PURCHASE AGREEMENT FOR MEDIUM USE AND HIGH USE FAX MACHINES

IN CONSIDERATION of the parties performance of the respective obligations contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Contract Documents This agreement shall consist of this Purchase Agreement for Medium Use and High Use Fax Machines, in compliance with all bid specifications and any addendum issued for the State of Missouri Contract CT181006001 and Boone County Standard Terms and Conditions. All such documents shall constitute the contract documents which are incorporated herein by reference. Service or product data, specification and literature submitted with bid response may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office bid file for this bid if not attached. In the event of conflict between any of the foregoing documents, this Purchase Agreement, Boone County Missouri Standard Terms and Conditions and State of Missouri Contract CT181006001 shall prevail and control over the vendor's bid response in the above stated order.
- 2. **Purchase** The County agrees to purchase from the Contractor and the Contractor agrees to supply the County, Medium Use and High Use Fax Machines as identified and responded to in the Contractor's Bid Response. Equipment and service will be provided as required in the bid specifications and in conformity with the contract documents for the prices set forth in the Contractor's bid response, as needed and as ordered by the County.
- 3. Contract Duration This agreement shall commence on the date written above and extend through December 31, 2018 subject to the provisions for termination specified below. This agreement may be extended beyond the expiration date by the order of the county for three additional one-year periods subject to the pricing clauses in the contractor's RFB response and thereafter on a month to month basis in the event the County is unable to re-bid and/or award a new contract prior to the expiration date after exercising diligent efforts to do so or not.
- 4. **Delivery** Contractor agrees to deliver the equipment per the bid specifications.
- 5. Billing and Payment All billing shall be invoiced to the respective Boone County Office and billings may only include the prices listed in the Vendor's bid response. No additional fees for delivery or extra services or taxes shall be included as additional charges in excess of the charges in the Vendor's bid response to the specifications. The County agrees to pay all invoices within thirty days of receipt; Vendor agrees to honor any cash or prompt payment discounts offered in its bid response if county makes payment as provided therein. In the event of a billing dispute, the County reserves the right to withhold payment on the disputed amount; in the event the billing dispute is resolved in favor of the Vendor, the County agrees to pay interest at a rate of 9% per annum on disputed amounts withheld commencing from the last date that payment was due.

- 1. Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and failure to do so, in County's sole discretion, shall give County the right to terminate this Contract.
- 2. Prices shall include all charges for packing, delivery, installation, etc., (unless otherwise specified) to the Boone County Department.
- 3. The Boone County Commission has the right to accept or reject any part or parts of all bids, to waive technicalities, and to accept the offer the County Commission considers the most advantageous to the County. Boone County reserves the right to award this bid on an item-by-item basis, or an "all or none" basis, whichever is in the best interest of the County. The Purchasing Director reserves the right, when only one bid has been received by the bid closing date, to delay the opening of bids to another date and time in order to revise specifications and/or establish further competition for the commodity or service required. The one (1) bid received will be retained unopened until the new Closing date, or at request of bidder, returned unopened for re-submittal at the new date and time of bid closing.
- 4. When products or materials of any particular producer or manufacturer are mentioned in our contracts, such products or materials are intended to be descriptive of type or quality and not restricted to those mentioned.
- 5. Do not include Federal Excise Tax or Sales and Use Taxes in billing, as law exempts the County from them.
- 6. The delivery date shall be stated in definite terms.

This information will allow us to set the copier up properly in the system to bill the correct amount to the correct address, inform the service tech of the location of the machine when service is needed, and give us ample information to collect the monthly meter reading.

3. WARRANTY:

Warranty on new equipment commences upon installation and acceptance by the state agency and is for one year. This warranty covers both parts and labor. There is no need for a maintenance agreement until the warranty is expired. Additional warranties may be purchased under this contract.

4. **SHIPPING:**

All prices are F.O.B. Destination and include shipping charges. The contractor will be responsible for replacing any equipment or supplies received in damaged condition at no cost to the State of Missouri. This includes all shipping costs for returning non-functional items to the contractor for replacement.

5. CANCELLATION:

Maintenance agreements may be canceled with thirty (30) days written notice to the contractor at no additional cost to the State of Missouri. The agency shall send to the contractor a written notice of cancellation referencing the copier model, serial number, location, and contract number.

