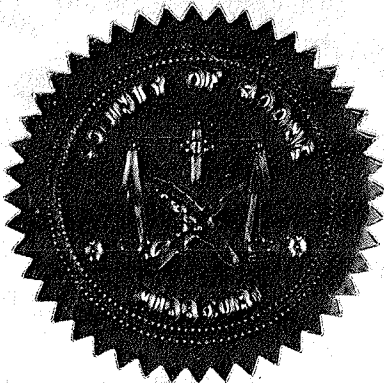

PROCLAMATION RECOGNIZING APRIL 4, 2017 AS NATIONAL SERVICE RECOGNITION DAY


- WHEREAS,** service to others is a hallmark of the American character and central to how we meet challenges; and
- WHEREAS,** the nation's mayors and commissioners are increasingly turning to national service and volunteerism as a cost-effective strategy to meet county needs; and
- WHEREAS,** AmeriCorps, AmeriCorps VISTA, and Senior Corps address the most pressing challenges facing our cities and nation, from educating students for the jobs of the 21st century and supporting veterans and military families to preserving the environment and helping communities recover from natural disasters; and
- WHEREAS,** national service expands economic opportunity by creating more sustainable, resilient communities and providing education, career skills, and leadership abilities for those who serve; and
- WHEREAS,** national service participants enhance the impact of the organizations they serve with, both through their direct service and by recruiting and managing millions of additional volunteers; and
- WHEREAS,** national service represents a unique public-private partnership that invests in community solutions and leverages non-federal resources to strengthen community impact and increase the return on taxpayer dollars; and
- WHEREAS,** Boone County, Missouri, currently benefits from a diverse alliance of national service participants including the AmeriCorps volunteers of: Missouri College Advising Corps, Jumpstart Columbia, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Central Missouri, Primaris, Community Leaders Assisting the Insured of Missouri (CLAIM), Missouri Healthy Food AmeriCorps Program, Southern Boone Learning Garden, the Columbia Center for Urban Agriculture, Job Point Youth Build, Senior Corps volunteers of RSVP and the Foster Grandparents Program; and
- WHEREAS,** the Corporation for National and Community Service shares a priority with mayors nationwide to engage citizens, improve lives, and strengthen communities; and is joining with the National League of Cities, City of Service, and mayors across the country to recognize the impact of service on the Mayors Day of Recognition for National Service on April 4, 2017.





Now on this day the County Commission of the County of Boone, pursuant to Chapter 139 RSMo, does hereby authorize the Boone County Collector, Brian McCollum, for the 2011 tax bill year, to strike from the delinquent tax rolls, property tax balances on real estate and personal property as follows:

These 2011 real estate and personal property taxes are stricken for the following reasons:

- After due diligence, the collector cannot locate the owners; or
- Bankruptcy or probate proceedings have intervened making the balances due uncollectible; or,
- The real estate property was not subject to taxation after being acquired by a tax exempt owner after January 1 of the taxable year.

The above total of \$723,752.06 breaks out as follows:

- Personal property \$ 65,554.06
- Bankruptcy and/or probate \$ 5,736.45
- Tax exempt acquisitions \$ 652,461.55

The following tax amounts represent 2010 and prior tax bills that were previously stricken from the delinquent tax rolls in Boone County. The tax amounts were added back to the delinquent tax rolls, and collected and distributed to the taxing entities during the period of March 1, 2016 through February 28, 2017.
