Sheriff's Department

9. First reading; Approval of MoDOT Traffic Safety Grant Application

Captain Martin said that the Sheriff's Department is requesting Commission approval for the grant application from the Missouri Department of Transportation Highway Safety Division. The department has been getting various pieces of this grant consisting of the Slow Down Operations, Hazardous Moving Violations, Youth Alcohol Enforcement and also it has been paying for a portion of the DWI unit.

Commissioner Atwill asked if there is any cost to the County and are there any matching funds.

Captain Martin said there are no new costs to the County and the salaries of the Traffic Unit are matched at 50%.

Commissioner Miller asked if the grant could be described in fuller detail.

Sergeant Leer said there are four different areas covered by the grant. The Full Time Unit pays 50% of the wages and benefits for two officers who are assigned to the DWI unit. This has been done since 2006. The Sobriety Check Points and DWI Saturation Patrols are funded providing for manpower costs and benefits for those officers as well as a dispatcher from Joint Communications and personnel from the jail to take care of any prisoners that are arrested. The Youth Alcohol Grant used for compliance checks and lastly the HMV Slowdown which is part of the Hazardous Moving Violation enforcement efforts done during overtime.

Commissioner Atwill asked about the amount for the four items outlined.

Sergeant Leer said that the HMV is \$27,736, the Youth Alcohol Enforcement about \$2,856, Sobriety Checkpoints around \$25,000 and the DWI around \$82,000 for a little over \$125,000.

Commissioner Atwill asked if there is any way to measure the effectiveness of these programs.

Sergeant Leer said that each year the application process requires justification through statistics. There has been a drop the last several years evidenced by only one fatal crash on County maintained roads this past year. We do track alcohol related crashes and have seen a steady decrease. These are tracked pretty closely. It is a combined effort along with the Highway Patrol, Columbia Police Department and enhanced engineering.

There were no additional comments or questions.

Commissioner Atwill stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

10. First reading; Budget Amendment for Master Trainer to come to Columbia to present K9 training

Captain Martin said the Sheriff's Department is requesting Commission approval for a budget amendment to cover costs and other fees and services to total \$956. There was an opportunity to have a trainer conduct a class here so we do not have to travel. The surrounding counties will be in attendance and will share in some of the costs. By not traveling, we will be saving several thousand dollars over the course of a three day class.

Commissioner Miller asked about the status of the K-9 trainer within the County.

Captain Martin said that individual has not yet met all the milestones for certification. It is an involved process. It is not going as fast as we would like, but we are getting closer.

There were no further comments or questions.

Commissioner Atwill said a second reading will occur after the mandatory 10 day waiting period for Budget Amendments.

15. Public Comment

John Donelon said he is here today to discuss an issue with Public Works. Several years ago, there was a water run-off problem with standing water in the streets. The County sent out two engineers to look at the problem and said that there shouldn't be the standing water in the street. They dug up the street and put in a huge drainage tube to catch the run-off.

Since then, specifically in May of 2013, I called Public Works because I was tired of having the water running through my yard because the repair done earlier was not working. An engineer was sent out the next day and said that something needed to be done. He said that they would need to ditch out the other side of the driveway where the pipe is that was put in several years ago because the water is not getting to this drainage pipe. That was May. In

July, the rains came and so did the water in my yard. Public Works was called again and the same engineer came out and said that I was on the list. Now with the snow melt, I have a yard full of water and my driveway has water as well and boots are needed to go to the mailbox. Instead of calling again, being almost a year of being on the list and nothing being done, I am here. I still have water and in a bad position because between my house and the house to the north, there is a spillway that goes to the pipe put in several years ago. The water coming down can't get to the drainage pipe through my ditch because it is full of silt.

It is not my job to dig it out. So I am not happy with Public Works who put me on list. I last called in September and was told to take a number and they will call. They never have called. The spring rains are coming. I have talked about this issue before when a car hydroplaned into my front yard because of all the water on Grace Lane. Originally, the engineer said that the water needed to get off the street because of possible overnight freezing.

Mr. Donelon said the problem still exists and he doesn't know what to do next.

Commissioner Atwill said the Commission will consult with Public Works to look into the matter further to see what needs to be done and someone will be in contact with him. The Commissioners thanked Mr. Donelon for coming and talking about this issue.
