- 1. Introduction and General Conditions of Bidding
- 1.1. INVITATION The County of Boone, through its Purchasing Department, invites responses, which offer to provide the goods and/or services identified on the title page, and described in greater detail in Section 2.

Purchasing Department

- 1.2. **DEFINITIONS**
- 1.2.1. County This term refers to the County of Boone, a duly organized public entity. It may also be used as a pronoun for various subsets of the County organization, including, as the context will indicate: Purchasing The Purchasing Department, including its Purchasing Director and staff. Department(s) or Office(s) The County Department/s or Office(s) for which this Bid is prepared, and which will be the end user(s) of the goods and/or services sought. Designee The County employee(s) assigned as your primary contact(s) for interaction regarding Contract performance.
- 1.2.2. Bidder / Contractor / Supplier These terms refer generally to businesses having some sort of relationship to or with us. The term may apply differently to different classes of entities, as the context will indicate. Bidder Any business entity submitting a response to this Bid. Suppliers, which may be invited to respond, or which express interest in this bid, but which do not submit a response, have no obligations with respect to the bid requirements.
 - Contractor The Bidder whose response to this bid is found by Purchasing to meet the best interests of the County. The Contractor will be selected for award, and will enter into a Contract for provision of the goods and/or services described in the Bid.
 - Supplier All business(s) entities which may provide the subject goods and/or services.
- 1.2.3. Bid This entire document, including attachments. A Bid may be used to solicit various kinds of information. The kind of information this Bid seeks is indicated by the title appearing at the top of the first page. An "Invitation For Bid" is used when the need is well defined. An "Invitation For Proposal" is used when the County will consider solutions, which may vary significantly from each other or from the County's initial expectations.
- 1.2.4. Response The written, sealed document submitted according to the Bid instructions.
- 1.3. BID CLARIFICATION Questions regarding this Bid should be directed in writing, preferably by fax or e-mail, to the Purchasing Department. Answers, citing the question asked but not identifying the questioner, will be distributed simultaneously to all known prospective Bidders. Note: Written requirements in the Bid or its Amendments are binding, but any oral communications between County and Bidder are not.
- 1.3.1. Bidder Responsibility The Bidder is expected to be thoroughly familiar with all specifications and requirements of this Bid. Bidder's failure or omission to examine any relevant form, article, site or document will not relieve them from any obligation regarding this Bid. By submitting a Response, Bidder is presumed to concur with all terms, conditions and specifications of this Bid.
- 1.3.2. Bid Amendment If it becomes evident that this Bid must be amended, the Purchasing Department will issue a formal written Amendment to all known prospective Bidders. If necessary, a new due date will be established.
- AWARD Award will be made to the Bidder(s) whose offer(s) provide the greatest value to the County from the standpoint of suitability to purpose, quality, service, previous experience, price, lifecycle cost, ability to deliver, or for any other reason deemed by Purchasing to be in the best interest of the County. Thus, the result will not be determined by price alone. The County will be seeking the least costly outcome that meets the County needs as interpreted by the County.
- 1.5. CONTRACT EXECUTION This Bid and the Contractor's Response will be made part of any resultant Contract and will be incorporated in the Contract as set forth, verbatim.
- 1.5.1. **Precedence -** In the event of contradictions or conflicts between the provisions of the documents comprising this Contract, they will be resolved by giving precedence in the following order:
 - 1) the provisions of the Contract (as it may be amended);
 - 2) the provisions of the Bid:
 - 3) the provisions of the Bidder's Response.
- 1.6. CONTRACT PERIOD Any Term and Supply Contract resulting from this Bid will have an initial term from date of award through December 31, 2002, and may be automatically renewed for an additional two (2) years unless canceled by either party commencing with execution of Contract (or on another mutually agreeable start date.)
- 1.7. COMPLIANCE WITH STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS Bidder agrees to be bound by the County's standard "boilerplate" terms and conditions for Contracts, a sample of which is attached to this Bid.

