The meeting was called to order at 1:30 p.m. and roll call was taken.

Commission

1. Proclamation Recognizing the Bicentennial Celebration of Rocheport, Missouri Commissioner Aldred read the following proclamation:

Whereas, in 1825, the city of Rocheport, Missouri, was founded at the convergence of the Missouri River and Moniteau Creek, a location that made it an ideal trading post for settlers and Native Americans; and

Whereas, by 1837, Rocheport boasted eight stores and had become an important landing place and ferry crossing for the Boonslick region, offering travelers a means to cross the river without delay as they traveled from eastern to western parts of Missouri; and

Whereas, Rocheport had become the largest shipping point between St. Louis and St. Joseph by the 1850s, with exports of wheat, corn, tobacco and hemp supporting the burgeoning community, in addition to the sale of ice, cut from the Missouri River and Moniteau Creek; and

Whereas, the Civil War wreaked havoc on the small town, subjecting it to frequent guerrilla raids by both the Union and the Confederacy, one even resulting in the burning of one of Rocheport's business blocks and its public school building; and

Whereas, with the rebuilding of Rocheport following the Civil War came the Columbia-Rocheport turnpike in 1867, the Rocheport academy in 1868, one of the first rural telephone lines in Missouri, going from Columbia to Rocheport, in 1878, and the first newspaper, The Times, published from 1868-1869; and

Whereas, the proximity of Rocheport to the river proved to be both a blessing and a curse, as it not only provided jobs, prosperity, and a means for imports and exports, but also exposed the residents to contagious diseases and put the town at risk for floods, about a dozen of which happened between 1844 and 1995; and

Whereas, in 1892 the Missouri, Kansas, & Texas Railroad (MKT or Katy) was built through the town, remaining active until 1986, after which it became the Katy Trail, the longest rails-to-trail project, spanning a total of 225 miles across Missouri; and

Whereas, in 1976, Rocheport qualified as a historic district on the National Register of Historic Places, earning its well-deserved moniker, "Historic Rocheport," Missouri; and

Whereas, in the 200 years since its founding, Rocheport has managed to keep the same calm, peaceful presence and small-town charm, offering a wide variety of places, activities and events to experience while still enjoying the gorgeous Katy Trail, the historic architecture of the area, and the natural beauty of the Missouri River.

Therefore,

the Boone County Commission does hereby recognize the Bicentennial Celebration of Rocheport, Missouri, by honoring the history of the town and the spirit of the community.

Commissioner Thompson moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby enter into the record the Proclamation Recognizing the Bicentennial Celebration of Rocheport, Missouri.

Commissioner Aldred seconded the motion. The motion carried 3 to 0. **Order #318-2025**

Boone County Sheriff's Office

2. First and Second Reading: Howard County K-9 Maintenance Training Agreement

Captain Brian Leer stated this is an agreement to train Howard County's K-9 and handler, including not less than twenty sessions from June 2025 – June 2026. Captain Leer stated, if approved, Howard County would pay Boone County \$2,000.

Commissioner Aldred moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve the attached K-9 Maintenance Training Agreement between Boone County and the Howard County Sheriff.

The terms of the Agreement are set out in the attached and the Presiding Commissioner is authorized to sign said Agreement.

Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. The motion carried 3 to 0. **Order #319-2025**

3. First and Second Reading: City of St. Charles K-9 Basic Training Agreement

Captain Brian Leer stated this is an agreement to train the K-9 and handler for the City of St. Charles Fire District, which is a new partner. It would be a four-week training and, if approved, the City of St. Charles would pay Boone County \$2,000.

Commissioner Thompson moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve the attached K-9 Basic Training Agreement between Boone County and the City of St. Charles.

The terms of the Agreement are set out in the attached and the Presiding Commissioner is authorized to sign said Agreement.

Commissioner Aldred seconded the motion. The motion carried 3 to 0. **Order #320-2025**

4. First and Second Reading: Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Agreement

Captain Brian Leer stated this agreement is with the MU Police Department. Captain Leer stated there are no financial obligations for the County in this agreement, and Boone County retains management of their personnel throughout any mutual aid response that may occur. Captain Leer stated this agreement is being put in place to help meet the CALEA standard 2.1.3.

Commissioner Aldred moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve the attached Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Agreement between Boone County and the University of Missouri.

The terms of the Agreement are set out in the attached and the Presiding Commissioner is authorized to sign said Agreement.

Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. The motion carried 3 to 0. **Order #321-2025**

5. First and Second Reading: Law Enforcement Services Agreement with the City of Sturgeon

Captain Brian Leer stated the City of Sturgeon has approached the Boone County Sheriff's Office with concerns while looking at the future of their police department. Captain Leer stated the City of Sturgeon has decided to enter into an agreement with the Boone County Sheriff's Office for law enforcement services, which is like an extra-duty employment-type of agreement in which the City of Sturgeon agrees to pay Boone County Sheriff's Office personnel the established rate to go to Sturgeon and work for as many hours as they see fit. Captain Leer stated this will maintain additional services within Sturgeon.

Commissioner Thompson moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve the attached Law Enforcement Services Agreement between Boone County and the City of Sturgeon.

The terms of the Agreement are set out in the attached and the Presiding Commissioner is authorized to sign said Agreement.

