The meeting was called to order at 1:32 p.m.

County Clerk

1. Public Hearing and 1st & 2nd reading; Approval of 2015 Boone County Tax Rates

Wendy Noren said that the public hearing today is on the first part of the proposed order which are property tax rates regarding General Revenue, Road & Bridge and Group Home. The Group Home levy was a voted levy, so the Commission has no control of that. It is voted and then meets the tax rate ceiling roll backs that the state Auditor's Office computes. That rate is .1146, the same as last year.

The county General Revenue and Road & Bridge are an annual computation of a tax rate ceiling for each rate based on the requirements of the Hancock Amendment and then an additional statute. The tax rate ceiling did not change this year. For the Road & Bridge, the ceiling was .2677 and for General Revenue, the ceiling was .3155. After the tax rate ceilings,

we apply sales tax roll backs and the sales tax roll back for the ½ cent General Sales Tax is 27.20. It was stated that the Commission would keep the voted sales tax levy for Road & Bridge at 5 cents. We actually are at 14.121 cents lower than what we statutorily can do. That is what the Commission offered to the voters that they would keep the Road & Bridge levy at 5 cents.

There were no questions for Ms. Noren at this time and Commission Atwill opened the public hearing and asked if there is anyone that would like to speak to the tax rate proposal. There were no speakers and Commission Atwill closed the public hearing.

There were no further comments.

Commissioner Thompson moved on this day the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby set the 2015 tax rates per hundred dollars of assessed valuation for county purposes as follows:

9. First reading; Vehicle Transfer – Boone County Sheriff's Department to Boone Count Joint Communications

Jenna Redel-Reed said this is a request from the Auditor that this transfer go on the Commission agenda because this is adding a vehicle to one of the Commission's staff and they did not want another elected official to be able to just transfer assets over to the Commission without their approval.

This is a request to transfer a 2015 Ford F150 Super Crew truck from the Sheriff's Department to Joint Communications. This will be for the new Director of Joint

Communications, Chad Martin, who came from the Sheriff's Department. With the departure of Chad Martin, the Sheriff has reorganized his department and no longer has the need for this truck so he has volunteered to transfer it over to Joint Communications for the Director to use.

The Commissioners thanked the Sheriff for his thoughtfulness and thinking about the needs of the County.

10. First reading; Request to Transfer Above ATS for the position of Senior Programmer Analyst

Jenna Redel-Reed said she is presenting this on behalf of Aron Gish who is out of town. This is a request to hire above the flexible transfer limit for James Barnes who is currently a web designer/senior programming analyst within the Information Technology Department. He has expressed interest in the open position as a dedicated senior programming analyst with the County Clerk's Office.

This position is important because the County Clerk has done all the programming for that department to this point and wants to transfer that knowledge to a dedicated IT staff member. James has eight years experience with the county and has worked with the County Clerk before, during elections. The requested salary for the ATS is \$70,387, a 7% increase.