- 2. Primary Specifications
- 2.1 SCOPE OF WORK The County is requesting bids for Chip and Seal applications at specific sites. This work shall consist of the applications of bituminous material, and a cover coat material in accordance with the following specifications. Work will be completed on a per project basis and as listed in section four of this request.
- 2.2. MATERIAL AND APPLICATION SPECIFICATIONS
- 2.2.1. Emulsified Asphalt CRS-2P or an pre-approved equal. The rate for application shall be a minimum of 0.35 gallons per square yard for seal coat over gravel base and 0.30 for seal coat over asphalt. All materials shall conform to section 409.2 of the MSSHC (Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction).
- 2.2.2. Aggregate for Seal Coat over Gravel Base MSSHC specification number 1003.2, Grade 7 (3/8" clean, crushed, washed rock) and MSSHC specification number 1003.2, Grade 3 (1/2" clean, crushed, washed rock). The rate for application shall be a minimum of 25 pounds per square yard. Specified aggregate will be offered from the County's contracted vendor to the successful bidder at the following prices: 3/8" \$5.89/Ton, ½" \$5.69/Ton. All prices are picked up prices at Boone Quarry, Contact: Art Sumpter 573-446-0905.
- 2.2.3. Aggregate for Seal Coat over Asphalt MSSHC specification number 1003.2. grade 8. The specific gravity of the rock shall be 2.62±.05 and meet ASTM C127 standards.
- 2.2.4. Application of Seal Coat over Gravel Base All applications shall conform to sections 409.4.3., 409.4.3.1., 409.4.4.2., and 409.4.4.3. of the MSSHC. All areas shall receive two coats of chip and seal. First coat will utilize ½" aggregate. The second coat will utilize the 3/8" aggregate.
- 2.2.5. Application of Seal Coat over Asphalt All applications shall conform to the same specifications as referred to in 2.2.3. All areas shall receive one coat of chip and seal. All areas are to be swept after application in compliance with section 409.4.4.3 of the MSSHC.
- EQUIPMENT SPECIFICATIONS All equipment shall conform to section 409.3 of the MSSHC. Equipment shall be in good working order.
- 2.4. WEATHER LIMITATIONS All weather restrictions found in section 409.4.1. of the MSSHC shall be followed.
- 2.5. SURFACE PREPARATION The County will be held responsible for grading and rock placement to insure a smooth driving surface and the emulsified prime oil application. The County will work with the Contractor for purposes of coordinating all applications.
- 2.6. PREVAILING WAGE Not less than prevailing hourly rate of wages, as found by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations of Missouri, shall be paid to all workers performing work under this contract. <u>Prevailing Wage Order Number #9</u> is attached. Upon completion of the project and prior to payment, contractor will be required to file with the County an affidavit stating that contractor has fully complied with the provisions and requirements of the Prevailing Wage Law.
- 2.7. BIDDERS RESPONSIBILITIES
- 2.7.1. Subcontractors No subcontracted work will be allowed in the performance of this project.
- 2.7.2. Bidders must complete and submit a Statement of Bidders Qualifications that is attached to this bid with their response.
- 2.7.3. The County does not guarantee that any or all sites listed in section four of this request will be completed. The County also reserves the right to add additional square yards. Section Four of this request and the attachments are intended to describe the locations the County will contract for services.
- 2.7.4. Bidders failure or omission to examine any relevant site will not relieve them from any obligation regarding this Bid. By submitting a Response, Bidder is presumed to understand the scope of services to be provided at each location.
- 2.7.5. Project should begin no earlier than June 23, 2003 and be completed no later than August 22, 2003.
- 2.8. CITY OF HALLSVILLE LOCATIONS
- 2.8.1. A schedule of quantities has been identified for streets in Hallsville. Bidders are encouraged to bid on locations in Section 4. Awarded vendor will contract with Hallsville for those areas.
- 2.8.2. Streets identified are already paved and would only require a single coat of chip and seal using type 8 aggregate.

