Thriving communities are those that support opportunities to boost upward mobility and aim to narrow inequities for children, youth, and adults.

**Upwardly mobile business practices** encompass holistic strategies, policies, and actions to create the conditions and pathways for advancement, skill acquisition, and livable wage employment opportunities for all-- especially for those who have been historically marginalized. Upwardly mobile business practices provide employees with a sense of power, autonomy, dignity, and belonging.

Listen respectfully. | Listen actively and with an ear to 'understanding others' views. | Commit to learning, not debating. |

Comment to share information, not to persuade. | Discuss ideas. | Avoid blame, speculation, and inflammatory language. | Avoid assumptions about any member of a social group. Do not ask individuals to speak for their (perceived) social group. | Allow everyone the chance to speak if they choose to do so.
