THIS AGREEMENT dated the ______ day of _______ 2010 is made between Boone County, Missouri, a political subdivision of the State of Missouri through the Boone County Commission, herein "County" and Redwood Toxicology Laboratory, Inc. herein "Vendor."

IN CONSIDERATION of the parties performance of the respective obligations contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Contract Documents This agreement shall consist of this Purchase Agreement for Drug / Alcohol Testing Equipment and Services compliant with all bid specifications and any addendum issued for the Office of State Courts Administrator Contract OSCA-08-005-10, as well as the attached Boone County Terms and Conditions. All such documents shall constitute the contract documents which are incorporated herein by reference. Service or product data, specification and literature submitted with bid response may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office bid file for this bid if not attached. In the event of conflict between any of the foregoing documents, this Purchase Agreement with Boone County's Terms and Conditions and the Office of State Courts Administrator Contract OSCA-08-005-10 shall prevail and control over the vendor's bid response.
- 2. Contract Duration This agreement shall commence from date of award and extend through September 19, 2011 subject to the provisions for termination specified below.