- 2. Primary Specifications (Continued)
- 2.9. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS The Contractor shall not commence work under this contract until they have obtained all insurance required under this paragraph and such insurance has been approved by the County. All policies shall be in amounts, form, and companies satisfactory to the County, which must carry an A-6 or better rating as listed in the A.M. Best or Equivalent Rating Guide.
- 2.9.1. Compensation Insurance The Contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of this contract, Employee's Liability and Worker's Compensation Insurance for all of their employees employed at the site of the work. In case any class of employees engaged in hazardous work under this contract at the site of the work is not protected under the Worker's Compensation Statute, the Contractor shall provide Employee's Liability Insurance for the protections of their employees not otherwise protected.
- 2.9.2. Comprehensive General Liability Insurance The Contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of this contract such comprehensive general liability insurance as shall protect them from claims for damages for personal injury including accidental death, as well as from claims for property damages, which may arise from operations under this contract, whether such operations be by themselves or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by them. The amounts of insurance shall be not less than \$2,000,000.00 combined single limit for any one occurrence covering both bodily injury and property damage, including accidental death.
- 2.9.3. Automobile Public Liability and Property Insurance The Contractor shall maintain during the life of this contract, automobile public liability insurance in the amount of not less than \$2,000,000.00 combined single limit for any one occurrence and not less than \$250,000.00 per individual, covering both bodily injury, including accidental death, and property damage, to protect themselves from any and all claims arising from the use of the Contractor's own automobiles, teams and trucks; hired automobiles, teams and trucks; and both on and off the site of work.
- 2.9.4. Owner's Contingent or Protective Liability and Property Damage The Contractor shall provide the County with proof of Owner's Protective Liability and Property Damage Insurance, which shall protect the County against any and all claims that might arise as a result of the operations of the Contractor in fulfilling the terms of this contract during the life of the Contract. It is preferred that the policy include a provision for alleged assault and battery. The minimum amounts of such insurance will be \$2,000,000.00 per occurrence, combined single limits. Should any work be subcontracted, these limits will also apply.
- 2.9.5. Insurance Certification The Contractor shall furnish the County with Certificate(s) of Insurance that name the County as additional insured in an amount as required in this contract and requiring a thirty (30) day mandatory cancellation notice. In addition, such insurance shall be on an occurrence basis and shall remain in effect until such time as the County has made final acceptance of the work required in the contract.
- 2.10. INDEMNITY AGREEMENT To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the County of Boone, its directors, officers, agents, and employees from and against all claims arising by reason of any act or failure to act, negligent or otherwise, of Contractor, (meaning anyone, including but not limited to consultants having a contract with Contractor or subcontractor for part of the services), of anyone directly or indirectly employed by contractor, or of anyone for whose acts the Contractor may be liable, in connection with providing these services. This provision does not, however, require Contractor to indemnify, hold harmless or defend the County of Boone from its own negligence.
- 2.11. BOND REQUIREMENTS
- 2.11.1. Performance Bond/Labor and Material Payment Bond Upon award of the Contract, the Contractor shall furnish a Performance Bond and a Labor and Material Payment Bond, each in an amount equal to the full Contract price, guaranteeing faithful compliance with all requirements of the Contract Documents and complete fulfillment of the Contract, and payment of all labor, material, and other bills made in carrying out this Contract. Performance Bond and Labor and Material Bond must be submitted on forms provided with this request.
- 2.12. LIEN WAIVERS Prior to the release of contract amount, contractor shall file with the County the following:
 - a) an affidavit, to the effect that all payments have been made and all claims have been released for all materials, labor and other items covered by the contract;
 - b) lien waivers signed by each supplier furnishing materials to the project releasing all claims to said materials;
 - c) lien waivers signed by each sub-contractor furnishing labor to the project releasing all claims against Boone County for said labor.