Commissioner Aldred seconded the motion. The motion carried 3 to 0. **Order** #322-2025

Boone County Prosecuting Attorney's Office

6. First and Second Reading: Consultant Agreement with Sue Boresi

Boone County Prosecuting Attorney Roger Johnson stated this contract is to have Sue Boresi as contract counsel on three homicide cases. Prosecutor Johnson stated Ms. Boresi retired last week and the loss of her experience left their department with a substantially decreased capacity, especially for homicide cases. Prosecutor Johnson stated they have been exploring contracts as a possible way to increase their capacity, especially with homicide cases. Prosecutor Johnson stated this is their first try with this.

Commissioner Aldred moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve the attached Legal Services Agreement between Boone County and Sue Boresi.

The terms of the Agreement are set out in the attached and the Presiding Commissioner is authorized to sign said Agreement.

Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. The motion carried 3 to 0. **Order #323-2025**

7. First and Second Reading: Request to Transfer Above Authorized Transfer Salary for Position 201, First Assistant Prosecuting Attorney

Boone County Prosecuting Attorney Roger Johnson stated this request is to hire Melissa Buchanan as a First Assistant Prosecutor. Prosecutor Johnson stated Melissa has had great experience throughout her career and will bring a lot of enthusiasm and a fresh perspective to the leadership team.

Commissioner Thompson moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve a request to transfer above the Authorized Transfer Salary for position number 201, First Assistant Prosecuting Attorney, and does hereby authorize an appropriation of \$102,003.20 for the salary of said position.

Commissioner Aldred seconded the motion. The motion carried 3 to 0. **Order** #324-2025

8. First and Second Reading: Application to apply for a federal grant - U.S. Department of Justice Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) for Fiscal Year 2025 Enhancing Investigation and Prosecution of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking (EIP) Initiative

Boone County Prosecuting Attorney Roger Johnson stated this is a new grant application in the domestic area of their department. Prosecutor Johnson stated the goal is to hire new staff in that department to deal with sexual violence and violence against women. Prosector Johnson stated

they would possibly add a new prosecutor, investigator and legal assistant. They have also been implementing new strategies to improve their domestic violence prosecution and response to domestic violence. Prosecutor Johnson stated one of those strategies is to categorize cases by risk factors in order to identify high risk cases and expedite them. Prosecutor Johnson stated, over the years, domestic cases have been a high percentage of their overall trial volume so adding capacity to that department would help.

Commissioner Aldred moved now on this day, the County Commission of the County of Boone does hereby approve an application to apply for the federal grant - U.S. Department of Justice Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) for Fiscal Year 2025 Enhancing Investigation and Prosecution of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking (EIP) Initiative.

Purchasing

11. First Reading: Award of Amendment #4 to Contract C000719 Awarded from Cooperative Contract 109 for Storm Warning Sirens with Blue Valley Public Safety, Inc. for the Boone County Office of Emergency Management

Senior Buyer Liz Palazzolo read the following memo:

Purchasing requests approval for Amendment #5 to Contract C000719 awarded from Cooperative Contract 109 set up by MARC/KCRPE for Storm Warning Signals. The original contract was established with Blue Valley Public Safety, Inc. on February 1, 2024, through Commission Order 51-2024.

Amendment #5 adds pricing for hydro-vac services. This service is necessary to prepare a site for installation of a siren.

This is a term and supply contract. Payment for hardware (sirens) purchases will reference 2702 – Emergency Management Operations/92300 – Replacement Machinery & Equipment with \$156,110 budgeted for 2025.

Commissioner Kendrick stated this is a first reading and requested the Deputy County Clerk schedule this item for a second reading at the next available Commission meeting with appropriate order for approval.

12. First Reading: Computer and Peripheral Surplus Disposal

Buyer Brijanna Purdy read the following memo:

The Purchasing Department requests permission to dispose of the following list of surplus PC & peripheral equipment through MRC Recycling Center. MRC Recycling will pick up our surplus for \$100 per truckload. Extra charges may apply for items like televisions, freon removal, etc. Enclosed is a schedule of possible fees. They are a State of Missouri, DNR Level Four recycling center. No computer items are land-filled. Purchasing will obtain a Certificate of Destruction, and will let them know that the County wants everything recycled, not reused, so nothing ends up in the landfill.

Prior to computer surplus coming to Purchasing for disposal, Information Technology has removed the hard drives for destruction by their department. Their procedure for PC disposal is:

Once all the data is copied or recovered for the user, IT removes the hard drive and memory from the PC. The memory is held to be used for upgrading other PCs in the County that can benefit. IT sometimes removes parts that can be used as spare if the model is current enough (i.e. Power Supplies, Video Cards, etc.). The hard drive is held for a minimum of 30 days in case a user identifies something as missing. After 30 days, IT may reuse the hard drive in other County PCs if there are failures. If a hard drive goes unused or fails and IT needs to physically dispose of it, they drill a 5/8" hole through the drive and the data platters. Once IT has a collection of "drilled" drives, they deliver them to PC recycling vendor, MRC Recycling Center.

MRC Recycling Center certifies that they have picked up the following items and that all items will be recycled, not reused, so nothing ends up in the landfill.
