14. First reading; Adopt new War Memorial and the policy by which names will be added to that memorial

Commissioner Thompson said this policy reflects an understanding on how names can be added to the new War Memorial which honors the service of Boone County veterans in the Cold War, the War in Southwest Asia and the Global War on Terrorism, all three of which are on-going and open conflicts. This new monument not only has space, but is intended to allow for the inclusion of additional names if that becomes necessary.

The policy is such that it will recognize and honor those people who are veterans within the scope of the monument which means they were in service in one of these conflicts or any such other defined future conflict. They were a resident of Boone County at the time of entry into active duty or time of death and their death resulted from enemy action. That is something that is necessary because we don't want to minimize in any way or over shadow

in any way the sacrifice made by those whose names are included on the monument. Someone who has died as a result of enemy action has truly made the ultimate sacrifice. Someone who has died in service and died as a result of an accident or something else, that is not the intent of this monument.

The policy requires that those who are seeking to have a name added to the monument will provide documents to support those three prongs of eligibility. In fact, we have already spoken with two families who believe they have a family member that is eligible for inclusion on the monument.

Commissioner Miller noted that the families will need to provide documents from the Department of Veterans Affairs and the DD214 form.

Commissioner Thompson said the DD214 should provide the vast majority of the information that is needed. This is not a public document. The County can't seek out this document. It must be provided by the family and once received, the name can be added to the monument.

Commissioner Miller noted that Commissioner Thompson and County Counselor C. J. Dykhouse have worked with Dewey Riehn who was one of the designers of the Viet Nam War Memorial in Washington D. C. and came up with the eligibility definition.

Commissioner Thompson said this is consistent with the other war memorials.

Commissioner Atwill made reference to the form that would be completed for consideration of an addition to the monument.

Commissioner Thompson said that is correct and it can be obtained on the County web site.

There were no further comments or questions.

Commissioner Atwill stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

#### 16. Commissioner Reports

Commissioner Thompson said she was in Pettis County on Tuesday, the only other county in Missouri that is involved in the Stepping Up Initiative. They were undergoing the Sequential Intercept Mapping process for their county. It was a fascinating process and hopefully we will be able to do something similar. The process should be shortened here by the work done within the county over the past several months.

The collections of information and seeing which organizations, agencies and individuals are involved along the pipeline of a person's life and the possibilities of them becoming engaged with Law Enforcement or the Criminal Justice System.

What was interesting was seeing those that were doing the process and acknowledging that there is an intercept before the first intercept that is identified. It starts with intercept one, which is the first time that someone presents to Law Enforcement and are detained in some manner. There may be prior contact where someone may have had or is having psychiatric issues but has not done something that would rise to the level of criminal behavior. We have been calling it intercept zero and they acknowledge that this is an intercept zero.

Commissioner Miller noted the great work done by Commissioner Thompson and others and going to Pettis County was very beneficial because when our county writes the scope or mapping for our process, it can be better defined.

Commissioner Thompson said this will allow us to focus our attention on what we really need to do.