- 2.14. **DELIVERY** Each site specified in Section four of this request.
- 2.14.1. Delivery Terms FOB Destination. The seller pays and bears all freight charges.
- 2.15. PAYMENT Contractor will bill the County upon acceptance by Boone County for each project listed in Section four of this request. Contractor must submit an invoice and charges must only include prices listed in the Contractor's bid response. No additional fees or taxes shall be included as additional charges. The County agrees to pay the invoice within thirty (30) days from receipt of a correct invoice and all other required documents.
- 2.16. PRE-APPROVED EQUAL Any manufacturer's name, trade name, brand name or catalog numbers are used in the specifications for the purpose of describing and establishing general quality levels. Such references are not intended to be restrictive. Any vendor interested in submitting a response for a pre-approved equal must submit their request in writing at least 10 business days prior to the bid opening date. This request can be faxed to the Boone County Purchasing Department at (573) 886-4390. The County is not responsible for insuring receipt of all transmissions. Vendors are encouraged to contact the Purchasing Department to insure that all requests have been received by the stated deadline.

- 3. Response Presentation and Review
- 3.1 RESPONSE CONTENT In order to enable direct comparison of competing Responses, Bidder must submit Response in strict conformity to the requirements stated here. Failure to adhere to all requirements may result in Response being disqualified as non-responsive. All Responses must be submitted using the provided Response Sheet. Every question must be answered and if not applicable, the section must contain "N/A."
- 3.2 SUBMITTAL OF RESPONSES Responses MUST be received by the date and time noted on the title page under "Bid Submission Information and Deadline". NO EXCEPTIONS. The County is not responsible for late or incorrect deliveries from the US Postal Service or any other mail carrier.
- 3.2.1. Submittal Package Submit, to the location specified on the title page, three (3) complete copies of your Response in a single sealed envelope, clearly marked on the outside with your company name and return address, the bid number and the due date and time.
- 3.2.2. Advice of Award If you wish to be advised of the outcome of this Bid, enclose with your Response a self-addressed stamped return envelope (size 10, first-class one-ounce postage) for our use in mailing a copy of the summary recap of the award. Notification will be by mail only, except to awarded Bidder.
- 3.2.3. The County's Bids, Bid Tabulations, and Bid Awards may be viewed on our web page at www.showmeboone.com. View information under *Purchasing*.
- 3.2.4. If you have obtained this bid document from our Web Page or from a source other than the Boone County Purchasing Department, please check with our office or web page prior to submitting your bid to ensure that you have a complete package. The Purchasing Department cannot be responsible for providing addenda if we do not have you on our vendor list for this bid.
- 3.3. BID OPENING On the date and time and at the location specified on the title page under "Bid Opening", all Responses will be opened in public. Brief summary information from each will be read aloud.
- 3.3.1. Removal from Vendor Database If any prospective Bidder currently in our Vendor Database to whom the Bid was sent elects not to submit a Response and fails to reply in writing stating reasons for not bidding, that Bidder's name may be removed from our database. Other reasons for removal include unwillingness or inability to show financial responsibility, reported poor performance, unsatisfactory service, or repeated inability to meet delivery requirements.
- 3.4. RESPONSE CLARIFICATION The County reserves the right to request additional written or oral information from Bidders in order to obtain clarification of their Responses.
- 3.4.1. Rejection or Correction of Responses The County reserves the right to reject any or all Responses. Minor irregularities or informalities in any Response which are immaterial or inconsequential in nature, and are neither affected by law nor at substantial variance with Bid conditions, may be waived at our discretion whenever it is determined to be in the County's best interest.
- 3.5. EVALUATION PROCESS The County's sole purpose in the evaluation process is to determine from among the Responses received which one is best suited to meet the County's needs at the lowest possible cost. Any final analysis or weighted point score does not imply that one Bidder is superior to another, but simply that in our judgment the Contractor selected appears to offer the best overall solution for our current and anticipated needs at the lowest possible cost.
- 3.5.1. Method of Evaluation The County will evaluate submitted Responses in relation to all aspects of this Bid.
- 3.5.2. Acceptability The County reserves the sole right to determine whether goods and/or services offered are acceptable for our use.
- 3.5.3. Endurance of Pricing Bidder's pricing must be held until award or 60 days, whichever comes first.
- 3.5.4. Award: Award will be made to the lowest, responsible bidder meeting specifications, who presents the product or service that is in the best interest of Boone County. Boone County reserves the right to award this bid on an item by item basis, or an "all or none" basis, whichever is in the best interest of the County.
- 3.5.5. Boone County reserves the right to reject all bids. Boone County reserves the right to waive informalities in bids.

