The meeting was called to order at 1:30pm and roll call was taken.

#### Commission

# 1. Proclamation: National Emergency Telecommunicators Week

Commissioner Kendrick stated he knows the staff of Joint Communications have faced many challenges, two of them are being short-staffed and worked hard. Commissioner Kendrick stated this team really pulled together when they had the additional stress and pressure recently when there were system issues. Commissioner Kendrick stated the Commissioners like to think their jobs are important at times, but they aren't saving lives. The team at Joint Communications is saving lives. Commissioner Kendrick stated Joint Communications is the first point of contact for critical and life-altering situations. Commissioner Kendrick stated, without the team at Joint Communications being there to take the calls. There would be devastating consequences. Commissioner Kendrick stated the citizens of Boone County owe Joint Communications a

tremendous amount of gratitude and a tremendous amount of respect for what they are asked to do every day. Commissioner Kendrick stated he knows it is not an easy job, even under the best circumstances, but the staff at Joint Communications answers the calls with grace and he truly appreciates it.

Commissioner Aldred read the following Proclamation:

- Whereas, emergencies, which can occur at any time, require law enforcement, fire, and/or emergency medical services; and
- Whereas, Public Safety Emergency Telecommunicators are the first and most critical contact our citizens have with emergency services, and are thus the first level of "first responders"; and
- Whereas, when an emergency occurs, the prompt response of first responders, including law enforcement, firefighters, and emergency medical technicians, is critical to the protection of life and preservation of property; and
- Whereas, the safety of first responders is dependent upon the quality of information obtained from citizens who contact Boone County Joint Communications; and
- Whereas, Public Safety Emergency Telecommunicators are the single vital link for our first responders by monitoring their activities by radio, providing them information, and ensuring their safety; and
- Whereas, in 2022, Public Safety Emergency Telecommunicators of Boone County Joint Communications fielded 78,090 emergency calls and 142,711 non-emergency calls, for a total of 220,801 calls over the course of just one year; and
- Whereas, in 2022, Public Safety Emergency Telecommunicators of Boone County Joint Communications handled 238,515 law enforcement dispatches; 21,839 fire dispatches; and 31,865 medical dispatches; and
- Whereas, Public Safety Emergency Telecommunicators of Boone County Joint Communications have contributed substantially to the apprehension of criminals, suppression of fires, and treatment of patients; and
- Whereas, all Public Safety Emergency Telecommunicators have exhibited compassion, understanding, and professionalism during the performance of their jobs in the past year.
- Therefore, in honor of the men and women whose diligence, professionalism, and sense of duty help to keep the citizens of and visitors to Boone County safe, the Boone County Commission recognizes the week of April 9 through April 15, 2023, as National Public Safety Emergency Telecommunicators Week. On behalf of the citizens of

Boone County, the Commission shares its sincere appreciation to the dedicated individuals who comprise Boone County Joint Communications.

#### **Human Resources**

2. First and Second Reading: Request to hire above Flexible Hiring Rate (FHR) – Position 176 – Detention Officer

Director of Human Resources Angela Wehmeyer stated this request is for a previous employee who served Boone County as a Deputy Sheriff and is now returning as a Detention Officer. Director Wehmeyer stated this candidate left his position six months ago and they are now wanting to bring him back at the same rate of pay that he left at.

Commissioner Aldred moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve a request to hire above the flexible hiring maximum for position number 176, Detention Officer, and does hereby authorize an appropriation of \$25.89 per hour for the salary of said position.

3. First and Second Reading: Request to hire above Flexible Hiring Rate (FHR) – Position 706 – GIS Technician II

Director of Human Resources Angela Wehmeyer stated this is a new position. This candidate is extremely qualified, possessing four years of relevant experience and a Master of Science in Aquatic Ecosystems, which will help the Stormwater Department. Director Wehmeyer stated there are funds available for this request and will not have any impacts on other salaries.

Commissioner Aldred moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve a request to hire above the flexible hiring maximum for position number 706, GIS Technician II, and does hereby authorize an appropriation of \$26.15 per hour for the salary of said position.

Director of Human Resources Angela Wehmeyer stated this request is a little different because this candidate is a current Boone County employee. Director Wehmeyer stated this candidate has served as the Deputy Director of Emergency Management since 2020, he has over twenty years of experience in law enforcement and public service, and the requested salary is in line with where that of the other Directors. Commissioner Kendrick stated the Mr. Kelley is currently on the phone and the Commission is excited to have him step up into this role.

Commissioner Aldred moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve the request to transfer above the authorized transfer salary for position number 880, Director, Emergency Management, and does hereby authorize an appropriation of \$93,000.00 for the salary of said position.
