1. Open Meeting

2. FACE Leadership Update

- Year-to-date info FACE has had 388 referrals and given 266 assessments. Self-referrals and school referrals are the biggest bulk of referrals. FACE is seeing the highest number of referrals coming from grades 5 through 12 with fewer females as of late.
- Medical history and/or mental health issues are the leading concerns.
- There has been an increase in self and family referrals which has increased the engagement rates.
 Numbers continue to increase each year. It is becoming difficult to meet the demand of providing an assessment within two weeks with limited staff.
- Outreach continues to grow, especially with the collaboration with the Sheriff's Department. The
 Juvenile Justice Department is holding monthly meetings to case conference with law
 enforcement, SROs, FACE, etc.
- FACE has presented to every shift at the Columbia Police Department as well as the Sheriff's
 Department to educate them on FACE and further the collaboration work. FACE will reach out to
 the Hallsville Chief of Police.

The school-based branch of FACE is preparing for the high school advisory committee for this
upcoming school year. Still hiring for Intervention Specialists. FACE is collaborating with the
Columbia Police Department to train and develop materials for school personnel to identify signs
of gang involvement of youth.

3. Approve Minutes for May 12, 2022 Meeting

Joanne reviewed the Financial Report.

- There are a few programs with low numbers but there are invoices that still need to be processed.
 Some organizations were missing invoices and others were having staff issues that needed to be worked out with Community Services Department (CSD) staff.
- 6.3 million dollars in year-to-date expenditures.
- 10.7 million dollars fund balance.

5. Fund Investment Information 2013-2021

Megan reviewed the fund investment information.

- In 2021, 7.01% of the tax revenue went to fund operations.
- CSD has an average of 79% utilization rate.
- This form will be updated every year so that it can be used as a tool for talking points.