- The Boone County Commission has the right to accept or reject any part or parts of all bids, to waive technicalities, and to accept the offer the County Commission considers the most advantageous to the County. Boone County reserves the right to award this bid on an item-by-item basis, or an "all or none" basis, whichever is in the best interest of the County.
- Bidders must use the bid forms provided for the purpose of submitting bids, must return the quotation and bid sheets comprised in this bid, give the unit price, extended totals, and sign the bid.
- 4. When products or materials of any particular producer or manufacturer are mentioned in our specifications, such products or materials are intended to be descriptive of type or quality and not restricted to those mentioned.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION is such that, if Contractor shall promptly and faithfully perform said Contract, and shall faithfully perform the prevailing hourly wages and comply with all prevailing wage requirements as provided by such Contract and applicable prevailing wage laws, rules, and rates specified by regulation thereunder, then this obligation shall be null and void; otherwise it shall remain in full force and effect.

The Surety hereby waives notice of any alteration or extension of time made by the Owner.

Whenever Contractor shall be, and declared by Owner to be, in default under the Contract, the Owner having performed Owner's obligations thereunder, the Surety may promptly remedy the default, or shall promptly:

- 1) Complete the Contract in accordance with its terms and conditions, or
- 2) Obtain a bid for submission to Owner for completing the Contract in accordance with its terms and conditions, and upon determination by Owner and Surety of the lowest responsible bidder, arrange for a Contract between such bidder and Owner, and make available as work progresses (even though there should be a default of a succession of defaults under the Contract or Contracts of completion arranged under this paragraph) sufficient fund to pay the cost of completion less the balance of the Contract price, but not exceeding, including other costs and damages for which the Surety may be liable hereunder, the amount set forth in the first paragraph hereof. The term "balance of the Contract price", as used in this paragraph, shall mean the total amount payable by Owner to Contractor under the Contract and any amendments thereto, less the amount properly paid by Owner to Contractor.

Any suit under this bond must be instituted before the expiration of two (2) years from the date on which final payment under the Contract falls due.

- NO. 9: Means the regular workday starting time of 8:00 a.m. (and resulting quitting time of 4:30 p.m.) may be moved forward to 6:00 a.m. or delayed one hour to 9:00 a.m. All work performed in excess of the regular work day and on Saturday shall be compensated at one and one-half (1½) times the regular pay. In the event time is lost during the work week due to weather conditions, the Employer may schedule work on the following Saturday at straight time. All work accomplished on Sunday and holidays shall be compensated for at double the regular rate of wares. The work week shall be Monday through Friday account for midwage holidays. of wages. The work week shall be Monday through Friday, except for midweek holidays.
- NO. 11: Means eight (8) hours shall constitute a day's work, with the starting time to be established between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. from Monday to Friday. Time and one-half (1½) shall be paid for first two (2) hours of overtime Monday through Friday and the first eight (8) hours on Saturday.  - -The project must be for a minimum of four (4) consecutive days.

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NO. 33: Means the standard work day shall be eight (8) consecutive hours of work between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., excluding the lunch period, or shall conform to the practice on the job site. Four (4) days at ten (10) hours a day may be worked at straight time, Monday through Friday and need not be consecutive. All overtime, except for Sundays and holidays shall be at the rate of time and one-half (1½). Overtime worked on Sundays and holidays shall be at double (2) time.

