Proclamation

1. Proclamation honoring Marla Gunn

Commissioner Atwill read the following proclamation:

Whereas, since 1980 when Marla began her career with the 13th Judicial Circuit, the Boone County Courthouse has undergone two major renovations; and

Whereas, during her tenure, the courts have gone from an exclusive paper system to an all-electronic system for case processing and jury systems, including two state-wide software overhauls; and

Whereas, two internal databases had to be created to replicate the work Marla performed; and

Whereas, Marla has used her skills to communicate with countless members of the public and the bar to expedite timelines of cases, calm fears and provide information;

Therefore, we do hereby recognize the contributions of Marla Gunn to Boone County and honor her as she celebrates her retirement from the 13th Judicial Circuit.

2. Report: Status of Eclipse Planning and Expectations

Terry Cassil said he would like to start with some known information. We are told by the Convention and Visitors Bureau that hotels are at 65% occupancy for Saturday, 95% for Sunday and 75% for Monday. We are looking at a pretty good influx of people for Saturday and Sunday. There is an estimated influx, they are telling us, somewhere between 25,000 and 100,000 people into Boone County.

All OEM staff will be in service throughout the weekend and there are plans to open the OEM Center at 8:00 a.m. Monday morning and we will open it sooner if our partners see the need. We had a conference call at 9:30 a.m. this morning with all the stakeholders. We only have a very few that are planning on coming in Monday, but they all have contingency plans, resource and personnel wise as things ramp up.

Unknown is the impact of the drive-in visitors. We don't know how many will be driving in for the event. Also, we don't know the actual locations of the large, private events. We know about some local events in the community. Cosmo Park, Woodstock in the south part of the city and Gans Creek, where most of the scientific people will be gathered. Cosmo Park is expecting 5,000 plus, Woodstock 3,000 plus and we have not received any numbers from Rocheport.

Other things are assumptions that we have to rely on. The large crunch time will be the 4 hours after totality happens. We feel the event will follow the flow like the Mizzou football games. Traffic will be the biggest thing we will be looking at during this time.

Weather will also be a consideration. Based on weather models, we could experience any type of weather. If it is clear here and cloudy at adjacent areas, we could have those people coming in. The reverse could also be in effect, cloudy weather here and people will leave for other destinations.

Another concern is the movement of emergency responders which could be hampered during this time with traffic. In the meeting this morning, MoDOT and our Public Works people are working with electronic signs on the highways and watching the traffic. MoDOT is putting six extra units out that will be on I-70 and US 63 looking for those with flat tires or out of gas. The Missouri Highway Patrol has suspended all vacations and will have someone posted every 20 miles on I-70 and US 63.

We will be putting out two press releases this afternoon from our office. The first relates to safety tips like wear the glasses and pull over while driving to view the eclipse. The second release concerns what our office is doing for coordination of the event.

Commissioner Parry asked what will be done about traffic stopping on I-70 and US 63 during the actual totality.

Mr. Cassil said that they are going to try and discourage that from happening. A lot of electronic signs are already up concerning that issue. These signs can be updated by MoDOT from a laptop or cell phone. If a wreck occurs, they can adjust the signs and re-route traffic that way. They will also be using the radio stations to put out this message as well. As we know, where 70 and 63 come together, we can have an incident at any time, bringing both to a stop.

Commissioner Thompson asked about the traffic, similar to the end of football games, and this timing of leaving after totality, which will be right about the time of first dismissal for the Columbia Public Schools.

Mr. Cassil said that CPS was on the conference call this morning and they have contingency plans in place, specifically having extra bottles of water and coolers on the busses in case of delays. The parents have also been notified of possible delays.

Commissioner Thompson said, secondly, I had a conversation last week with an elected official in St. Joseph at the MAC board meeting and she said that MoDOT, up there, is putting port-a-pots on the side of the highways. They are making sure that various first responders that are stationed around have extra insulin and things like that. Has there been any discussion like that?

Mr. Cassil said that MoDOT did not mention that, but we can make a call about this being done in other areas and to see about a solution for here. Just because they did not say anything on the call, does not mean they aren't doing it. Also, the emergency responders, fire and EMS, were on the call this morning and they are putting extra ambulances on the road and staging them around the community to make travel to a scene much easier.

Commissioner Atwill asked about the steps, if any, that local fire and law enforcement have taken to prepare for the event.

Mr. Cassil said the Boone County Fire Protection District has put out a call for volunteers to man the various stations around the county and the Columbia Fire Department has a couple of extra units on standby. The Boone County Sheriff's Department has six extra units on during this time and the Columbia Police Department is putting units at Woodstock and Cosmo Park.

Commissioner Atwill asked if there is anything else the County Commission should do to help the public prepare for this event.

Mr. Cassil said just to be safe; driving and viewing the eclipse.

The Commissioners thanked Mr. Cassil for his report concerning the event for Monday.

3. First reading; Bid Award 33-29JUN17 – Radio Advertising for Joint Communications

Melinda Bobbitt read the following memo:

Request for Bid 33-29JUN17 – Radio Advertising for Joint Communications closed on June 29, 2017. Four bids were received. Chad Martin, Director of Joint Communications recommends award to two vendors in order to provide a variety of options: Cumulus Media, Inc. of Columbia, Missouri and Zimmer Radio of Mid-Missouri, Inc. of Columbia, Missouri. Mix Country 96 of Mexico, Missouri was non-responsive due to not submitting our Response Form and Winstar Interactive Media, Inc. of Houston, Texas was non-responsive for submitting a digital advertising rather than radio advertising bid.

These are Term and Supply contracts and invoices will be paid from department 2701 – Joint Communications Operations, account 84300 – Advertising. \$2,500 is budgeted for 2017.

Commissioner Parry said he will be recusing himself from the second reading vote due to his relationship with Zimmer Broadcasting.

Community Services

7. First reading; Memorandum of Understanding between Boone County and Corporation for Supportive Housing (CSH)

Kelly Wallis said Boone County was selected for a grant from the Corporation for Supportive Housing to develop a data integration tool to integrate homelessness and criminal justice data. This MOU is between Boone County and CHS and describes the responsibilities of the county to collaborate with the Corporation in support of this tool and to target individuals for supportive housing and explore "Pay for Success" programs which would expand supportive housing in our community.

Commissioner Parry asked if CHS is a national organization.

Ms. Wallis said it is.

Once it is created, it is copyrighted by them and belongs to them. We will have on-going access and use for our community.
