- 1.1. INVITATION The County of Boone, through its Purchasing Department, invites responses, which offer to provide the goods and/or services identified on the title page, and described in greater detail in Section 2.
- 1.2. **DEFINITIONS**
- 1.2.1. County This term refers to the County of Boone, a duly organized public entity. It may also be used as a pronoun for various subsets of the County organization, including, as the context will indicate: Purchasing The Purchasing Department, including its Purchasing Director and staff.

- 1.2.3. Bid This entire document, including attachments. A Bid may be used to solicit various kinds of information. An "Invitation For Proposal" is used when the County will consider solutions, which may vary significantly from each other or from the County's initial expectations.
- 1.2.4. Response The written, sealed document submitted according to the Bid instructions.
- 1.3. BID CLARIFICATION Questions regarding this Bid should be directed in writing, preferably by fax or email, to the Purchasing Department. Answers, citing the question asked but not identifying the questioner, will be distributed simultaneously to all known prospective Bidders. Note: Written requirements in the Bid or its Amendments are binding, but any oral communications between County and Bidder are not.
- 1.3.1. Bidder Responsibility The Bidder is expected to be thoroughly familiar with all specifications and requirements of this Bid. Bidder's failure or omission to examine any relevant form, article, site or document will not relieve them from any obligation regarding this Bid. By submitting a Response, Bidder is presumed to concur with all terms, conditions and specifications of this Bid.
- 1.3.2. Bid Amendment If it becomes evident that this Bid must be amended, the Purchasing Department will issue a formal written Amendment to all known prospective Bidders. If necessary, a new due date will be established.
- 1.4. Award Award will be made to the Bidder(s) whose offer(s) provide the greatest value to the County from the standpoint of suitability to purpose, quality, service, previous experience, price, lifecycle cost, ability to deliver, or for any other reason deemed by Purchasing to be in the best interest of the County. Walnut Columbia, MO 65201. The contractor shall also be responsible for the legal disposal of the replaced chiller and materials.
- Scope of Services- The Contractor shall furnish all labor, equipment, and traffic control necessary to complete the following:
- 2.2.1. Removal and disposal of both current chiller units.
- 2.2.2. Installation of two new chiller units.

#### 2.3.5. Chiller Components

- 2.3.5.1. Compressors: The compressors shall be sealed hermetic, scroll type with crankcase oil heater and suction strainer. Compressor shall have a forced-feed lubrication system with a reversible oil pump and oil charge. The compressor motor shall be refrigerant gas cooled, high torque, hermetic induction type, two-pole, with inherent thermal protection on all three phases and shall be mounted on RIS vibration isolator pads
- 2.3.5.2. Remote Evaporator Units up to 130 tons capacity shall have a direct expansion type, brazed-plate evaporator with stainless steel plates. They shall be insulated with ¼ inch (19mm) closed cell polyurethane insulation
- 2.3.5.3. Condenser
- 2.3.5.3.1. The condenser coils shall consist of 3/8 inch (10mm) seamless copper tubes mechanically bonded into plate type fins. The fins shall have full drawn collars to completely cover the tubes. A subcooling coil shall be an integral part fo the main condenser coil.
  - Condenser fans shall be propeller type arranged for vertical air discharge and individually driven by direct drive fan motors. Each fan shall be in its own compartment to eliminate cross flow of condenser air during fan cycling and shall be equipped with a heavy gauge vinyl coated fan guard. Fan motors shall be weather protected, three-phase, direct-drive, 1140 rpm, TEAO type. External coils shall have wire mesh protective guards.
  - 2.3.5.6. Refrigerant Circuit (remote Evaporator)
- 2.3.5.6.1. The refrigerant specialties shall be supplied by the unit manufacturer and include a liquid line shutoff valve, refrigerant filter-drier, sight glass with moisture indicator, liquid line solenoid valve, thermal expansion valve, and insulated suction line. The factory specialties, along with piping and insulation furnished by the installing contractor shall be field installed by the contractor.

- 2.3.5.7.1. Unit casing and all structural members and rails shall be fabricated of steel and painted to meet ASTM B117, 500-hour salt spray test.