NO. 40: Means the regular working week shall consist of five (5) consecutive (8) hour days' labor on the job beginning with Monday and ending with Friday of each week. Four (4) 10-hour days may constitute the regular work week. On the Monday through Friday schedule, all work performed on Saturday will be time and one-half (1½) unless time has been lost during the week, in which case Saturday will be a make up day to the extent of the lost time. On the Tuesday through Saturday schedule, all work performed on Monday will be time and one-half (1½) unless time has been lost during the week, in which case Monday will be a make-up day to the extent of the lost time. Any work performed on Sunday will be double (2) time. If employees work on any of the recognized holidays, they shall be paid time and one-half (1½) their regular rate of pay for all hours worked.

NO. 55: Means the regular work day shall be eight (8) hours between 6:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. The first two (2) hours of work performed in excess of the eight (8) hour work day, Monday through Friday, and the first ten (10) hours of work on Saturday, shall be paid at one & one-half (1½) times the straight time rate. All work performed on Sunday, observed holidays and in excess of ten (10) hours a day, Monday through Saturday, shall be paid at double (2) the straight time rate.

NO. 57: Means eight (8) hours per day shall constitute a day's work and forty (40) hours per week, Monday through Friday, shall constitute a week's work. The regular starting time shall be 8:00 a.m. The above may be changed by mutual consent of authorized personnel. When circumstances warrant, the Employer may change the regular workweek to four (4) ten-hour days at the regular time rate of pay. It being understood that all other pertinent information must be adjusted accordingly. All time worked before and after the established workday of eight (8) hours, Monday through Friday, all time worked on Saturday, shall be paid at the rate of the and one-half (1 ½) except in cases where work is part of an employee's regular Friday shift. All time worked on Sunday and recognized holidays shall be paid at the double (2) time rate of pay.

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NO. 59: Means that except as herein provided, eight (8) hours a day shall constitute a standard work day, and forty (40) hours per week shall constitute a week's work. All time worked outside of the standard eight (8) hour work day and on Saturday shall be classified as overtime and paid the rate of double (2) time. The Employer has the option of working either five (5) eight hour days or four (4) ten hour days to constitute a normal forty (40) hour work week. When the four (4) ten-hour work week is in effect, the standard work day shall be consecutive ten (10) hour periods between the hours of 6:30 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. Forty (40) hours per week shall constitute a weeks work, Monday through Thursday, inclusive. The regular starting time (and resulting quitting time) may be moved to 6:00 a.m. or delayed to 9:00 a.m. Make-up days shall not be utilized for days lost due to holidays.

NO. 60: Means the Employer shall have the option of working five 8-hour days or four 10-hour days Monday through Friday. If an Employer elects to work five 8-hour days during any work week, hours worked more than eight (8) per day or forty (40) per week shall be paid at time and one-half (1½) the hourly wage rate plus fringe benefits Monday through Friday. SATURDAY MAKE-UP DAY: If an Employer is prevented from working forty (40) hours, Monday through Friday, or any part thereof by reason of inclement weather (rain or mud), Saturday or any part thereof may be worked as a make-up day at the straight time rate. It is agreed by the parties that the make-up day is not to be used to make up time lost due to recognized holidays. If an Employer elects to work for 10-hour days, between the hours of 6:30 am. and 6:30 p.m. in any week, work performed more than ten (10) hours per day or forty (40) hours per week shall be paid at time and one half (1½) the hourly wage rate plus fringe benefits Monday through Friday. Millwright work performed in excess of the regular work day and on Saturday shall be compensated for at time and one-half (1½) the regular Millwright hourly wage rate plus fringe benefits. The regular work day starting of 8:00 a.m. (and resulting quitting time of 4:30 p.m.) may be moved forward to 6:00 a.m. or delayed one (1) hour to 9:00 a.m. and work accomplished on Sundays and recognized holidays, or days observed as recognized holidays, shall be compensated for at double (2) the regular hourly rate of wages plus fringe benefits. NOTE: All overtime is computed on the hourly wage rate plus an amount equal to the fringe benefits.

