WHEREAS, plans and specifications for said Project, including the estimated cost, were submitted to the County Commission, an assessment roll was prepared and, pursuant to notice duly given, a hearing was held on the proposed improvements and assessments:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF BOONE COUNTY, MISSOURI:

Section 1. The plans and specifications for the Summers Lane Neighborhood Improvement District Project, Project Number 9643, providing for an estimate cost of <u>\$73,266.00</u> will be assessed against property benefited by the improvements, are hereby determined to be final and complete and the improvements described therein are ordered to be made.

Section 2. The County of Boone expects to make expenditures on and after the date of passage of this Order in connection with the Project, and the County of Boone intends to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of notes or bonds of the County of Boone. The maximum principal amount of notes or bonds expected to be issued for the Project is $\frac{992,000.00}{2}$.

Section 3. The County of Boone hereby authorizes the Treasurer to issue temporary notes pursuant to the Act to finance the costs of the Project until the Project is completed and final costs are determined for the purpose of making assessments against the owners of property within the district.

Due to changing operations, it was in the best interest of the Department to acquire a tandem axle truck instead of a single axle truck. A tandem axle truck can haul approximately twice as much material than a single axle truck, thus increasing productivity two-fold. The main reason for the use of single axle trucks in the department was to effectively treat subdivisions during snow events and for some applications on gravel roads to access areas that would not accommodate a tandem truck. Most areas in the County are accessible by a tandem truck and snow/ice control in Subdivisions is currently contracted out to smaller trucks.

The Department wishes to purchase a tandem axle dump truck with a plow and ground speed spreader. Also included in the bid was to purchase an electronic tool to enable the mechanics the ability to work on engine, brake, computer, and transmission systems in existing and new trucks. An additional two spreaders were budgeted but next years truck replacements would indicate that we will be replacing single axle trucks with tandems. The spreaders that were budgeted would not work for both single axle and tandem applications, therefore the purchases will be delayed for future truck acquisition. The plows that were bid can be utilized on any tandem or single axle truck.

A summary of requested items found in the bid from Al Scheppers are as follows:

There was some concern by the Department that only one bid was received. We reviewed amounts paid by other local entities for their latest tandem axle trucks and found that a comparison was not justified because the County specified a significantly heavier truck and included a stainless steel spreader. The bid received was comparable to last years bid for tandem trucks/spreaders/plows with an increase due to the higher price of steel. There was a decrease from last year due to the omission of GPS equipment. We also contacted other vendors and they stated that they did not have the time to dedicate to the bid.

The Department recommends award of bid #37-22JUN04 to Al Scheppers Motors as the only bid. Furthermore, the company meets all specifications included in the bid.

1. **Contract Documents** - This agreement shall consist of this Purchase Agreement for a Tandem Axle Dump Truck, bid number **37-22JUN04** including Introduction and General Conditions of Bidding, Primary Specifications, Response Presentation and Review, the unexecuted Response Form, Standard Terms & Conditions, as well as the Contractor's bid response dated June 22, 2004 executed by A. H. Wagner, on behalf of the Contractor. All such documents shall constitute the contract documents which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Service or product data, specification and literature submitted with bid response may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office bid file for this bid if not attached. The evaluation committee recommends award to Applied Ecological Services per their attached evaluation report. Total contract price of \$70,380 will be paid from department 1750 – Bonne Femme Creek Watershed, account 71100 – Outside Services.

Evaluation Report for Request for Proposal 04-09MAR04 – GIS and Subwatershed Sensitivity Analysis for the Bonne Femme Watershed

I. OFFEROR #1: University of Missouri-Columbia

X It has been determined that **University of Missouri-Columbia** has submitted a **responsive** proposal meeting the requirements set forth in the original Request for Proposal.

It has been determined that University of Missouri-Columbia has submitted a nonresponsive proposal.

Method of Performance:

Strengths:

UMC has a detailed description of GIS layer development and it seems to be of good quality. The geomorphic assessment appears to be thorough and natural resource base assessment is adequate. They will collect stream geomorphological data for use in the Subwatershed analysis.

A strength for their proposal is the local knowledge and collaboration with Dr. Hammer for the Geomorphic Stability and Stream Sensitivity analyses. They also provided a timeline for delivery of GIS products and the overall sensitivity analysis.

Data availability/familiarity is good. The proposal cites FGDC standards, metadata and common projection. The Karst map they propose to use is USDA (not geology), but could also use photos, DEM. The geomorphology study is a plus. They offer optional SWAT modeling. They have itemized the GIS layer costs.