6. <u>INSTALLATION:</u>

The contractor will provide free installation with the purchase of a new facsimile machine and all start-up supplies at no additional cost. Upon receipt of an order, the contractor will contact the state agency to coordinate installation and training. The contractor will furnish all labor and materials necessary for the successful completion of the installation and operation of each unit.

a. The contractor will supply the user documentation/operating manuals necessary to install, operate and maintain the products provided. The contractor will furnish to the state agency at least one (1) set of all technical literature for each fax machine purchased.

7. MAINTENANCE TERMS:

The contractor will provide on-site maintenance for all installed fax machines. Following notification, the contractor will provide a qualified technician certified on the facsimile transceiver on-site within the service response time specified herein. The contractor will provide maintenance on both a monthly maintenance plan and on an hourly time and materials basis at the sole option of each state agency. Both maintenance options must include all parts and labor. The contractor will agree and understand that state agencies will not be required to purchase maintenance from the contract.

- b. The contractor will maintain service facilities and furnish trained personnel qualified to service the equipment throughout the state.

- The contractor should provide remote diagnostic maintenance service.

Boone County Emergency Management successfully applied for and was subsequently awarded three Motorola APX 7000 portable radios from the State of Missouri as a function of Emergency Management Communications Assistance Program (EMCAP) grant.

Each radio, including charging station, programing and other options as ordered by the State, is valued at \$5,155.95. In addition to having all local frequencies programed, each radio also has the Missouri Statewide Interoperability Network (MoSWIN) frequencies programed to meet the State of Missouri goal of statewide interoperable communication. These radios will be assigned to the Director and Deputy Director of Emergency Management, with the third radio being loaned to the Boone County Joint Communications Center (BCJC) for their use during a large incident.

These radios were delivered in 2016 and due to an oversite were not presented for Commission acceptance at that time; this request is an effort to correct that error. There is no ongoing cost associated with the acceptance these units as Boone County is not bound to maintain or replace any radio provided as a function of this grant so long as each unit can be accounted for during the next five-year period or when each has a value that is zero dollars, which ever comes first. No matching funds were required as each radio was fully funded by the State of Missouri.

*User Level - a define level of usage of MOSWIN based on the following levels:

Level 1 - Daily Use / Dispatch (Tier I and future Level 1 members)

Daily use is defined as radio communications in support of internal agency operations such as usual and routine dispatch. Daily use will occur on channels that have been established for internal agency communications. Daily use will not occur on channels established for interoperability or itinerant use.

Level 2 - Interoperability / Mutual Aid (Tier II Agencies and PSAPS)

Interoperability use is defined as radio communications in support of multi agency response to an incident. This is typically across county lines and when responding agencies do not have access to local common channels. Interoperability use will occur on predefined system interoperability channels in accordance with the guidelines for use of those channels.

Level 3 - Itinerant / Travel

Itinerant use is defined as radio communications in support of units operating outside of their home area or system. This is typically when a unit leaves its home county.

Examples of itinerant use are:

- A sheriff's deputy on a prisoner transport needs to communicate with their dispatch or the dispatch point for the location nearest them.

The parties of this Agreement do mutually agree as follows:

Award of Equipment: The State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA) hereby agrees to transfer ownership of the equipment (hereafter described as equipment) described on the attached documentation and purchased with grant funds to the Boone County Emergency Management Agency ("Agency") to enhance the Agency's capabilities to deter and/or respond to acts of terrorism and other disasters. The Agency listed above agrees to accept the specified equipment and comply with all provisions detailed in this Agreement. The Agency agrees to make the equipment available for regional response and for regional exercises, as appropriate, for the life of the equipment.

Reporting and Monitoring Requirements: The Agency shall permit monitoring by the State or appropriate federal agency representatives, and comply with such reporting procedures as may be established by the State. The Agency shall maintain all related records for the life of the equipment. Record retention is required for purposes of Federal examination and audit. Although information will be provided to SEMA by the Agency, SEMA has no obligation [or right] to maintain or repair the equipment or ensure that the equipment is used safely or properly.