NO. 86: Means the regular work week shall consist of five (5) days, Monday through Friday, beginning at 8:00 a.m. and ending at 4:30 p.m. The regular work day beginning time may be advanced one or two hours or delayed by one hour. All overtime work performed on Monday through Saturday shall be paid at time and one-half (1½) of the hourly rate plus an amount equal to one-half (½) of the hourly Total Indicated Fringe Benefits. All work performed on Sundays and recognized holidays shall be paid at double (2) the hourly rate plus an amount equal to the hourly Total Indicated Fringe Benefits.

NO. 87: Means eight (8) hours starting between 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. and ending between 2:30 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. at the Employers discretion shall constitute a day's work. Any work prior to 6:00 a.m. or after eight (8) hours shall be paid at the overtime rate. Five (5) days from Monday through Friday inclusive shall constitute a regular work week. All hours before and after these regular hours shall be considered overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of double (2) time. All work on Saturday and Sunday shall be paid at double (2) the prevailing scale of wages.

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NO. 91: Means eight (8) hours shall constitute a day's work commencing at 8:00 a.m. and ending at 4:30 p.m., allowing one-half (1/2) hour for lunch. The option exists for the Employer to use a flexible starting time between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. The regular work week shall consist of forty (40) hours of five (5) work days, Monday through Friday. The work week may consist of four (4) ten (10) hour days from Monday through Thursday, with Friday as a make-up day. If the make-up day is a holiday, the employees shall be paid the double (2) time rate. NO. 2: Means a regular work week of forty (40) hours will start on Monday and end on Friday. The regular work day shall be either eight (8) or ten (10) hours. If a crew is prevented from working forty (40) hours Monday through Friday, or any part thereof, by reason of inclement weather, Saturday or any part thereof may be worked as a make-up day at the straight time rate to complete forty (40) hours of work in a week. Employees who are part of a regular crew on a make-up day, notwithstanding the fact that they may not have been employed the entire week, shall work Saturday at the straight time rate. Time & one-half (1½) shall be paid for all hours in excess of eight (8) hours per day (if working 5-8's) or ten (10) hours per day (if working 4-10's), or forty (40) hours per week, Monday through Friday. For all time worked on Saturday (unless Saturday or any portion of said day is worked as make-up to complete forty hours), time and one-half (1½) shall be paid. For all time worked on Sunday and recognized holidays, double (2) time shall be paid.

NO. 7: Means the regular work week shall start on Monday and end on Friday, except where the Employer elects to work Monday through Thursday, ten (10) hours per day. All work over ten (10) hours in a day or forty (40) hours in a week shall be at the overtime rate of one and one-half (1½) times the regular hourly rate. The regular work day shall be either eight (8) or ten (10) hours. If a job can't work forty (40) hours Monday through Friday because of inclement weather or other conditions beyond the control of the Employer, Friday or Saturday may be worked as a make-up day at straight time (if working 4-10's). Saturday may be worked as a make-up day at straight time (if working 4-8's). Make-up days shall not be utilized for days lost from holidays. Except as worked as a make-up day, time on Saturday shall be worked at one and one-half (1½) times the regular rate. Work performed on Sunday shall be paid at two (2) times the regular rate. Work performed on Gays observed as such, shall also be paid at the double (2) time rate of pay.

NO. 21: Means the regular work week shall consist of five (5) eight (8) hour days, Monday through Friday. Unless used as make-up days to complete forty (40) hours per work week, time and one-half (1 ½) shall be paid on Saturday (when working 5-8's) and on Friday or Saturday (when working 4-10's). Sundays and holidays shall be paid at the rate of double (2) time the regular rate of pay.