Concerns:

They will not do hydrological modeling within the budget they propose. Their proposal is more heavily weighted towards GIS than we probably need and not enough on modeling. Their percent impervious is being calculated from 2000 LandSat data which is four years old, and the precision is not as good as we would like. The proposal seems to be weak in Stream System Response to Land Use Change. The modeling package (FAPRI add-on) adds quite a bit of expense and does not include fine calibration of model that appears to be a strong point of SWAT which is also not included in the base bid.

How good are Boone County paper map sources for losing/gaining? How valid is a windshield survey of point pollution? Aren't other EPA/DNR sources available that are more accurate? Commitment to continuation/finalization of geomorphology assessment is unclear.

In their proposal, it appears that they are planning to provide or offer to develop County analysis interfaces for ArcGIS so we can run our own models. We are not sure if that is something we are interested in being able to do in-house. ArcGIS interface development is expensive.

UMC does not address training county personnel to use product.

Experience/Expertise of Offeror:

Strengths:

Extensive experience with GIS and experience with weighted multi-criteria assessments. They have 10+ years doing projects and a strong geomorphic background. They also have a strong GIS background for project coordinator. They are locally based and familiar with specifics of our location.

UMC cites an example of having performed a watershed sensitivity analysis in the Columbia/Boone County area. They will have stream geomorphology data to be collected under supervision of PhD. with knowledge of local conditions.

Concerns:

UMC has no hydrological modeling experience other than possible subcontractor. The proposal response does not actually say who would do the work at CARES but only who would be the project coordinator. Other than Dr. Hammer, there is no expertise in engineering or natural resource science.

There is a concern that if student labor is involved in a GIS project, more time will be required for us to conduct quality control and assurance on the GIS data being delivered.

Summary of University of Missouri-Columbia Proposal Response:

The proposal conveys a clear understanding of the needs and desired approaches for the project. It provides useful detail on the data criteria for the GIS layers, and offers the added feature of collaborating with Dr. Hammer for field studies that would accurately document the current and future geomorphic stability of Gans and Clear Creeks. The additional costs for the needed hydrologic modeling may be problematic with the limited funds we have available. It also seems to be strong in data collection and GIS development. The approach to the natural resource base assessment part of the subwatershed sensitivity analysis is good. The proposal appears weak in the area of stream response to changes in land use, which is the fundamental purpose of the project.

Strong overall product offered, especially with multiple-criteria methodology to produce final sensitivity assessment. Geomorphology component has potential to be important contribution but County should determine strength of commitment. Optional minimally calibrated SWAT modeling would be very useful and cost effective as proposed. Benefits to County of local contractor should be considered: interaction with county staff, including field trips and outreach, may be an important contribution.

It appears they plan to give the County all the GIS analysis interfaces for ArcGIS so we can run the models with the GIS data. The County is not sure if that is something we are interested in being able to do in-house.

After reviewing University of Missouri-Columbia's presentation, the evaluation committee decided not to enter into negotiations with them. We were not convinced the 30 meter (100 foot) resolution would accurately capture impervious cover, especially when there are options at the 1 meter (3 foot) resolution. The evaluation committee believes the ArcIMS interface is not worth the extra cost, especially when there are other components of the RFP (modeling) which are left out. In addition, and of greatest importance, they do not include modeling in their offer. Modeling is extremely important to the analysis, and was explicitly requested in the RFP.

II. OFFEROR #2: Landplan Engineering, P.A. – Kansas City, MO

- X It has been determined that Landplan Engineering, P.A. has submitted a **responsive** proposal meeting the requirements set forth in the original Request for Proposal.
- It has been determined that Landplan Engineering, P.A. has submitted a **non-responsive** proposal.

Method of Performance:

Strengths:

No strengths were identified. There was not enough information provided besides the inclusion of additional personnel with local experience and emphasis on public/stakeholder involvement. They did not provide enough information on the actual project.

Concerns:

Lack of detail in the proposal makes evaluation difficult. Fundamental aspects of the proposal are not described in sufficient detail, e.g., no data quality criteria for the GIS layers are described, the specific approach for the natural resource base assessment is not described, and the specific approach to the hydrologic modeling is not described.

Big Concern: Very little detail about how they will do what they say they will and what models they will use. There is no information on how they will develop the GIS data. There was no itemization of cost of the different aspects of the project. They do not seem to understand the intent of the RFP: "...that progressively improve facilities..."; "The cost model will then map costs against the selected improvements." No details regarding how they will develop Watershed Sensitivity Index.

