The meeting was called to order at 1:31 p.m.

Public Works

1. 1st & 2nd reading; Proclamation Honoring Brandon Irwin

Commissioner Atwill said we have a special event today saying he is continuously pleased to have the privilege of representing a lot of hard working people in the County who toil tirelessly, night and day as in the case of these snow storms, to do the services needed by the citizens of the County. In my short tenure as a Commissioner, this has been one of the most pleasant things to become aware of; the hard work and dedication that exists in the work force to do the things needed. Today, we have a special recognition of a fairly new employee of the Public Works Department. Chet Dunn would like to say few words.

Chet Dunn said he would like to thank Brandon for seeing that there was a need and actually doing something about it. A lot of people would go by there and not recognize that there is a need out there. There is great appreciation for the way he represented our department that day.

Mr. Dunn thanked Bryan Boyce for singling Brandon out for his acts and saying that Brandon saved someone's life that day and we are proud you work for us.

Bryan Boyce read the following:

Brandon Irwin started his employment with Boone County Public Works on June 25th of 2012. Brandon has been a valuable asset to my crew and his crew members and can be depended on for any task you ask him to perform.

During the snow storm of February 21st, Hwy 63 and I-70 were both shut down due to heavy snow accumulation and accidents. Therefore Brandon had to detour onto Grindstone Pkwy. and Providence Rd. to get to his assigned territory in the Midway area. During this detour, Brandon came upon an ambulance that had slid sideways in the snow and was stuck in the road.

Inside the ambulance, responders were working on a critical heart attack patient in desperate need to get to the emergency room at University Hospital. Brandon was not sure what Public Works policy was on plowing roads that are maintained by other entities or what to do in an emergency situation such as this one; but he made the decision to leap into action. Brandon dropped his snow plow and began weaving in and out of stalled cars and snow banks, clearing the way in white out conditions and over a foot of snow accumulation on the road surface. At one point at the intersection of Stadium Blvd. were traffic was gridlocked, Brandon jumped his plow onto the sidewalk to clear a path for the ambulance, and then continued all the way to the emergency room doors.

Boone County Public Works clears roads for the fire department, ambulance services and Sheriff's Department inevitably during each and every snow storm. These events are always coordinated through Boone County Joint Communications and the On-Call supervisor, managing the snow events at Public Works. The supervisor knows which truck is in a particular area and can radio that driver for help; in this case, there was no such coordination. In the heat of the moment, Brandon made it his responsibility to clear a path for this ambulance which ultimately save a life that day.

I did not hear about any of these events until later in the day. One of the other snow plow drivers, who is also a volunteer fireman received a call from one of the first responders, stating that if it were not for Brandon, the man in the ambulance would have surely died. To this day, we do not know the man's name, all we do know is that he survived and those first responders credit the snow plow driver for saving this man's life.

We are all very proud of you!

Commissioner Atwill read the following Proclamation honoring Brandon Irwin:

Whereas, Brandon Irwin has worked for Boone County Public works for eight months,

Whereas, Brandon used sound judgment in the face of adverse circumstances to help someone in need,

Whereas, Brandon risked his own safety without hesitation to help an ambulance travel through hazardous snowy conditions,

Whereas, Brandon's selfless act contributed to successful life-saving efforts by allowing for speedy transport of the critically-ill patient,

Whereas, Brandon is recognized for his ability to make sound decisions independently in difficult and intense situations.

Therefore, in honor of this outstanding public servant's commitment to duty and initiative in the face of an emergency, the Commission is extending its appreciation.

13. Public Comment

Commissioner Miller asked Manager Chet Dunn to report out on the costs associated with the snow removal from the previous snow storms.

Mr. Dunn said that the two major snow events, covering the period February 21 to March 6, the total cost was \$240K. The breakdown of costs was \$79K for labor, \$149K for equipment and \$10K for materials. Costs for this most recent snow storm was \$87K.

Commissioner Atwill said he was most impressed with the amount of miles driven during the clean-up of the two major snow storms.

Mr. Dunn state they had driven approximately 26,000 miles.

Commissioner Atwill said we have 800 miles of road in the county and these roads had to be covered numerous times to remove the snow fall.

All the Commissioners thanked Public Works for a job well done.
