2. First reading; Bid Award 01-26JAN18 – Ford Interceptor 2018 Pursuit Utility Vehicles

Liz Palazzolo read the following memo:

Request for Bid 01-26JAN18 solicited bids for Ford Interceptor 2018 Pursuit Utility Vehicles for the Boone County Sheriff's Department. Three bids were received and reviewed. The bid tabulation and evaluation documentation follow this memo.

The lowest and best bid is from Republic Ford of Republic, Missouri for all three vehicle configurations. The Sheriff's Department concurs with an award to Republic Ford.

The contract will run from Date of Award through 12/31/18.

Payments for services will be paid from the following funds/accounts:

- Fund 2901, Sheriff Operations LE Sales Tax/Account 92400 Replacement Auto/Trucks, for 9 vehicles Total: \$ 268,362.00
- Fund 2902, Corrections LE Sales Tax/Account 92400 Replacement Auto/Trucks, for 1 vehicle – Total: \$ 29,798.00

Facilities Maintenance requests permission to utilize the City of Columbia cooperative contract 11/2018 to purchase small interior construction services from Professional Contractors and Engineers, Inc.

4. First reading; Bid Award 02-08FEB18 – Street Rehab, 2018 Lake of the Woods Subdivision

02-08FEB18 - Street Rehab – 2018 Lake of the Woods Subdivision opened on February 8, 2018. Five (5) bids were received.

Resource Management recommends award by low bid to Christensen Construction Company of Columbia, Missouri.

Cost of the contract is \$643,964.69. There will be a 10% contingency of \$64,396.47 added for a Purchase Order total of \$708,361.16 which will be paid from department 2041 – Infrastructure Preservation and Rehab, account 71202 – Contractor Costs. The engineer's estimate was \$854,906.25

6. First reading; Contract for Child Permanency Services with Family Facets

Mary Epping said they were awarded a grant through Children's Services. The court has worked to develop a program for reunifying children ages 0-2 with their parents more quickly.

Sheriff's Department

8. First reading; Cooperative Agreement for K-9 Basic Training Services with Clinton County Sheriff, Moniteau County Sheriff, and Brookfield Police Dept.

Captain German said the Clinton and Moniteau contracts are for re-training with a new dog. We need to go through the process to make sure they are up to our standards. The Brookfield contract is a maintenance contract.

Commissioner Atwill asked if dogs require certain characteristics.

Captain German said they look at six different things in the evaluation process. We also contact, in some instances, the master trainer for additional insight.

Commissioner Atwill asked if it would be to disruptive if the Commission came out to see the process.

Captain German said that can be arranged.

Commissioner Thompson said she knew Cathy Schiltz when she was doing dog training with Task Force One. In the contracts, it mentions the search piece as well as the narcotics piece. When evaluating a dog, is there a difference in the training, for instance is cadaver training different than search and rescue?

Captain German said we don't do the cadaver training. When we first started, we took an approach where the dog would be at an aggressive alert and we have progressed to a more passive alert, where the dog is sitting. We are now working on bomb detection training as we try to develop that skill.

Commissioner Thompson inquired about training concerning fentanyl. It is not just affecting the officers, dogs are dying. What is the training for this.

Captain German said we fortunately have not run into the level experienced elsewhere although it will make its way here. We are evaluating at present. We can possibly do roadside test with the dog for a narcotics check.

Commissioner Thompson asked if they keep Narcan for the roadside tests.

Captain German said at present, they do not.

Commissioner Thompson said that if this does occur, you will need the Narcan.

Captain German said that is correct.

There were no further comments or questions.
