# **Central Missouri Events Center**

# 1. Task Force report presentation

Chairman Roger Wilson addressed the Commission thanking the Commission for the opportunity to examine the future of the CMEC and present some recommendations. The members of the committee were recognized for their forward focus, wanting only the best for Boone County. Mr. Wilson also thanked past and present contributors to the Boone County Fair before it became the Central Missouri Events Center and those that have contributed since then. There are corporations, individuals and families that have supported the fair and the CMEC over the years and it was refreshing to hear so much testimony during the public hearings that were conducted.

Mr. Wilson said that the background and rationale for the task force is quite evident with the appointment of the committee to look into the existing framework and make recommendations moving forward. The 1<sup>st</sup> step has been taken with the Commission hiring

TAG Events to manage the Fairgrounds.

The process was meeting every week for eight weeks. The committee hosted four public hearings, one each in Hallsville, Midway, Ashland and here in the Government Chambers. The attendance was good and input from the attendees brought to the attention some things that the committee did not consider. One important thing is that vendors were emphatic that they could schedule out several years and sign contracts, knowing they would be in the building. That is one recommendation the committee strongly urges the Commission to address.

Mr. Wilson said the committee proposes the following recommendations:

- 1) Make a long term commitment once a decision is made, steps should be taken to secure the CMEC and surrounding grounds for future generations.
- 2) Procure funding from public dollars, private/corporate donations and facility generated income this is based on research of other similar facilities.
- 3) Create a not-for-profit foundation serve in concert with CMEC management, primarily serving to lead private/corporate fundraising efforts.
- 4) Appoint an advisory/resource committee no power, serve in an advisory capacity, providing institutional knowledge, community history, and links to any existing available resources.
- 5) Hire a full-time manager and full-time marketer emphasize the Marketer since this is a multi-million dollar facility and tax payer asset. It can be enhanced with an aggressive full-time marketing effort.
- 6) Develop a timeline for short and long term maintenance needs, including capital improvements and deferred maintenance need this so the facility can be financially viable.
- 7) Seek partnerships that enhance the value of the CMEC these can be financial, recreational or service related.

8) Determine and track the economic impact of the CMEC – because the property is owned by and accountable to all the citizens of Boone County, there is a need to develop an accurate way to assess economic impact.

Mr. Wilson reviewed the events and uses for the facility stating there is a wide variety as it should be for such a facility and the task force envisions the CMEC as a multi-purpose facility, able to host multiple events concurrently. Several thoughts were the Special Olympics locating at the facility and perhaps the university extension group as well.

There will be some things that will not generate revenue. It is desirable to have the facility be self-sustaining, but it is a public facility, owned by the public and must be for the public benefit. The overwhelming majority want to see the site developed and feel a sense of urgency in the matter.

Commissioner Atwill asked if there have been any suggestions from the business community and how they might react to the idea of community support financially.

Mr. Wilson said he has had several conversations regarding this. No one has said no, yet no one has written a check. There needs to be more of these conversations. If the report is that the Commission is going to act positively, that will send a message that this debate is over and there is a plan going forward. It is an asset of Boone County and there will be development in the best way possible as stewards of the property. The support is there. During the planning process there will be the opportunity to see what is advantageous and other things will be flushed out in the process. There is a strong volunteer commitment in the community and the people have an emotional and special attachment to the fairgrounds. There needs to be an effort to formally tap into that. There is a lot of mental and physical muscle available to make this a success.

There were no other comments. Commissioner Atwill thanked the task force for their effort

in delivering the document with their findings. The Commission will study it and hopefully find a way to implement some of the recommendations.

Commissioner Thompson recognized those from the task force that were present for the meeting; Roger Wilson, Nonie Dudley, Anna Marie Knipp, Marie Pasley, David Thomas, Jay Turner, Mick Wilson and Bondi Wood.

# 2. First reading; Budget Revision to purchase a Rubber Tire Loader

Chet Dunn said that the current loader is a 2007. The department wanted to get several more years of use but it is not going to make it. It is deteriorating before our eyes.

Greg Eddington said that the cost of ownership on the existing loader is \$15,000/year. By switching to the three year buy back guarantee contract, the cost is lowered to \$13,500/year. This is a definite financial advantage.

Mr. Dunn also added that as of December 1, the state bid goes up another \$20,000 for the same loader so it is time to make the deal which is a very good deal.

Purchasing and Public Works request permission to utilize the Missouri Department of Transportation's cooperative contract number 3-120320RJ to purchase one (1) John Deere 544K High Lift Wheel Loader from Tri-State Construction Equipment Company of Ashland, MO and to trade-in one (1) 2007 Case 521D Rubber Tire Loader to the same vendor.

Total cost for the JD 544K Loader is \$143,000.00, less trade-in allowance for the 2007 Case Loader of \$28,500.00 for a grand total of \$114,500.00 and will be paid from department 2040 – Public Works Maintenance Operations, account 92300 - Replacement Machinery & Equipment. This agreement also includes a 3YR/1500 HR guaranteed buy-back option of \$102,000.00 that is available to the County.
