The meeting was called to order at 9:35 a.m.

Subject: Public Hearing – ABC Labs Community Development Block Grant

Bernie Andrews, Regional Economic Development, Inc., and Tom Ratermann, Boone County Regional Sewer District Manager, were present on behalf of this item.

Bernie Andrews stated this is the final required public hearing for the Community Development Block Grant for the Industrial Infrastructure Grant that benefited ABC Labs and Fairway Meadows Subdivision.

This grant was initially awarded in September 1998 totaling \$136,865.00. Part of these funds were used for a sewage upgrade for a total project cost of \$289,218.00. The CDBG funds were used to pay for the force main, gravity flow, and pump station for the sewer system that would allow Fairway Meadows Subdivision and eventually ABC Labs to get off the lagoon systems.

Mr. Andrews stated to date, \$192,302.00 have been drawn down from DED to pay for the improvements, leaving \$44,563.00 to be used. He noted \$12,000.00 of the grant was allocated for construction inspections. The City of Columbia preformed the construction inspections and those funds will be obligated back to the State. When the Boone County Regional Sewer District mails REDI the final invoice, REDI will process the invoice and obligate any unused funds back to the State.

To leverage this grant, ABC Labs was required to create 21 new jobs and invest \$2 million within a two-year period. At the time of the grant, there were 182 employees at ABC Labs. In September 2000, REDI documented ABC Labs having created 25 new jobs and invested over \$2.1 million. The grant agreement states ABC Labs has to keep the jobs in place for a period of five years from the grant agreement. Since that time, ABC Labs has invested an additional \$5 million in capital investment on their property and at one time had a total of 51 new jobs.

In August 2002, there were some lay-offs because of economic conditions in this specific market. Currently, ABC Labs is below the required 21 new jobs but ABC Labs expects to be back to the required number by the end of 2003.

Mr. Andrews stated the paper work should be processed in February and close the grant by the end of February 2003. He thanked the Commission, the Treasurer's Office and the Sewer District for their help with this project.

Tom Ratermann discussed the use of the lagoons by ABC Labs and Fairway Meadows Subdivision and how the new gravity sewer and pump station are being used.

Mr. Ratermann noted there is a limited capacity to this system because of the gravity sewer around Waters Edge Lake.

The connection agreement for this project was done in the late 1980's or early 1990's and later amended to include ABC Labs and the Pin Oak Neighborhood.

Commissioner Elkin stated the ultimate goal of the BCRSD is to eliminate discharge points and this new system has eliminated a discharge point that people see as they are driving into Columbia on I-70. He believes this is a tremendous improvement to the community, the subdivision and ABC Labs.

Commissioner Schnarre asked if ABC Labs is currently hooked up to this system. Mr. Ratermann stated they are not at this time. There is a small sewer extension that has to be built, which will be privately maintained. The plans for this have been submitted and the Sewer District is in the process of reviewing the plans.

Commissioner Schnarre asked if this extension will be paid with grant funds. Mr. Ratermann stated this will be paid with private funds.

There was further discussion.

Commissioner Schnarre opened the floor for a public hearing.

There was no one wishing to speak on this item.

Commissioner Schnarre closed the public hearing.

There was no further discussion on this item.

Marlene Ridgway, Purchasing Department Buyer, was present on behalf of these items.

Marlene Ridgway stated the department recommends award to Blacktop Paving Company.

Commissioner Elkin moved to award bid 01-14JAN03 for Grading MKT Trail – Term and Supply to Blacktop Paving Company.

Commissioner Elkin moved to award bid 85-31DEC02 for Boom Mower and tractors to Cooke Sales and Services. The County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby authorize the disposal through trade-in of 2 1995 Ford 7740 Tractors with Tiger TRB-50 Rotary Boom Mowers (Fixed Asset Tag #s 10823 and 10824).

The department is also requesting approval of the disposal through trade-in of 2 1993 Case 580 SK Backhoes (Fixed Asset Tag #s 7630 and 7631).

Commissioner Schnarre moved to award bid 86-31DEC02 for Backhoes to Crown Power and Equipment. The County Commission of the County of Bonne does hereby authorize the disposal through trade-in of 2 1993 Case 580 SK Backhoes (Fixed Asset Tag #s 7630 and 7631).

They are recommending awarding 2 vehicles for the Public Works Department including trade-in for \$41,284.96 and for the Planning and Building Inspection Department 2 vehicles for the purchase price of \$44,084.96. The department is also requesting the disposal, through trade-in, of 2 1994 Ford Rangers (Fixed Asset Tag #s 8685 and 8686). The total contract value, including trade-in, is \$85,369.92.

Commissioner Elkin moved to award bid 02-07JAN02 for Light Duty Pickups to Albert Buick Honda GMC. The County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby authorize the disposal through trade-in of 2 1994 Ford Rangers (Fixed Asset Tag #s 8685 and 8686).

Subject: Human Resources

Betty Dickneite, Human Resources Director, was present on behalf of these items.

A. First Reading of Contract with Zimmer Radio Group

Betty Dickneite stated the Commission approved the renewal of the Sole Source with Zimmer Radio Group earlier this month. This is a contract with Zimmer Radio Group. This contract has been modified from the last contract to run between February and December 2003.

Mrs. Dickneite stated this is a continuation of radio and internet advertising with Zimmer Radio Group, which began approximately six months ago. This advertising has brought in a broader base of applicants for the County.

Commissioner Elkin stated he believes this advertising has had an effect on the applicant pool for the County.

B. First Reading of Affirmative Action Plan for Boone County Government

Betty Dickneite stated the County hired Julien Carter as a consultant for Boone County's Affirmative Action Plans and Mr. Carter presented this plan to the Commission December 31, 2002. At that meeting, Mr. Carter reviewed some of the highlights of the Affirmative Action Plan document. The Commission requested this plan be forwarded to the Personnel Advisory Committee. At the January meeting of PAC, this plan was discussed and there were no objections to adoption of this plan. This is being brought forward today as a first reading.

Mrs. Dickneite noted the underutilized groups for minorities and females. There are two

of 24 job groups that are underutilized for minorities, the Administrator's category and Public Works Professional. Each of these groups would have one more minority; these would not be considered underutilized.

Four of 24 job groups were identified as underutilized for females, Administrative and Officials, Information System Technology, Appraiser, and Road Maintenance Worker. Each of these groups would have one more minority; these would not be considered underutilized.

Commissioner Elkin asked when the last Affirmative Action Plan was adopted by the County. Mrs. Dickneite stated this is supposed to be done on an annual basis but the first plan that was adopted was in 1998, with another plan adopted in 1999. There was a delay between the plans because the County was working on the Pay Plan and Job Reclassification.

Commissioner Schnarre noted this plan is using 1990 census information.

There was no further discussion and no public comment.
