



The number of traffic crashes in Boone County has decreased over the years. The two areas of concentration for the Sheriff's Department are speed (hazardous moving violations) related crashes and crashes involving alcohol. The number of speed related crashes in Boone County was approximately 51 for FY 2000. The number of alcohol related crashes in Boone County were 5 for FY 2000. The major roadways that were involved were as follows: Creasy Springs Road, Obermiller Road, Saint Charles Road, Rangeline Road, Scott Blvd, Mexico Gravel Road, New Haven Road, and Gillespie Bridge Road. The speed related crashes occur throughout the week and weekend at all times of the day.

Four Deputies and one Supervisor will be assigned to patrol a given area where high incidents of alcohol related crashes and arrests have occurred. The operations will take place during the hours of 10:00pm until 03:00am on Friday and Saturday nights once a month during the summer months of May through September. The Deputies assigned to the activity will stop vehicles in violation of State traffic laws in an effort to detect driver's impaired on alcohol and/or controlled substances. To assist in the achievement of this project the Department is requesting an additional in car video system to assist in the detection and arrest of impaired drivers.

Locations of the Saturations will be as follows:

Media releases will be made three (3) days prior to each enforcement activity as part of the campaign to increase driver awareness of the hazards of operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated and also increase compliance with the traffic laws of the State of Missouri.

"Operation Slow Down" this program is a speed and hazardous moving violation enforcement concentration on the major roadways where traffic crashes are occurring. Four Deputies will be assigned to enforce state hazardous moving laws in various areas. High complaint areas will also be included in the enforcement activity. Deputies will conduct moving and stationary radar enforcement to locate drivers in violation of State hazardous moving violation laws. Two enforcement periods each month will be conducted for a total of 32 enforcement hours per month. The County Commission did not allocate funds for any equipment in FY 2001, money was allocated for an additional Deputy. The radar unit will be utilized during the enforcement activity as well as during regular patrol hours for the Deputy assigned.
