Since the time of formation of this NID, several things have happened that have an impact on this project:

- Bids for this project were higher than expected.
- An additional property owner has asked to be included.
- This project qualified for ARRA (stimulus) funding.

In December of 2009, an Amendment to the Petition was circulated and signed by 100% of the property owners in the NID, asking the Commission to add the sixth property owner. This Amendment has not been presented to the Commission. In its place, a new Amendment has been prepared and is being circulated in the neighborhood which would not only add the sixth participant, but would also increase the petition estimate to reflect the higher than expected costs.

I am writing to support the application by the University of Missouri in response to your request for applications for the Advancing Chronic Care through Excellence in Systems and Support (ACCESS) funding program.

Over the past three years, I have had the opportunity to observe and hear about the work that Dr. Joseph LeMaster and colleagues have done in neighboring Howard and Callaway Counties to develop services for people with diabetes, through the MFH-funded Better Self-management of Diabetes program. I am excited about the possibility of bringing similar efforts to Boone County, and expanding efforts to include individuals with other chronic diseases, especially those who are uninsured, in poverty, minorities, or limited in access to care because of issues such as lack of transportation.
