Purchasing requests permission to use contract NCPA-01-97, the Synnex Advanced Technology Solutions Aggregator contract for the purchase of GETAC brand In-Car Video Recording and Body Camera System Products, Services and Support for the Boone County Sheriff's Department. 4. First Reading; Budget Amendment: Increase funds for Strategic Innovation
Opportunity request to assist with the Ranken College Central Satellite Campus in
the Ashland area

Joanne Nelson explained this was a request to add \$100,000 to the budget for the Ranken College project.

Commissioner Thompson asked if this was coming from the Community Health Fund.

Nelson said yes. Ranken will provide training for CNAs as well as Nursing, which will be of great use to the community health during this time.

Commissioner Thompson asked if this was going towards building the facility.

Nelson said yes. It is the matching portion they need.

Commissioner Atwill stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk to schedule this item for a second reading at the next available commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

5. First Reading; Budget Amendment: Increase funds to cover emergency health funding requests due to the COVID-19 pandemic

Joanne Nelson explained this was to request to increase funds to cover some health needs that may arise in the future due to COVID-19. Some emergency applications for mental health services have already come in for adult mental health services but there are also some that may come up that they do not know about yet.

#### **Human Resources**

6. First & Second Reading; Request to extend training period for position 163, Senior Administrative Assistant, County Clerk's Office

Angela Wehmeyer explained that the Senior Administrative Assistant for the County Clerk's Office will be retiring this year and the Clerk's Office is requesting an extended training period beyond the normal two weeks for the replacement of her position. It is expected to have no more than a 6-week overlap period.

Commissioner Parry moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve a request for an extended employee overlap/training period, in excess of the ordinary 'Two -Week Training Period for New Employees' as approved in Commission Order 147-2005, for position 163, Senior Administrative Assistant, County Clerk's Office. ### 7. First & Second Reading; Job Classification Committee Recommendations

All of these changes will take affect on January 1, 2021.

Commissioner Thompson moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby adopt the recommendations of the Job Classification Committee and authorizes Human Resources and the Auditor's Office to change the pay range assigned to job classification 305200 Custodian to Range 18, the pay range assigned to job classification 304500 Grounds Maintenance Worker I to Range 18, and the pay range assigned to job classification 104400 Senior Programmer Analyst to Range 50, effective January 1, 2021.

#### Commission

8. First & Second Reading; Authorizing and ratifying a Federal Funding Certification for CARES Act funding from the State of Missouri

Commissioner Atwill said this is what was submitted last week to authorize the State to issue funding to the County, which has been issued as of yesterday. This involves around 21 million dollars to be managed by the County. These are federal funds that came with only basic rules that involve determining if funds being requested are related to COVID-19. Today, a new set of rules have come in which further defines the County's duties and obligations with respect to use of these funds.

Commissioner Thompson said, as they have discussed before, getting these funds disbursed is not a question of doing it quickly, rather doing it mindfully and appropriately and hopefully with more guidance from the Treasury Department.

Commissioner Atwill said future rules will also need to be followed and there will need to be a lot of accounting done to ensure things are in line for the future audit.

There were no more comments or questions from the Commission,

Commissioner Atwill moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby authorize and ratify the Federal Funding Certification to the State Treasurer's Office to facilitate the transfer of Federal CARES Act funding from the State of Missouri to the County of Boone. The terms of the Federal Funding Certification are attached to this Order and the Presiding Commissioner is authorized to execute said Certification on behalf of Boone County.

I hope things have been going well for you and you're staying safe during this unprecedented time!

As you know, I am now in a new position with <u>SAFE Project</u> whose mission it is to help communities respond to the impacts of substance use disorder. I really wanted to connect with you because the DEA postponed its April Drug Take Back Day due to COVID-19. In response, SAFE Project teamed up with Deterra, creator of the Deterra® Drug Deactivation and Disposal System, the only safe and permanent method of at-home drug disposal, to rid the country of nearly 500,000 prescription and over-the-counter medications and give households an alternative way of disposing their prescription drugs.

We know that many young people first access drugs from medicine cabinets in their own homes. And, while people are hunkering down in quarantine and cleaning out their closets and basements, we can also encourage them to take a look in their medicine cabinets! The At-Home Medication Disposal campaign runs through Sunday, May 16th (Prevention Week). Households across the US can go online to <a href="DeterraSystem.com/SAFE">DeterraSystem.com/SAFE</a> and request a large Deterra Pouch to be sent directly to their home, free of charge. I'm also able to facilitate sending a bulk of these pouches to be delivered to a community site for local dissemination. For example, we've recently worked closely with the city of St. Louis to provide pouches at COVID-19 testing locations and it could be an opportunity to also offer pouches to parents picking up free student breakfast/lunches at schools.

Please let me know if there is an opportunity for Boone County to share this information with residents either via social media or if we can coordinate on getting you a bulk of pouches to be distributed across various sites in the county for resident pick-up.