- 2.3.5.8.1. A centrally located weather proof control panel shall contain the field power connection points, control interlock terminals, and control system. Terminals shall also be provided for power supply to the evaporator heater circuit. Hinged access doors shall be lockable. - 2.4. Contract Documents The successful bidder(s) shall be obligated to enter into a written contract with the County by March 07, 2011 at 9:00A.m. If bidder(s) desire to contract under their own written agreement, any such proposed agreement shall be submitted in blank with their bid. County reserves the right to modify any proposed form agreement or withdraw its award to a successful bidder if any proposed agreement contains terms and conditions inconsistent with its bid or are unacceptable to County legal counsel.
- 2.5. Project Schedule- All work shall begin on a Friday after 6:00 P.m. with work continuing on through Sunday to reduce time that the chillers will be unusable during the County work week. Work not complete during the first weekend shall continue on a consecutive daily basis until all work is complete. It is the Contractor's responsibility to notify the County Facilities Maintenance Manager at least 2 weeks before the beginning of any work. A project schedule depicting the progression of work must be submitted for the County's approval. Work should begin as soon as possible.
- 2.5.1. Prep for Project Contractor will be responsible for pre-piping system so chillers can be installed on weekend fallowing arrival.
- 2.6. 3-BID CONFERENCE A pre-bid conference is scheduled for Tuesday, February 22, 2011 at 1:30 P.m. at the Boone County Johnson Building, 601 E. Walnut, Conference Room 213, Columbia, MO.
- 2.6.1. All potential bidders are encouraged to attend this conference in order to ask questions and provide comments on the Request for Bid. Attendance is not mandatory to submit a response; however, bidders are encouraged to attend since information relating to this RFB will be discussed in detail. Bidders should bring a copy of the RFB since it will be used as the agenda for the pre-bid conference.
- 2.6.2. Bidders are strongly encouraged to advise the Purchasing Department of Boone County within one (1) days of the scheduled pre-bid conference/site visit of any special accommodations needed for disabled personnel who will be attending the conference so that these accommodations can be made.
- 2.7. CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITIES
- 2.7.1. The Contractor shall be responsible for the removal and lawful disposal of all excess materials, and costs for said services shall be included in the bid price.
- 2.7.2. The Contractor shall complete all required utility locations prior to commencement of work.
- 2.7.3. The Contractor shall be responsible for accurately measuring the quantity of material required for the entire project. Quantities are estimated. The County does not guarantee minimum order quantities. The County reserves the right to increase or decrease quantities as requirements dictate. Payment is based on actual field measurements.
- 2.7.4. The Contractor shall comply with all Federal, State and Local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations that in any manner affect the work. Special attention is called to, but not limited to, the local environmental ordinances. Ignorance on the part of the Contractor will in no way relieve him from responsibility of compliance with all said laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations.
- 2.7.5. The Contractor shall be required to schedule project inspections with the Facility Maintenance Manager.
- 2.7.5.1. The Contractor shall provide all material safety data sheets prior to use of any hazardous material on the site.
- 2.7.5.2. The Contractor shall be responsible for the demolition and removal of any existing materials in the work area.
- 2.7.5.3. The Contractor shall be responsible for removing and replacing damaged surface during the project at no additional expense to the County.

If the Contractor should neglect to begin such repairs or replacements within this period or in case of emergency, where, in the judgment of the County, delay would cause serious loss or damage, the repairs and/or replacements may be pursued by the County charged to the Contractor.

PREVAILING WAGE PREVAILING WAGE RATES The contract shall be based upon payment by the Contractor of wage rates not less than the prevailing hourly wage rate for each craft or classification of workers engaged on the work as determined by the Industrial Commission of Missouri on behalf of the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations. The Contractor shall comply with all requirements of the prevailing wage law of Missouri, Revised Statutes of Missouri, Sections 290.210 to 290.340 including the latest amendments thereto. The current prevailing wage order #17 is to be used. The contractor must submit an invoice and charges must only include prices listed in the contractor's bid response. Any additional costs associated with this project must be approved through the appropriate Change Order mechanism approved by the Boone County Commission. No additional fees or taxes shall be included as additional charges. The County agrees to pay a correct Monthly Statement within 30 days of receipt of a valid statement. Invoices/Monthly Statements should be submitted to Boone County Facility Maintenance at the above address referenced in paragraph 2.10.
- 2.11. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS
- 2.11.1. Insurance Requirements: The Contractor shall not commence work under this contract until they have obtained all insurance required under this paragraph and such insurance has been approved by the County, nor shall the Contractor allow any subcontractor to commence work on their subcontract until all similar insurance required of subcontractor has been so obtained and approved. All policies shall be in amounts, form and companies satisfactory to the County which must carry an A-6 or better rating as listed in the A.M. Best or equivalent rating guide. Insurance limits indicated below may be lowered at the discretion of the County.
- 2.11.2. Compensation Insurance The Contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of this contract, Employee's Liability and Worker's Compensation Insurance for all of their employees employed at the site of work, and in case any work is sublet, the Contractor shall require the subcontractor similarly to provide Worker's Compensation Insurance for all of the latter's employees unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by the Contractor. Worker's Compensation coverage shall meet Missouri statutory limits. Employers' Liability limits shall be \$1,000,000.00 each employee, \$1,000,000.00 each accident, and \$1,000,000.00 policy limit. In case any class of employees engaged in hazardous work under this Contract at the site of the work is not protected under the Worker's Compensation Statute, the Contractor shall provide and shall cause each subcontractor to provide Employers' Liability Insurance for the protection of their employees not otherwise protected.

