The meeting was called to order at 1:31 p.m.

Health Department

1. First Reading; Cooperative Agreement: Boone County & City of Columbia Public Health Services

Scott Clardy explained this is the annual agreement between Boone County and the City of Columbia for Public Health Services for residents in the County but outside City limits, in the amount of \$1,271,878. That is a 1.4 percent increase over last year's contract. Services provided include immunizations, environmental health services such as with food establishments, on-site sewage ordinance, medication assistance.

Commissioner Atwill asked what the time period was for the contract.

Clardy said it is for the calendar year of 2019. There was a \$12,000 error in the amount, so it had to be corrected and sent back through the appropriate channels before getting it in front of Commission. That was the cause in the delay; however, services were still being provided.

Commissioner Atwill asked if the other Commissioners knew where the funding came from for the what the County provides.

Commissioner Parry said he thought it came from General Revenue.

There were no more comments or questions from the Commission.

Commissioner Atwill stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

Community Services

2. First Reading; Purchase of Service Contract: Cora Community Outreach

Kelly Wallis explained that Cora Community Outreach submitted a strategic opportunity proposal to the Children's Services Board some time ago. They provide out-of-school programming, specifically for athletes. They are currently located in Battle High School. The athletes they serve are considered high-risk, meaning they are struggling with things such as grades and living situations. The services they provide are for the hours when the students are out of school and include tutoring, mentoring, meals, etc. The schools were seeing the impact of this program on their students and wanted to expand into other schools. Cora has the opportunity to expand the program into Rock Bridge, so they submitted a proposal to Children's Services for service provision.

Commissioner Parry asked how many students were involved.

Wallis said she did not have that information with her. However, at the Battle location, they consistently have 30 to 40 children showing up on a regular basis. This organization is really

small right now. So small, in fact, that they have been fundraising their own salaries. For Children's Services it is more a pilot project that will be evaluated to see the outcomes.

Commissioner Parry asked if the Children's Services Board had already approved this.

Wallis said yes.

Commissioner Atwill asked if there was a flyer of what it is the organization does.

Wallis said they might have one but that is not something she has. They have filled out a full application form.

There were no more comments or questions from the Commission.
