4. First reading; Budget Amendment for roof repair on the Johnson Building

Doug Coley said we have multiple leaks on the roof. We got a proposal last year for a portion of the roof and we put that in the budget for \$43,538. When we did the pre-bid conference several weeks ago, we had four roofing contractors and the union rep on the roof and it was noticed that the other portion needs repair as well and they showed me several soft spots.

It is one big roof and there is a metal portion and the original proposal was for this front portion. There is another portion that comes back to the alley and it is that part that had not been included in the 1st part. We are also looking at removing the tile. The tile is the old clay polished tile that was put on when the building was built. It makes no sense to leave it there when we have a new roof on one side.

Commissioner Atwill asked if this is included in the cost.

Mr. Coley said it is. Also, in the contract, there is a provision of \$8.50 sq. ft. if they have to replace the sheeting underneath. If there is a complete tear off to the plywood, and if pieces of plywood need replacing, there is an allowance for 10 sheets of plywood. This may be generous, but we are covered. Hopefully, we are in the range of \$15,000 and not \$17,000.

Commissioner Atwill asked if the metal roof is in good shape.

Mr. Coley said it is.

Commissioner Atwill asked if there are two phases, this one and the other part that was first bid.

Mr. Coley said the metal roof is okay. There is a portion from the metal roof that extends west and this was a section that was not included in the original proposal.

Commissioner Thompson said that we will be getting all of the roof, not just the front portion.

Mr. Coley said all but the metal portion.

There were no further comments or questions.

Commissioner Atwill stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.
