The meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m.

Department of Public Health

1. 1st & 2nd reading; Abatement of a property located at 2753 W. Mill Creek Terrace, parcel # 16-800-34-02-001.00 01

Circuit Judge's Office

Mary Epping from the Circuit Judge's office spoke on this issue. The two budget amendments are for two different accounts. Normally, this is not done, but the information on the grant was not available at budget time.

Commissioner Miller noted that the amount for one of the budget amendments is not reflective of what is being presented.

Ms Epping noted that the documents she received are not matching up as well.

Commissioner Miller said that this is a first reading and they have until the next reading to correct the discrepancies with the amounts.

Ms Epping said they would do that.

County Clerk

10. 1st & 2nd reading; Election Certification of the Lake of the Woods Transportation Development District (TDD) tax increase

Commissioner Atwill moved on this day the County Commission of the County of Boone, as required by statute, does hereby spread upon the records of the Boone County Commission the transmittal of the Lake of the Woods Transportation Development District (the "District") Official Election Results relating to an increase of the TDD Tax as certified by the Circuit Clerk.

Boone County Regional Sewer District

11. First reading; Letter of Intent to Meet Conditions for the Manchester Heights Sanitary Sewer Neighborhood Improvement District

Tom Raterman spoke to this item stating that the Boone County Regional Sewer District (BCRSD) received a letter from Rural Development with 26 different conditions that have to be met before BCRSD can receive the Rural Development Loan. The Letter of Intent is a commitment to meet those conditions within the next 12 months as stated in the letter.

Commissioner Miller asked who in the County has reviewed this letter?

Mr. Raterman said that the Treasurer and Auditor have reviewed it and he is currently in communication with County Counsel on two issues concerning right-of-way. These two issues are part of approximately 12 they received. There are three issues relating to Engineering, three for the Regional Planning Commissions as well as others. The Letter of Conditions is the trigger to get Mid Missouri Regional Planning to apply for the CDBG grant. The project will be funded by ½ loan and ½ grant.

Commissioner Miller asked when approval is needed since the Commission will need to review the Letter of Conditions.

Mr. Raterman said that it is not urgent and understands that Commission will need to review.

Commissioner Miller said that they will review the Letter in the Staff meeting scheduled for today.

There were no further comments or questions.

Commissioner Atwill stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

Sheriff's Department

12. First reading; Four MoDOT Highway Safety Grant applications – 1) DWI Enforcement (2 full-time deputies & training), 2) DWI Enforcement (Sobriety Checkpoints & Saturation Patrols), 3) Hazardous Moving Violation Enforcement, 4) Youth Alcohol Enforcement

Captain Martin and Sergeant Leer spoke to this issue. This is a year to year grant broken into four segments as noted. The requested amount for the two deputies has increased due to cost of living adjustments and increases. It is still at 50% funding by the County.

Commissioner Miller asked if the County is still committed to this in the future if there is no grant.

Sergeant Leer said that the County is not committed to future funding if the grant is not available. Sergeant Leer also stated that the DWI grants for deputies is 50% funded while the other three grants are 100% reimbursed including training.

There were no other comments or questions.

Commissioner Atwill stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

13. First reading; Budget Amendment Sheriff's Revolving Fund – Active Shooter Training

Captain Martin said that this Budget Amendment is to send three deputies to be certified in the training program called ALICE (Alert, Lock down, Inform, Counter and Evaluation). It has been taught in the Sturgeon and Hallsville school districts. It is applied mainly to schools who are confronted with a shooter. This is a program to get away from the traditional just sit and hide in an area. The training will give options when confronted with a shooter. The philosophy is to know who you shooter is and adjust accordingly. One can choose to run, hide, fight, get out; it gives one the option to make the best decision. It is an instructor based course and can be applied to other things as well such as the courthouse. Training will be held at the Columbia Training Center.

There were no further comments or questions.

A second reading will be scheduled after the mandatory 10 day waiting period.

14. First reading; Budget Amendment Sheriff's Revolving Fund – Office items for new Technology Research Operations Analyst

Captain Martin said this Budget Amendment is required to fund office items for the new position of Technology Research Operations Analyst. This was not budgeted and he was hoping to use existing funds but couldn't and would use the Revolving Fund to purchase the needed items.

There were no further comments or questions.

A second reading will be scheduled after the mandatory 10 day waiting period.

Resource Management

15. 1st & 2nd reading; Agreement with Public Water Supply District #9 for Preliminary Engineering Services for Relocation at Route Z and St. Charles Road in conjunction with the MDOT project

Stan Shawver spoke on this issue stating that he and Commissioner Atwill met with MoDOT and Water District #9 concerning the relocation of a waterline where the roundabout is to be constructed. MoDOT could not reach agreement with the Water District on the cost for the engineering services and relocation of the waterline. MoDOT approached the County knowing that the County has an existing agreement with the Water District on such matters and asked if the County would intervene and use that relationship with the Water District to obtain engineering services, design and relocation costs and would settle with the county once the project was completed. Mr. Shawver stated that County Counsel was involved in drafting language for the agreement that is before the Commission.

There were no further comments or questions.

Commissioner Miller moved on this day the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve the Agreement with Public Water Supply District #9 for Preliminary Engineering Services for Relocation at Route Z and St. Charles Road in conjunction with the Boone County - MDOT project. It is further ordered the Presiding Commissioner is hereby authorized to sign said Agreement for Preliminary Engineering Services
