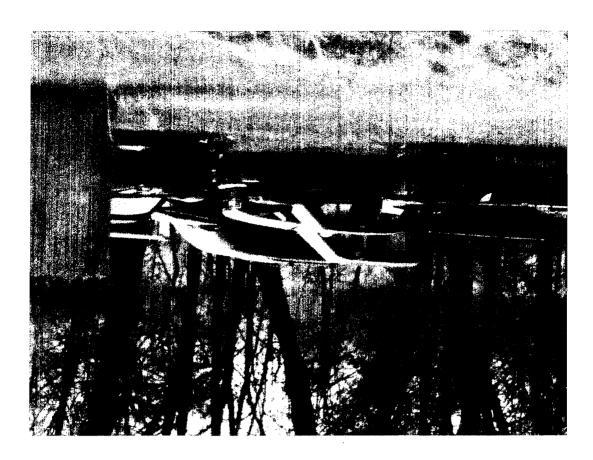
