The meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m.

Commissioner Atwill said that due to the impending ice storm, there is a scheduled conference call at 1:30 p.m. and we will make it part of this meeting which will be chaired by the Director of Emergency Management, Terry Cassil.

Terry Cassil identified those activities and institutions that are on the conference call and said this is a situation report on the winter storm and the icing which will occur as a result of that storm. The report from the National Weather Service has described the storm with a potential of ½" to ¾" of ice and we will be updated with a 2:30 p.m. conference call from them.

Mr. Cassil said that this could be a widespread event, possibly covering 90% of Missouri and if so, this could become a declarated event and the state could get reimbursed for expenses so it is very important that each entity track their expenses.

At present, we are in a preparedness mode and are getting word that some significant places are going to shut down on Friday. We ask that people get prepared by going out and getting essentials such as drugs, food and water now, not later, when they could hamper our crews

that may be out in these conditions. We also know the State Emergency Management Agency has activated their center.

Commissioner Atwill thanked Mr. Cassil for setting this up and knowing that we are prepared for any event that comes our way and if the County Commission can be of any assistance, please contact us.

Brian Treece said he would like to re-emphasize that planning and preparedness is essential and to stay home and off the roads if possible.

Mr. Cassil thanked all those on the call and said there will be another conference call scheduled for 10:00 a.m. tomorrow.

## 12. Commissioner Reports

Commissioner Parry said although there has been no attendance at the public hearings on the Building Code adoption, there seems to be a significant change in our Building Code as it relates to energy efficiency and building with 2x6's instead of 2x4's as well as the R-value of the insulation.

For the commercial and public buildings, it is written in the code that they will start building civil defense shelters. This is newly written into the code. The public did not attend any of the three meetings and it appears we are mimicking what the city has done. I don't know if this is going to come back to bite us when they see this is a new requirement within the Building Code.

Commissioner Thompson said they also had public hearings in the city which were well attended. As for the energy efficiency, ours got diminished somewhat from what the city wanted because of some input from folks in the county. There is a slight difference with the city. Dave Forward provided a diagram to go along with the code so people could better understand what it requires. The real issue was the energy efficiency in the roof area and where it intersects with the wall which resulted in using different size building pieces.
