The meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m.

Proclamation

1. Proclamation recognizing October 2, 2015 as Manufacturing Day

Commissioner Thompson read the following proclamation:

Whereas, for generations, manufacturing has played a critical role in Missouri's diverse economy; and

Whereas, Missouri's more than 6,300 manufacturing companies produce everything from airplanes to barbecue sauce and automobiles to apparel; and

Whereas, Missouri's manufacturers employ nearly a quarter million Missourians, living in bustling urban areas to pastoral rural communities; and

Whereas, almost 400,000 more Missourians work in industries that support manufacturing or benefit from manufacturing employee spending; and

Whereas, manufacturing constitutes nearly 13 percent of the Gross State Product; and

Whereas, most manufacturing jobs include health care and retirement benefits; and

Whereas, the average annual manufacturing wage of more than \$62,000 exceeds the overall average annual wage by more than \$21,000; and

Whereas, manufacturing jobs enable Missouri families to realize the dreams of owning a home, sending a child to college and enjoying a secure retirement and manufacturers pay millions of dollars annually, supporting schools, law enforcement, emergency preparedness, public works and other essential services.

Therefore, the Boone County Commission does hereby declare October 2, 2015 as Manufacturing Day in Boone County. The Boone County Commission also commends the Missouri Enterprise and the Manufacturing Extension Partnership for the valuable technical and business assistance that they provide to our small- and medium-sized manufacturers and encourages all Missourians to show their support for our manufacturers by purchasing products made in Missouri and America.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, this 1st day of October, 2015.

Commissioner Atwill asked if there is anyone present that would like to address the Commission on this topic.

Dusty Cruise said he would like to thank the Boone County Commission for making this proclamation to support National Manufacturers Day and more importantly, the 95 manufacturing firms which employ approximately 3,800 people in Boone County. Boone County is one of 37 counties committing to making a similar proclamation in Missouri, so you truly stand proud to support Boone County manufacturing.

This week, there are events like this all over the nation. There are 2,087 events as of this morning. This is the 3rd year of the event. Each year the participation and momentum increases. The first year, 2013, there was approximately 830 events and as I said earlier, we are already at 2,087 this year.

Earlier this month, U.S. Commerce Secretary, Penny Pritzker, presented her vision for the path forward for innovation in U.S. manufacturing before a diverse group of private and public sector leaders. In that discussion, Secretary Pritzker discussed the innovation needed to secure Americas competitive edge in advancing manufacturing and strengthening the economic security of our workers and families. To summarize a part of her comments, she captured perfectly the state of today's manufacturing sector as an innovative, constantly evolving field that can build lasting careers and strong communities.

Prosecuting Attorney

10. First reading; 2016/2017 Victims of Crime Act Grant (VOCA) Application approval

Dan Knight said we respectfully request your approval to apply for a continuation of our Victims of Crime Act grant through the Department of Public Safety.

We have been receiving grant funds through VOCA since 1993, and continue to serve approximately 2800 victims of crime each year.

There is a very large increase in available VOCA funding this year. The 2014 award for Missouri was \$8.5 million and the estimated award for 2015 is \$36.7 million. This grant cycle is for 1 ½ years, April 1, 2016 – September 30, 2017.

Our application includes continued funding for our part time Case Specialist and funding for an additional Victim Specialist including the full salary, all benefits, computer, dual monitors, printer, scanner and software. We are also requesting training for our Domestic Violence Enforcement Unit, including 2 DOVE detectives from the Columbia Police Department, 1 DOVE detective from the Boone County Sheriff's Department and 1 DOVE advocate from True North. We are also requesting training for two prosecutors specializing in child abuse along with the advocates they work with.

There is a 20% matching requirement. The federal share is \$164,913.26 and the local match is \$41,236.51. The match is taken from the existing salary of our Victims Specialist, Jessica Watson.

There were no questions or comments.

13th Judicial Circuit

11. First reading; Fostering Court Improvement JCIP sub-grant application approval

Courtney Pulley said he is here today to request approval to apply for the Fostering Court Improvement JCIP sub-grant through OSCA. The grant is for \$1,000.

Angie Jaco said the money will be used to provide lunches for our monthly Fostering Court Improvement meetings and also the quarterly roundtable meetings with our contract attorneys and the Fostering Court Improvement. This grant has been significantly decreased from years past. The amount in previous years was \$3,000. With that, we were able to use some of that money for training during the year. We just found out, about two weeks ago, that the amount was being decreased to \$1,000.

We are looking at other funding sources to make up for this shortfall. At this point, we are budgeting for the \$1,000 with hopes to find additional monies. We have received this grant since 2007 and it is totally reimbursable to the county.

There were no questions or comments.

Commissioner Atwill stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

Human Resources

12. First reading; Adoption of rules for Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act compliance

Jenna Redel-Reed said that Human Resources is requesting the Commission adopt the rules and measures that are already in place within the County. They are definitions on how we classify someone as a full time employee as well as defining part time employees and what the accounting periods will be.

These are already in place, this just formally records them. The County Clerk and County Counselor have worked together to make sure the county was in compliance with the rules of

the ACA. The County Counselor has also taken the extra step to site the federal regulations for each rule to assure compliance. As indicated, nothing changes on how the county operates. This just documents the rules in case there are any questions.

There were no questions or comments.

Commissioner Atwill stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

Resource Management

13. Second reading; Vacation of a Drainage Easement located at Lot 4, Shalimar Gardens Block 1 (1st read 8-27-15)

Natalie Meighan said she was here before the Commission back in August when we looked at this lot in Shalimar Gardens that had a very odd shaped drainage easement. It was not functioning or even the right location at that time.

Since then, the land owner has secured a Conditional Use Permit. The plan has been approved and we had them submit the new easement for both the drainage easement and temporary construction easement with the adjoining neighbor to install the drainage structure. It has been approved by the engineering and legal folks. The paperwork has been prepared to be recorded as soon as the old one is vacated. They will be ready to go to the Recorder's Office. The owner has done everything we have asked them to do.

Boone does hereby vacate and release to the grantors an easement for drainage purposes in Shalimar Gardens, Block I, Lot 4 only, which was created by the document recorded in Book 637, page 41, Records of Boone County, Missouri, more particularly described as:

A 16 foot wide drainage easement located on Lot 4, the centerline is described as follows: Commencing at the NE corner of said Lot 4; thence with the northerly line of said Lot 4, S77°14' W, 60.0 feet to the point of beginning; thence S38°14'E, 129.05 feet to a point on the easterly line of said Lot 4 and also being the SW corner of Lot 3, said point being the end of this easement.

All other easements granted by that document recorded in Book 637, page 41, Records of Boone County, Missouri, shall remain in full force and effect.
