This contract will replace our existing contract with GovDeals that was signed in 2004, commission order 532-2004.

The County will continue to pay a 7.5% commission for surplus items sold on GovDeals on-line auction site.

CONTRACT AGREEMENT FOR On-Line Surplus Auction Service

THIS AGREEMENT dated the <u>30</u> day of <u>November</u> 2010 is made between Boone County, Missouri, a political subdivision of the State of Missouri through the Boone County Commission, herein "County" and GovDeals Inc. herein "Vendor."

IN CONSIDERATION of the parties performance of the respective obligations contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Contract Documents** - This agreement shall consist of this Contract Agreement for **On-Line Surplus Auction Service**, in compliance with all bid specifications and any addendum issued for the Missouri Department of Transportation Request for Proposal **6-100602FR**, Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission Contract Services Agreement, GovDeals proposal response and GovDeals Annual Voluma Discount Program Agreement. All such documents shall constitute the contract documents which are incorporated herein by reference. Service or product data, specification and literature submitted with proposal response may be permanently maintained in the Missouri Department of Transportation Bid file or the County Purchasing Office contract file for this contract if not attached. In the event of conflict between any of the foregoing documents, the terms, conditions, provisions and requirements contained in this Agreement shall prevail and control over the Contractor's proposal response.

2. **Purchase** - The County agrees to purchase from the Vendor and the Vendor agrees to supply the County, On-Line Surplus Auction Service as identified and responded to in the Vendor's Proposal Response. Service shall be provided as required in the proposal specifications and in conformity with the contract documents for the prices set forth in the Vendor's proposal response. The County elects to utilize Option A1: The County pays a 7.5% fee which will be reduced according to the Tiered Fee Reduction Schedule. GovDeals will invoice the County each month for fees on items sold in the previous month.

Tiered Fee Reduction Schedule explains how the base auction fee of 7.5% is reduced for assets that sell in excess of \$100,000.

a. When an asset sells for up to \$100,000 in a winning bid, the GovDeals fee is seven and one-half percent (7.5%) of the winning bid, but not less than \$5.00.

b. Where an asset sells for more than \$100,000, but less than \$500,000 the GovDeals fee is seven and one-half percent (7.5%) of the winning bid up to \$100,000, plus five and one-half percent (5.5%) of the winning bid for auction proceeds in excess of \$100,000 up to \$500,000.

c. Where an asset sells for greater than \$500,000 the GovDeals fee is seven and one-half percent (7.5%) of the first \$100,000 of the winning bid, plus a fee of five and one-half percent (5.5%) of the next \$400,000 of the winning bid, plus a fee of three and one-half percent (3.5%) of the bid amount in excess of \$500,000.

* Subject to a minimum per asset/lot fee of \$5.00.

3. **Contract Duration** - This agreement for equipment shall commence on **the date written above** and extend through **June 30, 2011**, subject to the provisions for termination specified below. This agreement may be extended beyond the expiration date by order of the County for **five (5) additional one year periods**, and thereafter on a month to month basis in the event the County is unable to re-bid and/or award a new contract prior to the expiration date.

4. **Billing and Payment** - All billing shall be invoiced to the Boone County Purchasing Department and billings may only include the prices listed in the Vendor's proposal response. No additional fees for delivery or extra services or taxes shall be included as additional charges in excess of the charges in the Vendor's proposal response to the specifications. The County agrees to pay all monthly statements within thirty days of

receipt of a valid, correct monthly statement; Vendor agrees to honor any cash or prompt payment discounts offered in its bid response if county makes payment as provided therein. In the event of a billing dispute, the County reserves the right to withhold payment on the disputed amount; in the event the billing dispute is resolved in favor of the Vendor, the County agrees to pay interest at a rate of 9% per annum on disputed amounts withheld commencing from the last date that payment was due.

5. **Binding Effect** - This agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and assigns for so long as this agreement remains in full force and effect.

6. **Entire Agreement** - This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior negotiations, written or verbal, and any other bid or bid specification or contractual agreement. This agreement may only be amended by a signed writing executed with the same formality as this agreement.

7. *Termination* - This agreement may be terminated by the County upon thirty days advance written notice for any of the following reasons or under any of the following circumstances:

- a. County may terminate this agreement due to material breach of any term or condition of this agreement, or
- b. County may terminate this agreement if in the opinion of the Boone County Commission if delivery of products are delayed or products delivered are not in conformity with bidding specifications or variances authorized by County, or
- c. If appropriations are not made available and budgeted for any calendar year.

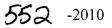

Leasa provided me with a spreadsheet on where we are currently in our 2010 budget year. Presently, we are \$8,648.74 over on gasoline and \$2,152.01 over on vehicle repairs. We are projecting to be approximately \$88,000 over by the end of the year in these two line items.

I have looked at other classes to see if there is any money we are going to be able to use to help with the deficit, but it doesn't look promising.

Class 2: We just ordered evidence equipment and other supplies that will be taking "Other Supplies" down to @ \$2,000 and the \$31,258 in "Uniforms" will be spent on vests, which we are in the process of right now. Everything else in Class 2 (majority of) will be spent down before the end of the year.

Class 3 and 4: Simply nothing available.

Class 5: Of course, there is where we are hurting already with gasoline and vehicle repairs.

Class 6, 7 and 8: The only thing of substance is "Criminal Investigation" that has a little over \$10,000, but of course we have no idea what we are going to be dealing with (call wise) before the end of the year. We don't have control over the "Building Rent", which is the cost of Facility Maintenance to take care of the building.

