Proclamation

1. Proclamation recognizing April, 2018 as Autism Awareness Month

Commissioner Atwill read the following proclamation:

Whereas, more than 3.5 million people nationwide have autism spectrum disorder; and

Whereas, 1 in 68 children born in 2018 will be diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder; and

Whereas, the need for increased support, resources and services for families and people with autism grows every year as more people are diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder; and

Whereas, individuals with autism share with all individuals the desire to achieve personal success through education, meaningful work and family and community involvement and individuals with autism, along with their families, friends, neighbors and co-workers, recognize the importance of focusing on the abilities of

all people and encourage others to do the same; and

Whereas, the most effective way to increase this focus is through active awareness activities and participation in community life and openness to each individual's contribution; and

Whereas, opportunities for citizens with autism to participate fully must be fostered in our community through a commitment to recognizing the strengths and values of every person and the capability of every person to make important contributions to our community if given the opportunity; and

Whereas, we encourage all citizens to support opportunities for individuals with autism in our community, which includes full access to education, housing, employment and recreational activities.

Therefore, we, the Boone County Commission, do hereby proclaim April 2018 as Autism Awareness Month in the County of Boone, Missouri, recognizing the importance of individuals of all abilities to our community and that our community is stronger when everyone participates.

Becky S. Gerdes, Christine Smith, and Nathan Hurst were present to accept the proclamation presented by Commissioner Atwill.

Becky S. Gerdes said that on behalf of the Thompson Center for Autism and all of our community partners, I would like to take this opportunity to focus on the awareness of those families in need and hope they are welcome and this proclamation goes a long way towards that goal here in Boone County.

Commissioner Thompson said one of her favorite stories centers around an individual who is on the autism spectrum and a client of Boone County Family Resources. One of the things he does is ride horses. I received a call from the instructor who said she wanted to get him qualified for the United Professional Horsemen's Association Exceptional Finals Challenge Cup and he would need to know how to post to trot. I went to talk to him and realized that his abilities were such that he learned how to past the trot faster than anyone I could have found. It was how his brain worked. I just explained the details, it was some thing mechanical and he got it. Something that took me close to one year, took him five minutes. It was a great experience.

Total cost of contract is \$20,767.00 and will be paid from department 1241 – Juvenile Office, account 92400 – Replacement Auto / Trucks. \$26,000.00 was budgeted for this vehicle.

3. First reading; Cooperative Contract - Radio Tower

Melinda Bobbitt read the following memo:

Dave Dunford, Radio Consultant for Boone County, requests that Boone County Joint Communications utilize the NASPO Value-Point cooperative contract 05715 to purchase a 180' Sabre Model S3R Self-Supporting Radio Tower from Sabre Communications Corporation of Sioux City, Iowa.

Cost is \$54,609.05 and invoice will be paid from department 2706 – Radio Network Improvements, account 91300 – Machinery & Equipment. The budget for the Boone County Barn (BCB) tower site project is \$504,194.00.

4. First reading; Purchase a monitor using Class 9 funding

Greg Edington said at present, we have an old CRT, 1950 vintage, and want to use a PC hookup to our "snow fighter app" in the winter months. This will improve operations and let the guys know where those on the previous shift have been. They will no longer have to come up from and look at someone's PC. We will utilize cost savings from another Class 9 account and prepare a Budget Revision which will not need to come before Commission due to the amount.