Out of 57 pages, only 4 pages addressed their work plan for the GIS and Subwatershed Sensitivity Analysis for the Bonne Femme Watershed.

Experience/Expertise of Offeror:

Strengths:

They have been around for 30 years and emphasize communication. They appear to have extensive experience with engineered (i.e. structural) solutions and experience with Denver's Urban Drainage and Flood Control District. Struble-Urban Hydrology; Philips-design of stormwater collection systems. Landplan has broad experience in the area of urban development.

Breadth and depth of experience, examples of previous work are evident. Qualifications of all personnel appear excellent.

Concerns:

The firm appears to be more focused on construction of infrastructure/development than protecting resources, and they do not have experience with watershed planning. They have mostly an engineering approach (not much resource science expertise).

Landplan identifies two firms that they would partner with but there is a lack of detail regarding which will be responsible for which portion of the project. The proposal seems to miss the general thrust of the RFP. They focus on developing a plan and cost estimates for plan implementation, which is not the purpose of the project.

Local contractor (Terracon) expertise is dominantly geotechnical rather than surface water or GIS.

Summary of Landplan Engineering, P.A. Proposal Response:

This proposal does not give sufficient detail into methods, data sources and final products. The firms have very impressive track records and personnel have very strong qualifications, especially in the engineering aspects of the work. The "Additional GIS components" portion of the bid is not described (or the description is not apparent), and GIS component costs are not itemized, so it is unclear what the cost estimates would actually cover. The proposal is very weak on detail. And the overall thrust of the response indicates a lack of understanding of the project. They provided ample information and examples about previous projects, but very little detail about how they would do the GIS and Subwatershed Sensitivity Analysis for the Bonne Femme Watershed.

The evaluation committee is not interested in short-listing this Offeror.

III. OFFEROR #3: Applied Ecological Services, Inc. – West Dundee, IL

- X It has been determined that Applied Ecological Services, Inc. has submitted a **responsive** proposal meeting the requirements set forth in the original Request for Proposal.
 - It has been determined that Applied Ecological Services, Inc has submitted a **non-responsive** proposal.

Method of Performance:

Strengths:

Applied Ecological Services provided an extremely detailed description of how they will do what, with associated breakdown in costs. They have clarified with potential partners their relationships and covered a a wide-range of issues that are of importance to the project. They focus on quality of data input into the model. Modeling is included in the package. Subwatershed sensitivity analysis includes human activity (20-year build out).

They use IKONOS 1-meter resolution data from 2004 to enhance the 30-meter land cover data for detailed impervious surface computations, thereby increasing the accuracy of their mapping. In addition, they provide detailed data quality for all GIS layers; the inclusion of a three-step process to determine watershed vulnerability; providing recommendations for policy changes; proposed project communication and FTP site. Provide emphasis on ecological carrying capacity. Inclusion of new IKONOS imagery for LU/LC and impervious area is *very* good idea. This would very effectively set up the County for future high-resolution monitoring. They place emphasis on ecological carrying capacity. Emphasis on final report is good. Proposal demonstrates initial research into data availability, partnerships. Standards, projections, and metadata cited. AES cites published methodology for sensitivity analysis. Inclusion of HEC-HMS to drive sensitivity analysis is good.

They provide a project site and ftp for file transfer between County and AES.

Concerns:

Extent of field work – number of cross sections, in particular – for stream sensitivity model is not well described. Description of how HEC-HMS will be used needs clarification, especially concept of carrying capacity (= flood conveyance?).

This concern was addressed in the Best and Final Offer. They stated they would do 1-3 cross-sections per subwatershed, along with pebble counts. This is a standard engineering approach to gathering information to determine mannings-n, a necessary coefficient representing surface roughness in hydrologic models such as HEC-HMS. The carrying capacity they were discussing refers to the increased volume of water a stream can convey without damaging the structure and habitat within the stream.

Experience/Expertise of Offeror:

Strengths:

Worked on innovative, ecologically based projects all over the country and their approach considers natural resources first. They work on cutting-edge of stormwater BMPs nad have a multi-disciplinary team with many years of experience in many places around the country.

Applied cites direct experience in environmental assessment and analysis and have relevant and specific experience in conducting this type of work (particularly the Indian Creek watershed master plan).

Previous projects indicate familiarity and success with previous projects with similar scope and resolution. Inclusion of Space Imaging expertise as partner is very big plus. Inclusion (even emphasis) on ecological input is a strong plus. They have strong qualifications for all personnel.