It is my opinion "Emergency Funds" are going to be needed, but I wanted to get your opinions before we prepare our budget amendment. Please let me know your thoughts.

I am pleased to inform you that the Office of State Courts Administrator (OSCA) has approved funding of \$50,000.00 through the Highway Safety – DWI Court Pilot Project for a DWI Court in the 13th Judicial Circuit. The funding period for this project is October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011.

OSCA will be monitoring the expenditure of funds. If it appears you are not spending the awarded funds as proposed, the award may be reduced and made available to another DWI Court. These grant funds may only be used for participant supervision, drug and/or alcohol testing, and participant curriculum. DWI Court Funding Request October 2010-September 2011

Proposal Summary with a background of the DWI Court:

The Boone County DWI Court Program is a court-supervised program which accepts post plea DWI prior offenders. The DWI program is voluntary and is part of the terms of an individual's probation. All participants have been determined to require substance abuse treatment and are misdemeanor offenders. Participation includes regular court appearance before the DWI Court Judge. Treatment, which includes drug testing, individual counseling and group counseling, is provided through Reality House for men and McCambridge Center for women. The defendant is also expected to obtain and maintain employment or involvement in vocational or education programs and maintain regular attendance at 12-step meetings (Narcotics Anonymous or Alcoholics Anonymous). The length of the DWI Court Program is determined by each participant's progress and will be a minimum of one year and no longer than two years.

The Boone County DWI Court Program began on March 18, 2010 with the admission of three participants. The number of admission has grown to eighteen admissions, one participant withdrew and we have had no graduations at this time due to the court being operational less than the one year. The program capacity has been set at thirty active clients.

Drug Testing:

The Boone County DWI Court Program has also recognized that frequent, random and observed drug testing is essential within a treatment court system. The DWI Court program has employed a randomized drug testing color system that, on average, tests an individual up to seven times a month. The average cost for testing per participant per year is \$357.00. Testing 30 participants, an average of seven times per month cost \$892.50. The total amount of funding needed and requested in this proposal is the following:

• The total annual cost for drug testing 30 participants is \$10,710.00. This would provide the court with the ability to test 30 participants X 7 times a month = 210 X 4.25 (cost of the test) =892.50 X 12 months a year \$10,710.00

* From this number we are reducing the request from 10,710.00 to \$10,695.90. The original budget requested was \$14.10 over the \$50,000.00 grant award. This was a logical place to make the reduction, due to the fact, that most participants are tested six times a month but on certain months their color is called a seventh time and they are requested to provide a additional urine sample. Drug Testing Amount for this line item is \$10,695.90.

Alternative Sentencing Court programs also administer testing for Synthetic Substances, such as K2. On average the court would plan on testing four participants per month. Testing, an average of four participants per months would cost an additional \$80 per month.

• The total cost for testing 4 participants per month at \$20 per test = \$80.00 \$80 a month X 12 months is an annual cost of **\$960.00**

Alcohol Testing:

The Thirteenth Judicial Circuit Court has also noted the essential component of the program to include random alcohol testing for the participants. Since the client's participation stems from alcohol related offenses it is essential to the integrity of the program to test the clients regularly for the use of alcohol. The alcohol tests are implemented in the same manner as the drug testing. The tests are frequent, random and observed. The average cost for testing per participant per year is \$612.00. Testing 30 participants, an average of three times per month costs \$18,360.00. The total amount of funding needed and requested in this proposal is the following:

• The total annual cost for drug testing 30 participants is \$18,360.00 This would provide the court with the ability to test 30 participants @ 3 times a month = 90 X 17.00 (cost of the test) =\$1530 X 12 month a year \$18,360.

Contractual Services:

The Reality House Program provides trackers for the DWI Court Program. The activities they provide include, but are not limited to, conducting random visits to DWI Court participants, verifying that there are no signs of drug or alcohol use, and administering random breathalyzer tests and/or drug tests, as requested by the DWI Court. Reality House shall also ensure that trackers are available at the Alternative Sentencing Center at 607 East Ash, Columbia, Missouri, during regular office hours, as directed by the DWI Court Administrator.

• The total annual cost for tracking 30 participants is \$16,744.00. This would provide the trackers 11.5 hours per week at \$28.00 an hour =\$322.00 per week X 52 weeks a year= \$16,744.00.

Electronic Monitoring:

As part of the DWI Court Program, each participant is placed on home detention for a minimum of at least 5 days on the basic unit. This home detention is done in lieu of jail time for their arrest.

• The total annual cost for tracking 30 participants is \$268.50. This cost of the basic unit is \$1.79 dollars a day X 5 days = \$8.95 per participant. \$8.95 X 30 participants = **\$268.50**

Beyond the minimum five days of basic home detention, some clients have needed additional electronic monitoring services due to the nature of their employment, positive tests, or for the fact that increased monitoring has been deemed appropriate at the early stages of their participation in the program. The DWI Court has implemented the use of the TAD and SCRAM devices.

• The costs of these devices are \$8.74 dollars per day. The court will not use these types of devices to monitor all clients in the program however; such devices need to be available in the event additional monitoring is warranted. On average the DWI Court program projects four clients being monitored for 85 days @ \$8.74 dollars per day = \$2,971.60

Educational Items:

At this time the Boone County DWI Court Program is not asking for funding under this particular category. The Educational Items will be purchased from the March 2010-September 2010 budget.

Total Amount Requested for the Boone County DWI Court Program for October 2010-September 2011 is \$50,000.00.
