The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m.

MoDOT

1. Draft Project List for Transportation Sales Tax for the August 5th ballot

Travis Koestner, Assistant District Engineer and Mike Schupp, area Engineers for MoDOT were present to update the Commission on the proposed projects for the area pending the Constitutional Amendment 7 Transportation Sales Tax on the August 5th ballot.

Mr. Koestner said that this is a review of what MoDOT's task has been with the upcoming Amendment 7 on the August ballot. We are making sure to get with the cities and counties to update them on the process. The task is to get a good project list together on the need for transportation. There is a need to identify the more important items from a long list by meeting with local planning groups about projects and working on that list which will be out for public comment this Friday at Noon. There is a comprehensive list for the Central District of MoDOT which will have \$486 million over a ten year period for the 18 counties. This will be for road, bridge and other needs in the area.

The first project will be the I-70 statewide project to make I-70 six lanes from St. Louis to Kansas City. Districts along the way will be contribution to some of the interchange work. The 63/70 connector will benefit as some of the costs for this will be included in the I-70

statewide project.

Commissioner Miller asked if it is a Constitutional Amendment to prohibit the legislature from adding any additional taxes and toll roads during the duration of the tax.

Mr. Koestner said that these Constitutional Amendments are the only way of appropriating the funds for MoDOT presently.

Locally, we have talked about the 63/70 connector. Other projects will include Stadium Blvd. extension up to WW but not all the way to I-70. Rumble strips, bigger shoulders and overlays on minor roads with heavier traffic. Those will include Route E, a bridge on Route F, a bridge on Hwy. 124 and some improvements on Hwy. 163. We are also looking at some ways to improve rural transit such as OATS as well as helping out at the Columbia Airport and Columbia transit.

As mentioned, the draft list will be out this Friday. There will be an open house in Columbia, at the ARC, on Monday, June 16th from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. After receiving all the public comment, there is a Highway Commission meeting scheduled in Jefferson City on June 25th to approve the final list which will be available to the public July 4th weekend in preparation for the August election.

The Commissioners thanked Mr. Koestner and Mr. Schupp for the update.
