## Here are 5 simple ways to stop pollution & save money this Halloween:

- 1. **Create a one-of-a-kind costume.** Single-use costumes are super wasteful. For a do-it-yourself costume that's much more fun, head to a local secondhand store and mix and match the most outrageous pieces you can find.
