### Sheriff's Department

1. First and Second Reading: 2024 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Open Public Hearing

Contract C000681 (37-08sep23) -ARPA Contract Administration Services was approved by commission for award to FORVIS, LLP on November 2, 2023, commission order 503-2023.

This amendment increases the not-to-exceed total for contract administration services by \$250,000, making the new not-to-exceed contract total \$470,000.

Invoices will be paid from department 2983 - American Rescue Plan Act, account 71101 - Professional Services. There is \$2,010,273 of unencumbered funds in the account at this time.

The Order, Certificate of Final Terms, Continuing Disclosure Undertaking, Federal Tax Certificate, Official Statement, Paying Agent Agreement, County's Closing Certificate, Uniform Facsimile Signature Affidavit, and other documents prepared by bond counsel are incorporated herein by reference.

The Presiding Commissioner and other appropriate county officials are authorized to execute said documents and any other documents reasonably necessary to effectuate this bond issuance.

9. Update from Boone County Joint Communications on NextGen911

Director Christie Davis stated she has added NextGen911 to her 2025 budget, which will allow the capability of having more accurate routing. Director Davis stated currently with enhanced 911 the call is routed from the first cell tower hit, regardless of where the actual GPS location is. Director Davis stated NextGen911 will give the capability to use geospatial routing, which results in more accurate routing.

10. Update from Emergency Management on potential future flooding response

Deputy Director of Emergency Management Jake Waller stated they have purchased mechanical sandbagging machines, which will improve how they do a flood fight on the Missouri river. Deputy Director Waller stated filling sandbags is a labor intensive and manual process that takes several hundred volunteers. Deputy Director Waller stated the sandbag machines will make things more efficient and will increase the ability to build sandbag levies quickly.