The use of new technology such as IKONOS imagery is a plus as well as it looks like they often work with ESRI software.

Concerns:

They have not worked in the social and geophysical setting of central Missouri and have a lack of a local affiliate for contractor team; this may put constraints on interactions between contractor and County.

They do have a local office in Kansas City that has been opened up recently (approximately 2 years ago), and are working on many projects in the greater Kansas City area. Although this is not the same as central Missouri, the evaluation committee believes there are enough similarities that project work would not be adversely impacted.

Summary of Applied Ecological Services, Inc Proposal Response:

The proposal is comprehensive in addressing almost every aspect of our RFP. In addition, it offers an innovative and much more accurate approach to computing impervious surface using the IKONOS imagery data. The proposal conveys a strong understanding of our project needs and specifically addresses all aspects with detailed information. The proposed watershed vulnerability assessment (Phase V) is especially a strong-point with the appropriate emphasis on a hydrologic model (HEC-HMS) that can include the impact of projected impervious surface and BMPs on sub-watershed hydrology. Lastly, this proposal covers all needed aspects of the RFP at the overall lowest cost (considering that the hydrologic modeling is included and not out-sourced as per the CARES proposal).

RECOMMENDATION: Our recommendation is Applied Ecological Services.

SUMMARY:

This evaluation report represents our subjective opinion of each offeror's strengths and concerns and is based upon our analysis of the relevant facts, as contained in each offeror's proposal. We have assigned points to each offeror for the evaluation category of Method of Performance and Experience/Expertise of the Offeror, as documented on the attached Evaluation Report Form.

We recommend that the County of Boone – Missouri award contract to Applied Ecological Services for the services of RFP 04-09MAR04.

Contract Documents - This agreement shall consist of this Purchase Agreement for a GIS and Subwatershed Sensitivity Analysis for the Bonne Femme Watershed, County of Boone Request for Proposal for a GIS and Subwatershed Sensitivity Analysis for the Bonne Femme Watershed, proposal number 04-09MAR04 including Instructions and General Conditions, Introduction and General Information, Scope of Services, Proposal Submission Information, the unexecuted Response Page, Addendum Number One, Addendum Number Two, Best and Final Offer Number One, as well as the Contractor's proposal response dated March 12, 2004, executed by Iva McRoberts, on behalf of the Contractor. All such documents shall constitute the contract documents, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Service or product data, specification and literature submitted with proposal response may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office proposal file for this proposal if not attached. In the event of conflict between any of the foregoing documents, the terms, conditions, provisions and requirements contained in the proposal specifications including Instructions and General Conditions, Introduction and General Information, Scope of Services, Proposal Submission Information, Addendum Number One, Addendum Number Two, the Best and Final Offer Number One, and the unexecuted Response Page shall prevail and control over the Contractor's proposal response.

2. **Purchase** - The County agrees to purchase from the Contractor and the Contractor agrees to furnish and deliver to Boone County, a GIS and Subwatershed Sensitivity Analysis for the Bonne Femme Watershed as identified and responded to in the Contractor's Response Page. The GIS and Subwatershed Sensitivity Analysis for the Bonne Femme Watershed will be provided as required in the proposal specifications and in conformity with the contract documents for the prices set forth in the Contractor's proposal response for a purchase price of \$69,780.00. In addition, the Contractor will provide from the Best and Final Offer, Progress Report Number One for \$300.00 and Progress Report Number Three for \$300.00 for a total contract price of \$70,380.00.

3. **Delivery** - The Contractor shall provide timeline option number two that is detailed in the Best and Final Offer, with the timeline beginning in October 2004. The County's evaluation committee has completed it's review of the responses to the Request for Proposal for GIS and Subwatershed Sensitivity Analysis. We are now in the process of preparing a contract award recommendation to the County Commission.

As you will recall, the grant application proposed that the \$84,929 allocated to this item would be spent in more or less equal installments in each of the four years of the grant program. However, the duration of the contract will be approximately one year with full payment due upon completion.

Our local match was budgeted to keep pace with expenditures. While the County will meet is match obligation over the four-year grant period, the accelerated payment for GIS and Subwatershed Sensitivity Analysis will cause a temporary imbalance in the 60-40 federal reimbursement to local match ratio. The County Auditor has requested that I verify that expenditures for the contractual services will be reimbursable as they are spent.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE OFFERING FOR SALE OF HOSPITAL REFUNDING AND IMPROVEMENT REVENUE BONDS (BOONE HOSPITAL CENTER) OF BOONE COUNTY, MISSOURI.

