The meeting was called to order at 1:35 p.m.

Purchasing

1. First reading; Bid Award 11-15FEB17 – Telephone Wiring Materials and Rack Hardware

Melinda Bobbitt read the following memo:

Request for Bid 11-15FEB17 – Telephone Wiring Materials and Rack Hardware closed on February 15, 2017. Three bids were received. Dave Dunford, our Radio Consultant, recommends award to Accu-Tech Corporation for offering an "all or none" award by the lowest and best bid. Total for initial order is \$16,874 and will be paid from department 4102 – ECC Backup Center, account 71231 – Owner Costs. \$589,000 is budgeted for the project.

This is also a term and supply contract for department 2704 – Joint Communications Radio Network, account 91300 – Machinery & Equipment. The Term and Supply contract period is March 1, 2017 through February 28, 2018 with four, one-year renewal periods.

2. First reading; Bid Award 09-14FEB17 - Antenna/Feedline Equipment

Request for Bid 09-14FEB17 – Antenna/Feedline Equipment closed on February 14, 2017. Three bids were received. Dave Dunford, our Radio Consultant, recommends award to RFI Americas, Inc. for offering the lowest and best bid. Total for initial order is \$10,059.19 and will be paid from department 2704 – Joint Communications Radio Network, account 91300 – Machinery & Equipment. \$185,980 is budgeted for 2017.

The Term and Supply contract period is March 1, 2017 through February 28, 2018 with four, one-year renewal periods.

10. First reading; Letter of Intent and Request for Proposals – Scaling Data Integration

Joint Communications

Kelly Wallis said she is requesting approval to submit a letter of intent and application for a Request for Proposal for Scaling Data Integration: Advancing Pay for Success, Systems Change, and Supportive Housing for Vulnerable, Justice-Involved Populations. If we are selected to receive this award, we would receive technical assistance to access and integrate data from the homeless and criminal justice system to target supportive housing in order to further coordinate between these systems.

The data would allow us to make decisions to effectively utilize our resources. In the long-run, it is an investment in efforts to capture dollars for future savings serving the individuals in the criminal justice system, those in need of housing and utilizing our social services in our community as well as the over-utilized emergency rooms.

The goal is to gather this data to see where we can make the most impact with the resources we have. It would also make us more competitive for applying for other funds on the state and federal levels. If we receive the bid, we would have the ability to produce the data they are looking for. They are asking, from the applicant who receives the award, \$50,000 in-kind, in staffing. That in-kind staffing would come from people like myself, the Human Services Manager at the City Health Department and we have received a letter of support from a researcher from the Department of Social Work at the University, that she would also contribute some in-kind staffing.

The commitment that we have is minimal compared to the benefit we would receive if selected. So, I am requesting approval to submit a letter of intent and application for a Request for Proposal.

Commissioner Thompson said if we are fortunate to receive this award, it will give us a leg up on seeing what we are doing and being more effective within our community. This will be granted to only four communities in the U.S., so we are trying to be as competitive as possible with our RFP, showing what we are doing already and where the needs are.

20. Public Comment

James Heuer said he is the owner of Heuer's Café and the reason he is commenting today is that the Health Department closed us down last week because the sewer system was not up to Boone County code. Since then, I have diligently worked on the inside and have signed an agreement with an engineer to come up with plans to bring my waste treatment system up to code.

I have contacted Master Tech Plumbing about building a waste treatment facility. They made me a good offer, doing the work pro-bono. They would finance the tanks and equipment with 12 months, no interest. A very generous offer.

I have also contacted Pro Pumping to pump my lagoon while I would be operating, if I were allowed to operate, while the work is being done. I know the Health Department would ask what I was doing with the wastewater and in talking to Pro Pumping, they would monitor and pump as needed.

The reason I am here today is to let you know this is going to happen. I will not be putting this off any longer. The engineer says he is about two weeks from completion. Master Tech is on board and is in contact with Allstate Consultants and have conversed with the Health Department. I will get this done this time. I was not trying to be defiant. The financing is a big issue with receiving big bids and for a small business owner like me, it was way out of my realm and thanks to Master Tech, coming through with their offer, it is now within my reach.

The Commissioners thanked Mr. Heuer for the update and hope that all goes well.

Tammy Heuer said this is the first time in 18 years they have been closed. We are open Christmas, Thanksgiving. Even when we are closed, people stop by and come in and eat for

free. We are never closed. These past nine days have been a financial strain and if much longer, we might not recover. The community support has been overwhelming. They have helped with painting, moving equipment, carpentry and have asked if there is anything they can do to help. They want us open and we are grateful for the help they have given.

Commissioner Thompson advised them to call Stephanie Browning at the Health Department.