<u>Inventory Control</u>: The Agency agrees to maintain an inventory control system to ensure adequate safeguards to prevent loss, damage, or theft of the equipment. Any loss, damage, or theft shall be investigated. Adequate maintenance procedures must be in place to keep the equipment in good condition. Inventory control shall be maintained on any equipment provided through this agreement, where the current fair market value of any one individual item is \$1,000 or more, for the life of the equipment.

Agency inventory records must include a description of the equipment, a serial number or other identification number/tagging, acquisition date, the location, use and condition of the equipment and any ultimate disposition data. SEMA may require an on-site inspection of the equipment following the award.

<u>Disposition of Equipment</u>: Equipment provided through this grant program must be used for the purpose stipulated in the approved grant application. If equipment acquired with this grant program is no longer needed for the purpose of the grant, the equipment may not be sold, replaced or exchanged without written approval from SEMA. If SEMA discovers that equipment acquired with this grant program has been disposed of without written approval, SEMA may take one or more of the following actions:

- a. Withhold future awards
- b. Take other remedies that may be legally available

Non-Supplanting Certification: The agency affirms that the federal funds will be used to supplement existing funds, and will not replace (supplant) funds that have been appropriated for the same purpose. Applicants may be required to supply documentation certifying that a reduction in non-federal resources occurred for reasons other than the receipt of federal funds.

Maintenance of Equipment and Qualified Personnel: The Agency affirms that it has access to staff and resources to use this equipment in a timely manner once requested or deployed. The Agency affirms that it has properly trained and qualified personnel to operate and maintain equipment provided through this Agreement, and the Agency agrees to maintain training of personnel to ensure proper and safe use of the equipment.

Agency agrees to allow SEMA or its agent's access to maintenance and use records. The Agency agrees to assume financial responsibility for monthly or use service charges beyond the scope of DPS contract and within the time period of this Agreement.

As applicable, the Agency will also exchange and replace any expendable supplies stored with the equipment as soon as possible after use to ensure that the equipment is fully operational for an emergency event.

Insurance: The Agency agrees to maintain property and casualty insurance on the equipment provided under this Agreement in an amount at least equal to the value of the equipment, or until such time as the equipment's current fair market value is determined to be 0. Upon request by SEMA, the Agency will provide a copy of the declarations page or other appropriate excerpt from the insurance policy confirming that the equipment is insured for the life of the equipment or until such time as the current fair market value of the equipment is determined to be 0.

Report of Loss or Expiration: The Agency agrees to notify SEMA within ten (10) working days of the loss, damage or expiration of the equipment provided through this Agreement. The Agency understands that neither the State nor federal agencies are able to replace items lost, damaged or expired.

Interest of members of SEMA and others: No officer, member, or employee of SEMA and no member of its governing body, and no other public official of the governing body of the localities in which the equipment is provided who exercises any functions or responsibilities in the review or approval of this project, shall participate in any decision relating to this agreement which affects his or her personal interest or have any personal or pecuniary interest, direct or indirect, in this agreement or the proceeds thereof.

Termination of Agreement for cause: If through any cause, the Agency shall fail to perform in a timely and proper manner its obligations under this Agreement or if the agency shall violate any of the covenants, agreements or stipulations of this Agreement, SEMA shall thereupon have the right to terminate this Agreement by specifying the effective date thereof within five (5) years after the date on which the Agency accepts the equipment described in Attachment 1. The date of notice shall be at least five (5) days before the effective date of such termination. If SEMA terminates this Agreement, SEMA may require that the Agency return all equipment provided to the Agency under this Agreement to SEMA, and that Agency transfer ownership of all equipment to SEMA and that Agency execute any documents necessary to transfer ownership to SEMA or to another organization designated by SEMA to receive the equipment.

