The mission of the Boone County Ready campaign is to enhance community preparedness, foster collaboration and build resilience by engaging our citizens in actively preparing for emergencies and disasters.

Here's how you can make sure you are #BooneCountyReady for home fires.

1.BE INFORMED

Understand the common ways home fires can start.

2. MAKE A PLAN

Discuss what to do during a home fire, how to evacuate your home, and where to meet outside of the home.

3. BUILD A KIT

During a home fire, it's likely you won't have time to grab your emergency kit. Keep digital copies of important documents available in the cloud so you can still access them if all items in your home are lost to a fire.

4. GET INVOLVED

Practice your home fire plan and test your smoke detectors regularly!

Matt, as training and exercise specialist, is thankful for the dedication of Boone County to training to be better prepared for emergencies. Matt supported Boone County Amateur Radio Emergency Services and American Red Cross with their exercise to coordinate sheltering with normal lines of communications, Boone County CERT's critical separation missing person search, City of Columbia's Public Information Officer Tabletop Exercise, as well as an exercise to practice transferring command in the event of an emergency at a MU Home Game. On top of that, he held a CERT training, CERT Practical session, two BLS CPR classes, EOC Workshop and supported two EOC activations for MU Home Games.