The amounts of insurance shall be not less than \$2,000,000.00 combined single limit for any one occurrence covering both bodily injury and property damage, including accidental death. If the Contract involves any underground/digging operations, the general liability certificate shall include X, C, and U (Explosion, Collapse, and Underground) coverage. If providing Comprehensive General Liability Insurance, then the Proof of Coverage of Insurance shall also be included.
  - The Contractor has the option to provide Owner's Contingent or Protective Liability and Property Damage instead of the Comprehensive General Liability Insurance- The Contractor shall provide the County with proof of Owner's Protective Liability and Property Damage Insurance with the County as named insured, which shall protect the County against any and all claims which might arise as a result of the operations of the Contractor in fulfilling the terms of this contract during the life of the Contract. The minimum amounts of such insurance will be \$2,000,000.00 per occurrence, combined single limits. Limits can be satisfied by using a combination of primary and excess coverages. Should any work be subcontracted, these limits will also apply.
- 2.11.4. COMMERCIAL Automobile Liability The Contractor shall maintain during the life of this contract, automobile liability insurance in the amount of not less than \$2,000,000.00 combined single limit for any one occurrence, covering both bodily injury, including accidental death, and property damage, to protect themselves from any and all claims arising from the use of the Contractor's own automobiles, teams and trucks; hired automobiles, teams and trucks; and both on and off the site of work.

When any of these holidays fall on a Sunday, the following Monday shall be observed. No work shall be performed on the days set forth except in cases of emergencies to protect life or property.
- NO. 4: All work done on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas Day shall be paid at the double time rate of pay. If any of the above holidays fall on Sunday, Monday will be observed as the recognized holiday. If any of the above holidays fall on Saturday, Friday will be observed as the recognized holiday.
- NO. 5: All work that shall be done on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day shall be paid at the double (2) time rate of pay.
- NO, 7: The following days are assigned days and are recognized as holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. If a holiday falls on a Sunday, it shall be observed on the following Monday. If a holiday falls on a Saturday, it shall be observed on the preceding Friday. No work shall be performed on Labor Day except in case of jeopardy to work under construction. This is applied to protect Labor Day. When a holiday falls during the normal workweek, Monday through Friday, it shall be counted as eight (8) hours toward the forty (40) hour week. However, no reimbursement for this eight (8) hours is too paid to the workman unless worked. If workman are required to work the above enumerated holidays or days observed as such, or on Sunday, they shall receive double (2) the regular rate of pay for such work.
- NO. 8: All work performed on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksglving Day, and Christmas Day, or the days observed in lieu of these holidays, shall be paid at the double time rate of pay.
- NO. 15: All work accomplished on the recognized holidays of New Year's Day, Decoration Day (Memorial Day), Independence Day (Fourth of July), Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day, or days observed as these named holidays, shall be compensated for at double (2) the regular hourly rate of weges plus fringe benefits. If a holiday falls on Saturday, it shall be observed on the preceding Friday. If a holiday falls on a Sunday, it shall be observed on the following Monday. No work shall be performed on Labor Day, Christmas Day, Decoration Day or Independence Day except to preserve life or property.
- NO. 19: All work done on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day shall be paid at the double time rate of pay. The employee may take off Friday following Thanksgiving Day, However, the employee shall notify his or her Foreman, General Foreman or Superintendent on the Wednesday preceding Thanksgiving Day.
