

#DYK Candles, live Christmas trees, & holiday lights are the top three contributors to home fires during the Christmas season? Reduce your risk this season by following these tips:

- Check holiday lights each year for frayed wires
- Don't link more than three strands of lights together
- Never leave a candle burning unattended
- Water your live Christmas tree daily to keep it from drying out and keep it at least 3 feet away from heat sources