Liability: With the transfer of ownership of the equipment specified through this Agreement, the Agency shall take necessary steps to insure or protect itself, its personnel, and the equipment, and to comply with all applicable local, state and federal laws or other governmental requirements regarding ownership or use of the equipment, including, without limitation, all safety and security standards. SEMA, not being the manufacturer of the equipment, has no responsibility with respect to the equipment or any use or storage thereof, or any accidents or claims relating thereto. SEMA makes no representations or warranties, express or implied, regarding the equipment, whether arising by operation of law or otherwise, and expressly disclaims any and all warranties of merchantability, of fitness for a particular purpose of use, of non-infringement, of title, condition, quality or workmanship, or in any other respect. In no event shall SEMA be liable to agency for any indirect, incidental, consequential, special, and exemplary or punitive damages. To the extent permitted by law, Agency will defend, indemnify and reimburse SEMA against and for, and Agency staff will use best efforts to convince the Agency's decision maker to appropriate (and the Agency's decision maker will seriously consider the appropriation of) such amounts as are reasonably necessary to defend, indemnify or reimburse SEMA against and for, any claims against SEMA that are based in whole or in part on damages or injuries allegedly caused by the equipment or any use or other aspect thereof and any costs or expenses (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees) incurred by SEMA in connection with any such claims or any breach by Agency of this Agreement, when reasonably asked to do so by SEMA.

Governing law: This Agreement shall be interpreted under and governed by the laws of the State of Missouri.

Application for Appointment to Boone County Children's Services Board

The Boone County Children's Services Board was established in 2013 with the passage of a special sales tax levy in November, 2012. The Board, in partnership with the Boone County Commission, is charged with making Boone County a better and healthier community through the provision of services to protect the well-being and safety of children under the age of nineteen (19) and their families. The Board's goal is to maximize positive outcomes in a transparent, accountable fashion in recognition of the fact that the taxpayers of Boone County are an important stakeholder and beneficiary of this program. 'The Board's partnership with the Boone County Commission allows it to benefit from the ability to hire dedicated, professional staff with competitive salary and benefits packages into a professional environment with supports that include facilities maintenance, purchasing, human resources, legal, auditing, and other organizational supports and synergies that stem from being integrated into Boone County government as a County department. This partnership also allows the Boone County taxpayers to benefit from a coordination of social service spending at the County level in order to avoid duplication of effort, ensure efficient spending of public resources, and increase transparency. Finally, being part of County government allows the Children's Services sales tax proceeds to retain its character as "local tax dollars," allowing for the pursuit of matching federal dollars through various federal programs administered through the State Department of Mental Health, State Department of Social Services, and other federal matching programs.

Composition of the board of directors must meet the statutory requirements of the enabling legislation. Additionally, persons appointed to the board must comply with the provisions of the bylaws of the board and the conflict of interest policies promulgated by the County Commission and the Board. As appointees of a statutorily created Board with powers to direct the expenditure of public funds, board members have certain fiduciary duties, which require that they conduct themselves without conflict to the interest of the Children's Services Board or the Boone County taxpayer. Certain types of conflicts of interest are not prohibited, but disclosure is critical. Disclosure should not be construed as creating a presumption of impropriety or as automatically precluding someone from participation. Rather, it reflects the recognition of the many factors that can influence one's judgment and a desire to make as much information as possible available to other participants. Potentially conflicting interests may relate to programs and services or operations, such as contracts with third parties.

Section 210.861, Revised Statutes of Missouri, prohibits membership on the board by certain persons, including current County Commissioners, those having any financial interest in any agency

receiving funds from the Children's Services Fund, and those employed by any agency receiving funds. In addition, the Boone County Commission, based on its experience with other board appointments and the experiences of other counties in the administration of other Children's Services funds, prohibits membership on the board by those who are board members or volunteers with agencies that receive funds, or are employed by, have a financial interest in, serve on the board of, or otherwise volunteer with affiliated organizations of those agencies receiving funds. For purposes of this policy, "affiliated organizations" are those organizations which are controlled by or have systemic legal relationships with an agency who receive funds from the Children's Services Fund. [For example, two entities controlled by the same Board of Directors or the same administration team or an entity that relies on another almost exclusively for its financial support. Many other examples of such affiliated organizations exist, and the intent of this policy is to examine the substance of the relationships between entities and not the strict legal organization they have chosen to employ.] The questions below are designed to determine if a prohibited conflict of interest exists and to allow for the disclosure of any conflicts that do not amount to a prohibition but, absent disclosure, would tend to indicate that a board member may have an appearance of a conflict of interest.

For purposes of the following questions, "related family member" is defined to include relationships within the third degree by blood or marriage. [Relationships in the third degree include mother, father, child, brother, sister, (including half, step and in-law relationships in these same categories), and grandparent, grandchild, aunt, uncle, niece, nephew, great grandparent, great grandchild.]
