Boone County Public works is suggesting raising the speed limits on Olivet Road from Richland to Hwy WW and from Hwy WW to New Haven from 35 mph to 45 mph.

Olivet Road along that entire stretch from Richland to New Haven is listed as a major collector by CATSO. Olivet Road from Hwy WW to New Haven is asphalt pavement, the traffic on which was most recently counted on 7/8/2004. Olivet Road from Richland to Hwy WW has recently been paved for the 2005 construction season. After construction equipment was removed from the site and the roadway was opened again to the public, a traffic study was completed to determine whether the speed limit should change for that section of Olivet Road. The following table describes the results of those two traffic studies.

There were no reported accidents on Olivet Road between Richland and New Haven for a 5 year period from 2000 through 2004.

From the sample of data during the 2004 and 2005 traffic studies, it is apparent that Olivet Road would be within 5 mph of the 85% speed (as suggested by MUTCD) if they are increased to a 45 mph speed limit.

Speed limits suggested are in accordance with section 1.4 of Chapter 1 of Roadway Regulations, section 3.2 of the County Traffic Safety Manual, and section 2B.11 of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).

The upgrade from gravel to asphalt pavement on Olivet Road from Richland to Hwy WW prompted this speed limit study.

Boone County Public works is suggesting that speed limits on Yosemite, Rocky Mountain, Shiloh, Shenandoah, Glacier, and Crater Lake remain at 30 mph. The speed limit for Teton Dr. is also suggested to remain at 30 mph.

All roads internal to the subdivision are currently listed at 30 mph. Grace Lane, the minor arterial that serves that subdivision, is also listed at 30 mph. There was a traffic count and speed study completed for various roads within Lake of the Woods in May of 2003. Since no new construction has occurred within this subdivision and the residential uses within the subdivision have not changed since this study was conducted, these findings are considered valid for use in preparing this report (with the exception of Teton Dr., which is addressed on page 2 of this memo). The results are as follows:

There were no reported accidents within Lake of the Woods subdivision for a 5 year period from 2000 through 2004.

From the sample of internal roads counted during the 2003 traffic study, it is apparent that the internal roads would be within 5 mph of the 85% speed (as suggested by MUTCD) if they remain at the posted 30 mph speed limit. The Nu-Metrics traffic counter also provides a percentage of drivers that exceed the posted speed limit. Of the four internal segments listed above (Yosemite and Rocky Mountain in both directions), the average percentage of drivers exceeding the speed limit is 6.6%. The default speed for any county maintained roadway within a recorded subdivision is 30 mph unless otherwise warranted based on safety concerns. There is 93.4% compliance with the posted speed limit of 30 mph and there have been no reported accidents within the subdivision. It is my conclusion that changing the speed limit will not affect the behavior of the majority of the drivers and changing the speed limit is not warranted. Other roadways within the subdivision that were not included in the study are either short segments (650 ft or less) or dead end streets. Therefore Yosemite and Rocky Mountain were used as a sample for all internal roads. Other roads considered "internal" are Shiloh, Shenandoah, Glacier, and Crater Lake.

Teton Dr. was counted again recently on 6/22/05 due to a new development east of Lake of the Woods subdivision, which has resulted in Teton Dr. now being used for access to that development. The results of that traffic count are as follows:

Although the 85% speeds from the most recent traffic study on Teton Dr. indicate that the speed limit should be raised to 45 mph, that speed limit would not be in accordance with the classification of the roadway, the geometrics of the roadway, and the density of driveways within the segment from Grace Ln. to the city limits. Boone County Public Works is suggesting the speed limit on Teton Dr. remain at 30 mph. Public Works is also suggesting that the Sheriff's Department is notified regarding this safety issue. According to the Nu-Metrics traffic counter, an average of 7.8% of drivers exceeded 55 mph.

Speed limits suggested are in accordance with section 1.4 of Chapter 1 of Roadway Regulations, section 3.2 of the County Traffic Safety Manual, and section 2B.11 of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).

Concerns from residents in Lake of Woods regarding the speed limits on Grace Lane prompted the 2003 study and new requests to lower the speed limits on the internal roads of the subdivision prompted the new speed study