1. Boone County Missouri (the "County"), together with the Board of Trustees of Boone County Hospital (the "Board"), owns an acute care hospital and related facilities, known as Boone Hospital Center (the "Hospital"), pursuant to sections 205.160 to 205.379, inclusive, of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, as amended (the "Act").

2. The Board is duly constituted, established and elected pursuant to the Act and has the authority under the Act to operate, maintain and manage the Hospital, to enter into contracts for the use, operation or management of the Hospital and, with the consent of the County Commission, to enter into leases of the Hospital.

3. The Board has entered into an Amended and Restated Lease dated January 1, 2001 (as heretofore or hereafter amended, the "Lease"), with CH Allied Services, Inc., a Missouri nonprofit corporation (the "Lessee"), currently in effect through December 31, 2010, pursuant to which the Lessee has full management, control and use of the Hospital.

4. The County Commission is authorized pursuant to the Act to issue and sell revenue bonds of the County for the purpose of providing funds for the acquisition, construction, equipment, improvement, extension, repair and furnishing of hospitals and related facilities, provided that the principal of and interest on such revenue bonds shall be payable solely from the net income and revenues arising from the operation of such hospitals and related facilities after providing for the cost of operation and maintenance thereof.

5. Pursuant to Indenture of Trust dated as of December 1, 2002 (the "Original Indenture"), among the County, the Board and UMB Bank, n.a., as Trustee, the County has heretofore issued its Hospital Refunding Revenue Bonds (Boone Hospital Center), Series 2002, in the original principal amount of \$29,470,000, and currently outstanding in the principal amount of \$27,445,000.

6. The Board desires to acquire, construct, improve, extend, repair, equip and furnish the existing facilities of and make additions and renovations to the Hospital (the "2004 Project"), with the proceeds of revenue bonds of the County to be issued under the Act, on a parity with the Series 2002 Bonds.

7. The Board has requested the County Commission to issue its Hospital Revenue Bonds (Boone Hospital Center Project), in a principal amount not to exceed \$7,000,000 (the "Bonds") to provide funds to finance the 2004 Project, and the County Commission has found and determined that it is necessary and advisable and will promote the general health and welfare of the County and of its inhabitants for the County to issue, sell and deliver the Bonds under the Original Indenture, as supplemented by the First Supplemental Indenture, to provide funds for the 2004Project.

8 Raymond James & Associates, Inc. (the "Underwriter"), and associates, are serving as underwriters for the Bonds and Jaffray & Co. is serving as the County's Financial Advisor (the "Financial Advisor").

9. The County desires to authorize the Underwriter to proceed with the offering for sale of the Bonds; and

10. One of the duties and responsibilities of the Underwriter is to prepare and distribute a Preliminary Official Statement and a final Official Statement relating to the Bonds; and

11. The County desires to authorize the Underwriter and the Financial Advisor to proceed with the preparation and distribution of the Preliminary Official Statement relating to the Bonds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF BOONE COUNTY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Underwriter is hereby authorized to proceed with the offering for sale of the Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$7,000,000, the proceeds of which are to be used as described above, subject to approval of the documents and the terms of the Bonds by the County Commission.

Section 2. The County Commission hereby authorizes the Underwriter and the Financial Advisor to prepare a Preliminary Official Statement relating to the Bonds and consents to the use and public distribution by the Underwriter of the Preliminary Official Statement in connection with the offering for sale of the Bonds.

Section 3. For the purpose of enabling the Underwriter to comply with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12(b)(1) of the Securities and Exchange Commission, the appropriate officers of the County are hereby authorized, if requested, to provide the Underwriter a letter or certification to the effect that the County deems the information contained in the Preliminary Official Statement to be "final" as of its date, except for the omission of such information as is permitted by Rule 15c2-12(b)(1), and to take such other actions or execute such other documents as such officers in their reasonable judgment deem necessary to enable the Underwriter to comply with the requirements of such Rule.

Section 4. The County agrees to provide to the Underwriter within seven business days of the date of the purchase contract for the Bonds or within sufficient time to accompany any confirmation that requests payment from any customer of the Underwriter, whichever is earlier, sufficient copies of a final Official Statement to enable the Underwriter to comply with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12(b)(4) of the Securities and Exchange Commission and with the requirements of Rule G-32 of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board.

Section 5. The Presiding Commissioner and other officers and representatives of the County are hereby authorized and directed to take such other action as may be necessary to carry out the offering for sale of the Bonds.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the County Commission.
