6. First Reading; Cooperative Agreement: Radio Consultant Services, City of Columbia – Columbia Airport

Joint Communications is having interference issues with one of the channels for public safety and the airport has a frequency Joint can use. At the same time, the airport has been having trouble with some coverage inside the building and Joint staff would be able to help with that. This agreement would help both entities. The airport will receive radio signals from Joint's network, and it will allow the airport to assign its existing frequency to Joint to fix its network problem.

Commissioner Parry asked about the fiscal impact of this.

Martin explained it was proposed to use existing equipment Joint has, so there would be no cost there.
